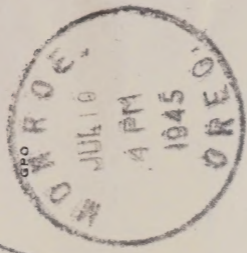

- Alona**—Height 36 inches. Well branched stalk. Blend of the colors of China maid in a large ruffled flower with horizontal falls. **Each \$15.00**
- Copper River**—Height 36 inches. Good branching. Flaring, ruffled flowers with closed standards. Glistening tan, falls overlaid bright new penny copper. The ruffled flaring form and sheen of this flower make it most attractive. **Each \$25.00**
- Lake Shannon**—Height 36 inches. Excellent branching. Seven to nine large flowers to the stalk. Standards and falls wide and fluted. Falls wide at the haft, semi-flaring to drooping, forming a graceful flower. Three flowers out at once make a beautiful stalk. A medium blue self with blue beard, tipped orange deep inside the flower. **Each \$25.00**
- Patrice**—Height 38-40 inches. Plicata, with light cream standards flushed pale rosy lavender; falls flaring, white, brushed soft bright gold across the haft which is speckled rose-brown. A refined, clean flower. **Each \$10.00**
- Treva**—Height 36 inches. Large, smooth flowers of spreading form. A self of golden apricot, with wide falls and wide, closed standards attractive form and color. **Each \$15.00**

- Calderilla**—Height 38 inches. With four well-spaced branches and terminal. Standards closed; falls semi-flaring. Blend of terra cotta, gold, and cacao brown, with violet flush at end of the beard. **Each \$15.00**
- Capriccio**—Height 40 inches. Delicate blend. Standards yellow; falls overlaid onion skin pink. **Each \$4.00**
- Casa Morena**—Height 38 inches. A large flower of rich brown. Self; with yellowish styles. Closest color in Ridgway Burnt Sienna and Chestnut. A rich new one for the garden picture. **Each \$20.00**
- Chief Poking Fire**—A different red. Large flower. Average height 34 inches. Wide standards; wide, rounded falls of Oxblood red and Victoria Lake. An attractive, bright flower. **Each \$6.00**

- Fortune's Favor**—Height 40 inches. One of the largest flowers in the garden, with substance and proportion. Standards wide, closed; glistening tan. Falls semi-flaring, ruffled; tan overlaid rosy lavender. Wide heavy, yellow beard. **Each \$20.00**
- Full Measure**—Good sized flowers of deep yellow on 40-inch well branched stalk. **Each \$5.00**
- Her Grace**—Height 48 inches. Large, rounded, flaring flowers of gray-blue-violet. **Each \$1.00**

- Marimba**—Large flower of clear cinnamon buff on a 38-inch well-branched stalk. **Each \$8.00**
- Molly May**—Strong 36-inch stalk; short branching. Large flower with wide standards and falls. Cream-pink blend with shading of rose in falls. **Each \$10.00**
- Pretty Penny**—Height 40 inches. Wide standards, wide, rounded flaring falls. Self blend of coppery rose. **Each \$10.00**
- Rio Oro**—A clean, glistening light golden brown, or "honey yellow" self on a 40-inch well branched stalk. **Each \$8.00**
- Salar**—Large flowers on a tall stalk. Blended tints of flesh, cream and salmon, with rose on the falls. **Each \$3.50**

- Sonrisa**—Height 38 inches. Large flower of rounded, flaring form, slightly ruffled. Self of coppery pink with yellow undertone. **Each \$15.00**
- Sun Hawk**—Height 34 inches. Large flower of clear medium yellow. Early, here. **\$1.00**
- Three Sisters**—Height 38 to 44 inches. Standards cream, veined yellow, becoming lighter as flower ages. Falls spreading, bronzy Indian Lake. A striking and unusual color combination. Stalks well-branched, with numerous flowers. **Each \$5.00**
