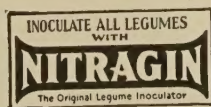

VEGETABLE SEED CEILING PRICES

Effective as of December 4, 1943, O. P. A. issued Regulation M. P. R. 496 which established retail ceiling prices on a number of Vegetable Seeds. You should apply to your local O. P. A. Board for a copy promptly, so as to have it to study before you begin to sell seeds.*

The maximum prices for one pound quantities of all varieties of Beans, Peas, and Sweet Corn are as follows:— Beans— 50c, Peas (smooth varieties)— 45c, Peas (wrinkled varieties)— 50c, Sweet Corn (open pollinated)— 45c, Sweet Corn (yellow hybrids)— 70c, and Sweet Corn (white hybrids)— 75c. You can sell a pound for as much less than these prices as you desire, but you may not charge more according to the Regulation. Quantities of less than one-half pound are exempt from these maximum prices. For arriving at the price to charge for amounts over one pound, you must be guided by the prices you charged for a like amount between January first and May thirty-first, 1943. If, for example, you sold thirty pounds of Beans for five cents less than the pound rate last spring, you would be expected to sell on the same basis this spring.

Maximum prices on the other vegetable seeds that have had the ceiling price fixed works out a little differently. Key varieties have been selected, and upon these key varieties you are expected to base the price for other varieties of that kind, using the same difference you had last spring, (Jan. 1 - May 31). Fraction of pounds are priced according to the base price of one pound for that fraction, and bringing it to the next even 5 cent figure. For example, if the base price was \$2.12 a pound, the quarter pound price would be 55c, the ounce price 15c. Packets and quantities of less than one-half ounce are exempt from the maximum price.

The key varieties and the maximum prices permitted, upon which all other varieties of that kind are based are:—

Upon all other varieties of vegetables (like Celery, Egg Plant, Musk Melon, Pepper, Radish, Spinach, etc.) there has not been any maximum price set so far as we are aware.

To determine your price for sale of any variety, compare the pound price you sold at last year, (Jan. 1 - May 31) with the base given above. If, for example, you sold Purple Top White Globe for \$1.00 last year, and you decide to go to the ceiling this year (\$1.50), you would add 50 cents a pound to your last year's prices, and figure out the fraction of pound prices as stated in the third paragraph above. This same procedure should be followed on all other kinds and varieties which have the base price established.

If you did not sell the variety listed last season, then the nearest similar variety may be used. Except that if Copenhagen Market Cabbage was not sold, then Danish Ball Head is to be used as the base on Cabbage. If Southport Yellow Globe Onion was not sold, then Yellow Sweet Spanish is to be used as the base. Black Seeded Simpson Lettuce is the base for all varieties of head, leaf and cos Lettuce except the New York and Imperial types which have their own base as listed.

You are urged to prepare and keep on file a list of your maximum prices, and use care not to charge more than the ceilings so established. As we stated in the beginning, lower prices than the ceiling or maximum prices are permissible, and you may find it necessary to have such lower prices in order to meet competition on some kinds and varieties.

It should be borne in mind that all of the foregoing is only our interpretation of the Regulation, and it is not official in any way. We could be wrong in our understanding of the rules and statements as given in the Regulation. We have merely tried to give you a brief summary and some sort of an idea regarding the Regulation. Study your own copy, and with the information we have suggested, you should be able to arrive at your own ceiling prices.

Ceiling prices have been placed on some other items in which you may be interested, so when you ask for a copy of M. P. R. 496 on Vegetable Seeds, it would not be amiss if you also asked to have copies of M. P. R. 371 on Onion Sets, M. P. R. 471 on Clover and Grass seed, and M. P. R. 492 on Seed Potatoes.
