

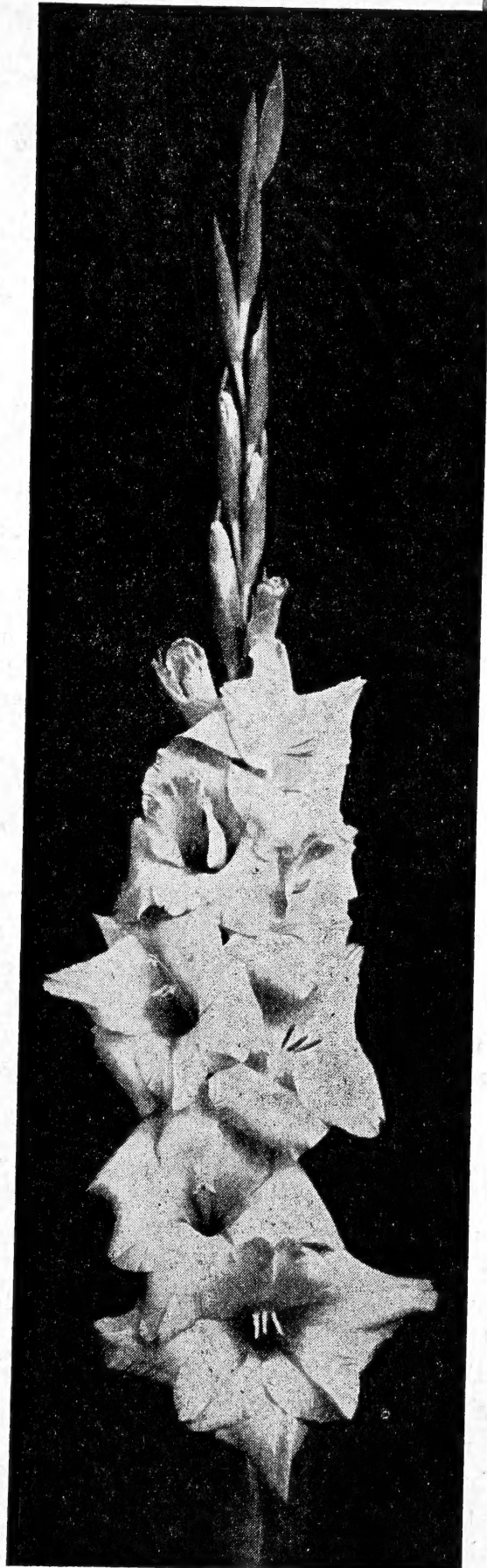

GREETING!

Another Glad season has rolled by and the harvesting is done. Like all other lines of business we have been hard hit with the shortage of help. We were forced first to cut our acreage and use every possible means of time-saving devices. The raising of vegetable crops still further complicated our normal business,—but then, we're only too glad to do our part. The digging season naturally proved to be the most strenuous as we were carrying school children from two towns and several women to the fields, and by their faithful and very generous cooperation managed to get our bulb crop dug. At all times, we lacked sufficient men to keep up on the hauling and heavy work.

The bulb situation throughout the country in general is not too bright and prices are up again, but all in all our own crop is the best we have had in three years. Bulblets germinated marvelously well and made very good size in spite of some very dry weather. The demand is still double the supply and will be as long as cut flowers bring fantastic prices, but we will make a desperate effort to take care of our old customers as far as possible. We express our sincere appreciation to every one of our old customers, especially of last season, who faithfully cooperated with us in these times of delay and shortages.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Early orders are again the order of the day. We will acknowledge all orders as promptly as possible and they will be filled in rotation. It may be difficult to

get an immediate check on available stock of this or that variety and size on limited items, but if we accept your order you can most certainly depend on it.

QUALITY OF STOCK

All our bulbs are hand-cleaned by a group of women folks who have had plenty of experience and coaching in the sorting out of any possible diseased bulbs. The cleaning table is the only place to eliminate such disease in bulbs. Along back we resorted to machinal cleaners, graders, etc., but all this has been disposed of. There is no place better to

get a good case of disease infection than to run them over rollers, where bulbs are bruised, scraped, husks torn off, and even small bulbs crushed.

Ninety per cent of our bulbs are grown from bulblets and sizes not larger than a No. 4. This insures you of a vigorous, high crown, young bulb.

