There is no claim for damages during transit if sent by parcel post. Japanese Beetle Certificate supplied if requested.

To save weight in shipment plants are not shipped in clay pots, but paper pots are usually used where there is a danger of loss. Upon arrival remove plants from paper pots and repot in slightly larger size clay pots.
