

You cannot sell seeds if you do not have them on hand when your customer wants them.

Special Wholesale Red List Prices

For exclusive use of Seedsmen and Dealers

Effective December 1, 1944, all invoices for purchases will be charged at the prices quoted in this Burpee Red List, unless Special Offers are made by letter or telegram and referred to when the order is placed.

We expect to adhere throughout the winter and spring to the prices quoted herein, unless some causes beyond our control require a change, in which case we shall be governed by the market. All goods are offered subject to prior sale, f.o.b. Philadelphia, Pa., or Clinton, Iowa, and we reserve the right to change prices without notice if it should become necessary.

Credit and Terms of Payment

Our terms are cash with order unless you have an account with us or are satisfactorily rated by the commercial agencies. To those who have accounts and others of approved credit, our terms are *60 days net*; 2% discount for cash in ten days from date of invoice, or 3% discount when cash accompanies the order, for Vegetable and Flower Seeds and Flower Bulbs. *No discount* on Grass Seeds, Clover Seeds, Roots, and Supplies, or on Bags, Cases, and shipping charges, all of which are *net cash*.

New customers, unless satisfactorily rated with the commercial agencies, should furnish us with at least three trade references. Orders from new customers amounting to less than \$5.00 should be accompanied by cash. Orders for seeds will be shipped C.O.D. upon receipt of a deposit of 25% of the value of the order.

All Prices Quoted in This Red List are f.o.b. Philadelphia, Pa., or Clinton, Iowa

The purchaser pays the transportation charge on everything offered in this book except packets on sale or return basis, which are sent prepaid. If goods are wanted by Parcel Post, include sufficient to cover postage on cash orders. On charge orders, postage will be invoiced. We make no charges for packing or cartage, but Bags and Cases will be charged at current cost and are not returnable. If in doubt as to the best and most economical method of shipment, we suggest that you leave this to our judgment.

Shipping Instructions

With each order, please give complete shipping instructions if goods are not to be sent by parcel post. Give the name of your express or freight office and on which railroad you wish goods shipped. This will assure correct routing. After delivering the shipment to forwarders in good order (as shown by Bill of Lading), our responsibility ceases. Marine and/or War Risk insurance will be effected on foreign shipments only when so directed.

You can depend upon us to get your seeds on their way to you as quickly as possible. In these times, however, all methods of transportation are uncertain so it is advisable to order earlier than usual.

Burpee's Flower and Vegetable Seeds in Colored Bags Are Available on Sale or Return Basis

See pages 4 and 5 for a list of the most popular varieties of Flowers and Vegetables available in attractive colored packet bags. All other varieties listed in Burpee's 1945 Retail Seed Catalog can be supplied only in Kraft packet bags. On all packets, except the new Burpee Hybrid Cucumber, we will allow dealers a special 50% discount from the retail prices, but no original order will be accepted for less than 500 packets, which may be made up of flowers or vegetables or both. Additional packets throughout the season will be supplied at the same discount. Colored packets only as listed on pages 4 and 5 will be sold on a sale or return basis; Kraft packets are sold outright.

All collections of vegetable and flower seeds offered in Burpee's Seed Catalog for 1945 will be supplied at a discount of 25%, but original order must be for at least 20 collections. These collections will not be sold on sale or return basis.

Note: It is understood that the sale of Burpee's Seeds in colored packets on sale or return basis is limited to Continental United States and is made only to dealers who handle Burpee's seeds in bulk.

Vegetable Seeds

Where large quantities of a variety are ordered put up in individual sealed packages of 1 lb. or less, the single unit price will apply.

½ lb. of any variety may be ordered at ½ the single pound price. No ½ lb. unit will be sold for less than 10¢.

Flower Seeds

Except where noted otherwise, ¼ lb. or more of a variety may be ordered at the lb. rate and ½ oz. at ½ the oz. rate.

Grass seed mixtures and special grasses are on page 33. *Flower bulbs and roots:* On all varieties, we will allow dealers 15% discount from our 1945 Retail Catalog prices.