TERMS AND DISCOUNTS

We sell 5 bulbs at the unit 10 rate. We do not sell less than the smallest quoted unit. For instance, if a variety is listed 2 bulbs for \$.20 we will not sell 1 bulb for \$.10, as by the time the clerical work and packing is done there is no profit left. From the wholesale list, we sell 25 bulbs at the 100 rate and 200 bulbs at the 1000 rate. All stock subject to prior sale.

On RETAIL cash orders of \$3.00 to \$10.00 you may take a discount of 5% in bulbs of your own selection and 10%

on orders of \$10.00 to \$25.00, 15% on \$25.00 orders and up. These are of your own selection, and please indicate your choice on your order blank. This discount does not apply to varieties marked No Discount, Collections, Bulbs from Wholesale List, or Lily Bulbs.

All orders from the WHOLESALE list carry 2% cash discount for cash with order, or 2% ten days to customers with established credit. We cannot accept orders for less than \$2.00.

EXTRAS

We make it our business to give good overcount and extras for sample trials. If you have any preference for these trial extras, we would appreciate your mentioning it.

TRANSPORTATION

All orders are shipped POSTPAID except those taken from the wholesale list, which go F. O. B. Lima. Unless otherwise instructed all wholesale orders are shipped express, F. O. B. Lima. Freight is not safe during the winter, and is very unreliable in these times. If your order is held as requested until some stated date, a card will be mailed at the time of shipment.

GUARANTEE

We guarantee all our bulbs to be up to size or larger, healthy, and true to name. Please let us know if you are not satisfied. We want to make it right.

WHAT IS NEW IN THE COMMERCIAL FIELD

It takes more than one year to judge a variety on its commercial merits. One is safer in making comments after three years' trial. The consistency in making good spikes as well as growing readily from bulblets, and health of the variety, are points that take more than one season.

In our last year's catalogue we mentioned several varieties of our choice which I will repeat here for your reference, and all of which are on our top-notch list. PINK RADIANCE still holds my enthusiasm for best all-around pink. It's consistent in making tall spikes, is especially healthy, a good propagator, and makes nice spikes even from bulblets. Its placement is especially good and opens beautifully in water. All in all, you can grow the Picardy, I'll grow PINK RADIANCE. I know the market still demands Picardy and it probably grows better for some than for us, but we do not get enough good spikes from a given number of bulbs. ETHEL CAVE COLE is a fine performer although the flecking is sometimes not so good. It makes massive heavy spikes consistently. In about the same color class as Picardy is KING WILLIAM. The color is cleaner but a shade lighter, and for real beauty prefer it to Picardy. I have always said this was a sport of the latter, but I may be wrong. For home market you can't go wrong on King William. ROSA VAN LIMA is not to be discarded.

SNOW PRINCESS and MAID OF ORLEANS are still a toss-up, both being in big demand. I prefer, for cutting, SILENTIUM to MARGARET BEATON, the latter being larger with a brighter blotch, but Silentium is made to order for cutting. SURFSIDE is another wonderful cutter and fine grower. Our own HEAVENLY WHITE is sure going to be a favorite when stock is available. LEADING LADY is taking the Glad world by storm. The long-distance shippers should have their wish in a white Glad that will ship and open properly. CORONA, while not pure white, is tops and a fine heavy grower.

I still don't think there is a yellow to equal MOTHER KADEL in the commercial yellow class. GOLD DUST is good, and OREGON GOLD is the largest and a No. 1 glad, but is quite late and of a sulphur yellow shade.

Many of the so-called whites are really creams, as is the case of LEADING LADY, but are light enough to sell as whites. Of the deeper, richer creams, INTERMEZZO is outstanding with the real qualities for commercial cut flower production. WANDA is also outstanding. Being a Picardy sport it is already being grown by the million.

I have settled down to grow three lavenders in quantity. ELIZABETH THE QUEEN and BADGER BEAUTY, while both of medium height, can be cut nearly to the ground and still save the foliage on the plant. I have been skeptical along back about Elizabeth the Queen in that I was afraid it would prove too stubby and short. After three years' growing, I am convinced by its persistently long flower heads. You can't go wrong on either. The third one is LAVENDER QUEEN. A little soft but early and a sure spiker, and a beautiful shade.

VALERIA is fine for us, although the bulblets are difficult to germinate. The color is just right and the keeping and shipping qualities equal any red I know. We still grow a large quantity of ROCKET. While it's a little short, it's very consistent, and a good home market flower. You can't afford to pass up STOPLIGHT. It's new, but one of the best.

