SMALL FLOWERING DAHLIAS

Small Flowering Dahlias, which include miniatures, pompoms and singles, are highly recommended for cutting. They keep well, arrange easily and artistically, are free bloomers and come into bloom thru late summer and early fall when colorful flowers are badly needed in that gap between the annuals and mums. Very easily grown. Can be planted as close as 2½ ft. apart and work nicely in mixed borders. Require very little fertilizer but do like water during blooming season. Pinch out top when plant gets 4 or 5 pair of leaves to produce a nice bushy plant with loads of flowers. Do not disbud. Should be staked and tied to prevent wind damage. Average height 2½ to 3 feet, but some grow taller.

MINIATURES AND SINGLES

Small flowering dahlias, formed like the large dahlias but from 2 to 4 inches across. Florist types run to 5 or 6 inches across.

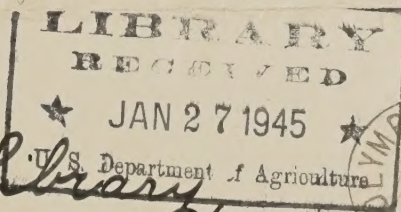

Delivery: Retail orders ready for shipment from April 15 to May 1, or later as desired. Those ordered shipped before April 15 will be sent at purchaser's risk of freezing, drying out or rotting. Place your order early as we fill them in order received. Due to severe droughts last season in many parts of the country and labor shortages, good dahlia roots will be scarce. Late orders should give second choice or indicate whether you want us to substitute or not.