There are several others I have grown for one or two seasons that look good, and will be in a better position to comment next year. Just to mention a few: I like the looks of CASABLANCA, while BIG TOP will make a marvelous number of beautiful spikes from small bulbs which are massive and open beautifully. From big bulbs they are just too big for cutting and handling. MISS WISCONSIN is a color I have long been looking for. Nearly like the old E. J. Shayler if you remember it. It's certainly one you will want. VAN GOLD with its large deep golden yellow florets will be very valuable as an early yellow, while LADY JANE has real appeal but may be a little on the short side.

RED CHARM reminds me of old Crimson Glow in color but opens better and more, and is a 100% cutter. Another one that was good is LAVENDER PRINCE, being similar to King Arthur, a little lighter in shade and with a much better flowerhead. The new one that stands out in my memory most is CONNECTICUT YANKEE. That color is something to marvel at; and the placement,—well, it's difficult to name one as nice. Watch Connecticut Yankee.

1945 INTRODUCTION

PIONEER (La Salle)

The originator considers this his finest seedling to date. It was one of the two really outstanding seedlings at the 1944 Boston Show. It's a deep salmon pink, blending to a cream throat. The large 6 inch blooms are wide open on a 5½ ft. spike and opening 6 to 8 at a time. Always straight. Very vigorous

plant, with heavy wide foliage. In spite of its size, this glad has refinement and beautiful clean-cut color. It makes plenty of real large bulblets that germinate readily and make exceptionally nice bulbs. Mid-season.

COVER GIRL (La Salle)

This seedling gave Pioneer the only real competition it had at Boston 1944 Show and won the Massachusetts Horticultural Society First-Class Certificate (their highest award). Color is a medium pink or, as my notes describe it, a Rima pink, meaning the Glad Rima by Mitsch. It opens 10 to 12 blooms, 5½ inches

across on a 30 inch flower head, and with formal placement. Grows tall, 5½ ft., with heavy foliage. This is a fine propagator and a good grower. Will give some of the best plenty of stiff competition. Midseason.

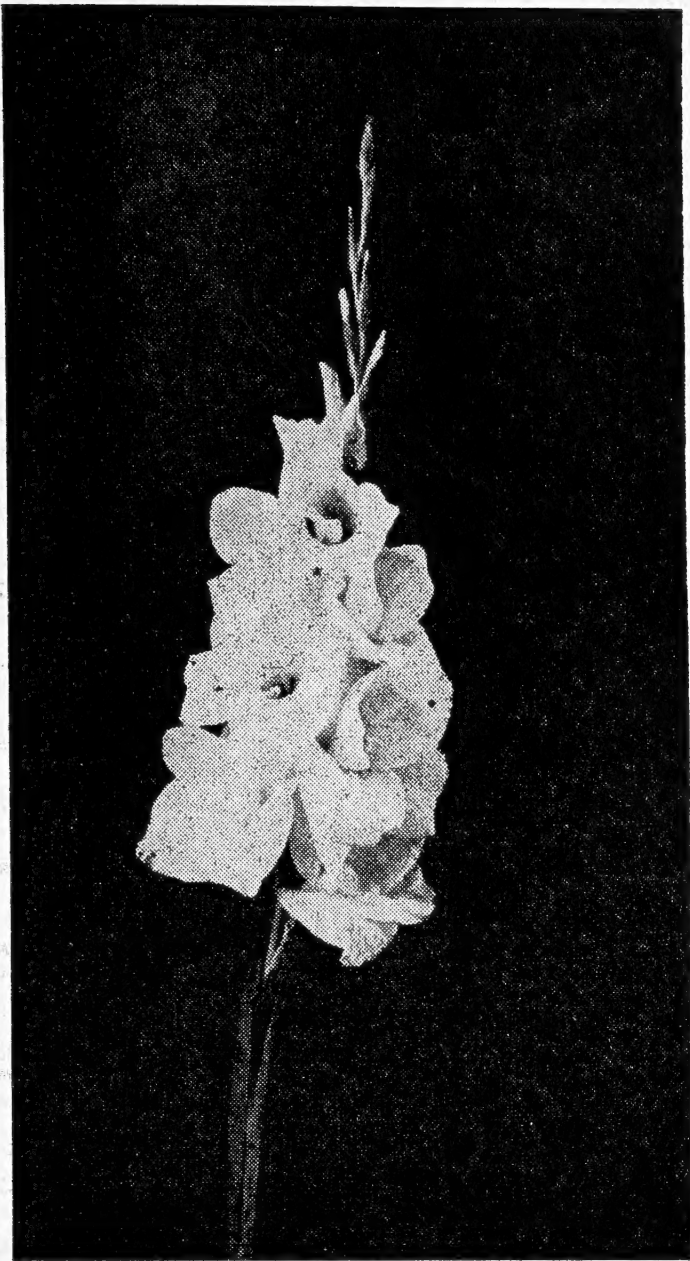
VOODOO (Kadel)

A novelty and show flower, and in a color that is not too common. Has several blue ribbons for best seedling and an American Home Achievement Medal Award to its credit. The color is a violet red smoky or plum color. Very large

flower, ruffled, and of needlepoint type, meaning wide-open recurved pedals. Strong healthy grower. Blooms in 75 to 83 days.

PORCELAIN BLUE

(Blue) *(Rich)*

A Blue Admiral x Takima seedling. Color is a pansy blue with a clean, creamy white throat, which is unusual, as most of the blues have darker throat markings. One thing that impresses me in this new blue is the nicely-placed wide-open florets of a size measuring 5 to 5¼ inches, putting it in the large class. It will open 5 to 6 excellent textured blooms and showing 5 buds in color. The plants reach a height of 50 inches, with a flower head of 20 to 22 inches long. Has clean foliage, seems to be real healthy and a good propagator. Has won in its class in several 1943 and 1944 shows. Should be a welcome addition to the blue class, but have not yet seen enough of it to comment on its commercial possibilities. Believe its form of flower alone is one thing in its favor over most other blues.

HEAVENLY WHITE

Sport of Rosa Van Lima

We introduced this variety in 1944 with far too little stock as we were sold out on all large and medium bulbs in less than three weeks after our catalogues were mailed. Stock this season is still limited, especially in the large size, so order early.

The color is a sparkling blue white with not a trace of cream, and a faint lavender marking in the throat. Its size seems even larger than Rosa Van Lima itself, and will sure go places as a show and garden flower.

Like its parent plant, it is a robust, heavy grower, making quantities of bulblets, that grow for anyone. Its commercial possibilities are of the best, especially for home market, and if Rosa Van Lima meets your approval I am definitely sure that Heavenly White will, as a cut flower.

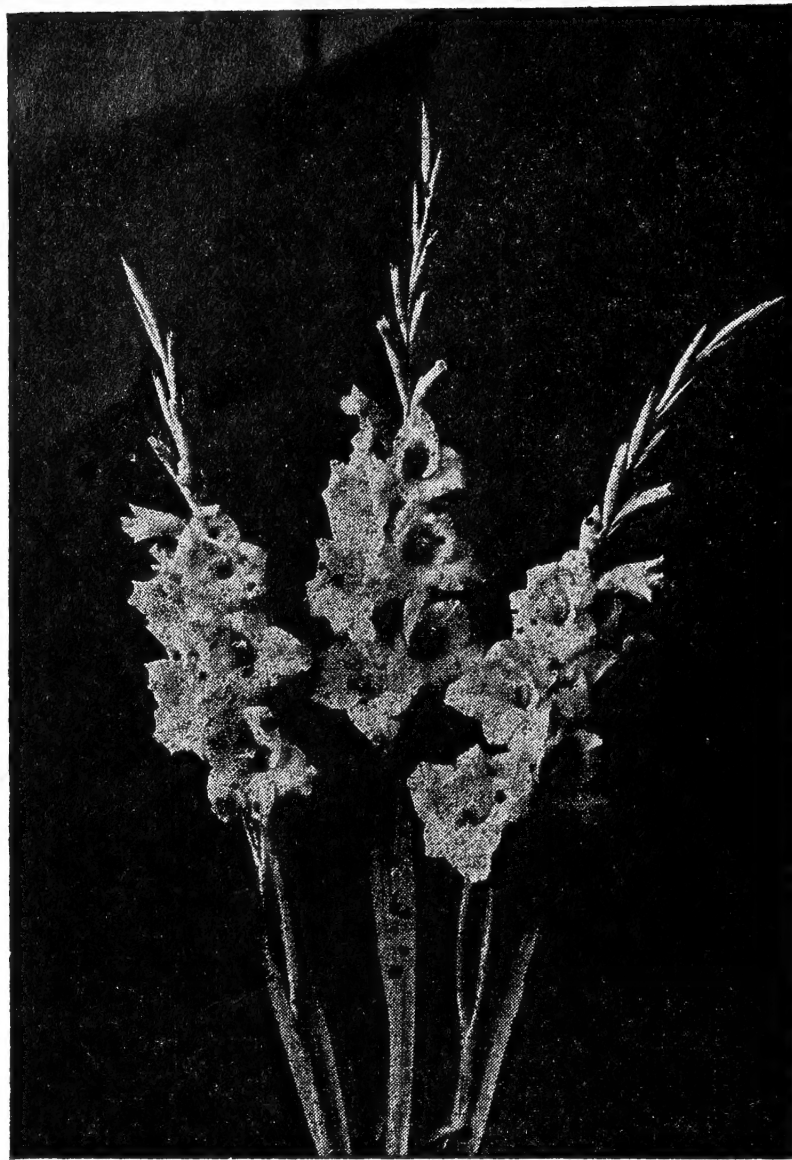

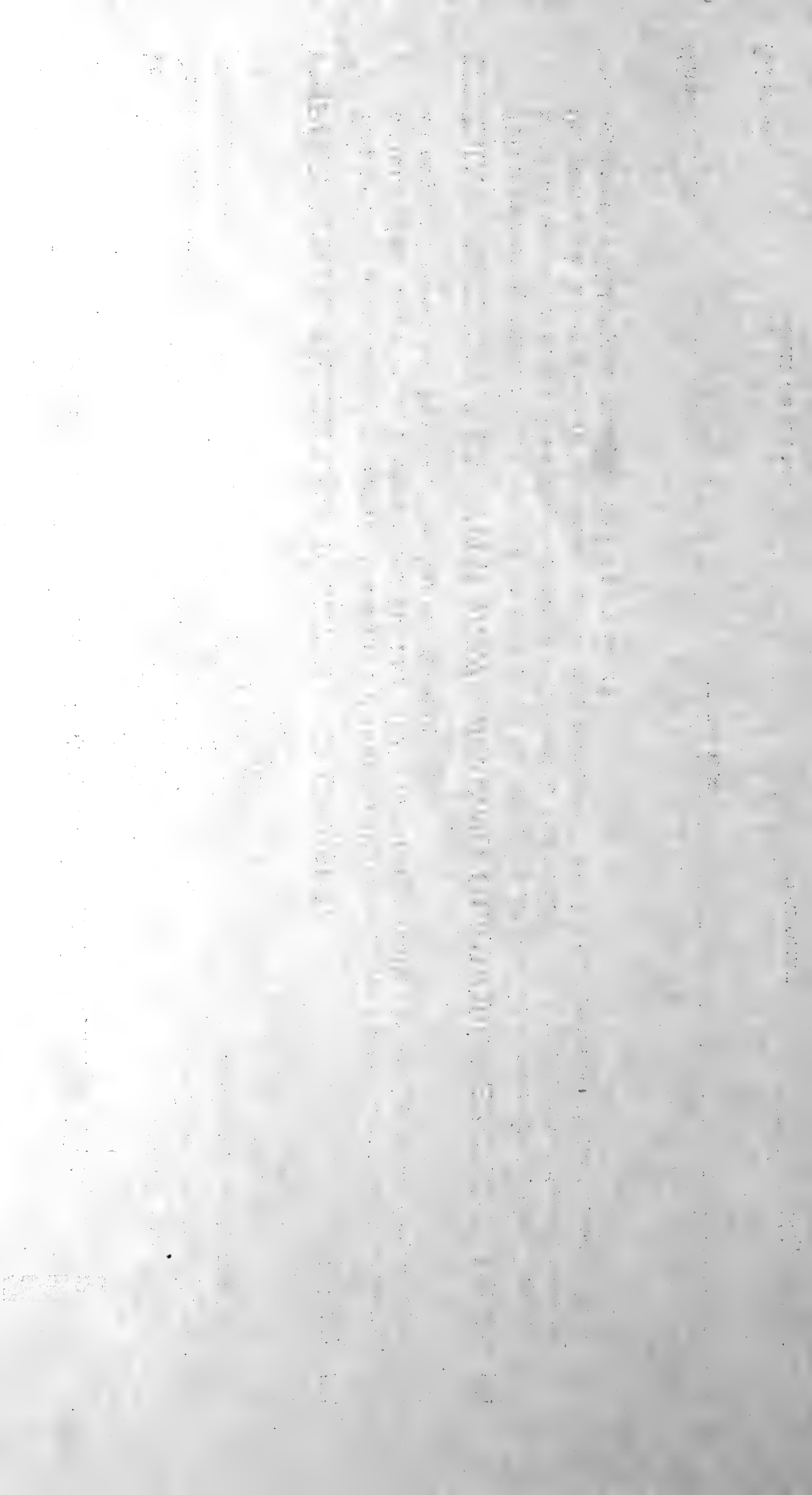
