## How to Grow HYACINTHS

Outdoors: Plant mammoth bulbs 6 to 7 in . deep, 8 in . apart; medium size bulbs, 6 in . deep and 6 in . apart.
Indoors: One bulb is usually planted in a 5-or 6 -inch pot, depending on the size of the bulb, although several bulbs may be planted in a 6 -inch or larger size pan. Use only the mammoth size bulbs for growing in water in the house. Full cultural directions for outdoor and indoor growing are given on every bag containing the bulbs.

## For Beds, Borders or Pots, where large spikes are preferred

## If large spikes are wanted for beds, borders, or pots, the medium size bulbs offered below will be found most satisfactory. For the very largest spikes, either in pots or in the garden, plant the mammoth size bulbs offered on opposite page. If size of spike is not important, plant the Large Flowered varieties listed on this page.

## Medium Size Bulbs for Large Spikes

The spikes produced from Burpee's Medium or so-called Bedding Size Bulbs will be a little smaller than those offered on the opposite page, but just as pretty. Many gardeners prefer them because of the saving in price.

## Spring Flowering CROCUS

Outdoors: Crocus will grow in many places-in the lawn, flower borders, rock gardens, edge of shrubs, on the slopes of terraces, in sun or shade, and even under trees. For showy effect, plant bulbs 3 to 4 in. apart, 2 in. deep. To avoid formal arrangements when planting in the lawn, scatter the bulbs and plant them where they fall. In borders, double rows 6 in . apart with the bulbs spaced 3 in . apart in each row are very showy; such ribbon arrangements are most striking. Do not plant in heavy, wet soil.
Indoors: Plant 8 to 10 bulbs 1 in . deep, 2 in . apart, in a 6 -in. container using light sandy soil to which bone meal has been added; water well and set in a cool cellar for about 6 weeks so that bulbs will become well rooted. When top growth has begun, bring them to the light. Keep in a cool location.

Does best in a sheltered, shady location in light, loose, well-drained soil; it can be fairly damp but must not be wet. Plant bulbs 2 to 3 in . deep and 4 to 5 in . apart. In cold sections, give winter protection.

## GLOBE TULIPS

## Calochortus

Often referred to as Fairy Lanterns; the shape of the flowers and the way they hang on the stem suggest the name. Plants are much branched and bear a number of exquisitely tinted flowers on long, leaf-wrapped stems. Globe Tulips are natives of woodlands, so should be planted in any friable soil mixed with plenty of leaf mold. They like some shade but not full shade. Fine subjects to naturalize in the rock garden or in shaded woods. Plant bulbs $21 / 2$ to 3 in . deep and 3 to 6 in . apart. In cold sections, provide winter protection after ground has become frozen. Bloom in May and June.

## MARIPOSA TULIPS

## Calochortus

"Mariposa" means butterfly in Spanish, and is applied to these Tulips because the "eyes" and markings on the gorgeously colored flowers are so much like those on the wings of a butterfly. Flowers are cup-shaped and of wonderful colors, many marked with dots and pencilings. They are borne one or more to a stem during May and June. Bulbs are small and should be planted $21 / 2$ to 3 in. deep and 3 to 6 in . apart. In cold sections give bed a surface covering of several inches of straw or strawy manure after the ground has become frozen.
9382 Clavatus The bowl-shaped blooms, often over 4 in . across, are deep golden yellow without markings, the lower half being covered with stiff yellow hairs. ## DOGTOOTH VIOLETS

## Erythronium

9089 Mixed, All Sorts Beautiful little plants, 6 to 7 in. high, with small, lily-like, nodding flowers in delicate tints of white, pink, cream, lavender, bright yellow and rose. Leaves are often prettily mottled. The shape of the roots gives them the common name of Dogtooth Violets, while the mottling of some leaves gives them also the name of Trout Lilies. Particularly suited for woodlands, shaded corners or crevices of the rock garden. Bloom in April. They do best in partial shade, in any welldrained loamy or gritty soil, moist and rich in leaf mold. Set the roots upright, 3 or more in. apart, and cover with 2 in . of soil. After soil has become frozen, give planting a covering of 4 to 6 in . of half-rotted leaves. In moderate climates where the soil is likely to freeze during the winter, cover planting with a 4 in . layer of leaves, strawy manure or litter but do not give this winter protection until after the soil has become frozen. In a general way, daffodil and narcissus mean the same thing; daffodil is the common name and narcissus the botanical name. Common usage among garden makers in this country has applied the term daffodil to the Giant Trumpet varieties, while the smaller or medium trumpet, as well as the Cluster-flowered and Poet's types, are referred to as narcissus. Botanically, these smaller or medium trumpet daffodils are the Barri, Incomparabilis, Leedsi, Poeticus, Poetaz, Polyanthus and Miniature types. To avoid confusion, we are listing all of these classes as daffodils.

Some gardeners apply the name jonquil to the Giant Trumpet Daffodils, but this is misleading, as the true jonquils and campernelles are small flowered and sweet scented; showy when massed in beds, borders or naturalized. Their delicious fragrance makes them indispensable for cutting.

As daffodils bloom early, last a long time, and may be had in so many lovely varied forms, they have few equals as garden flowers. They are most desirable for any garden pur-pose-in masses, in beds or borders, in groups of 12 or more here and there in the hardy perennial border, or in the foreground of shrubbery. ## How to Grow DAFFODILS

Outdoors: For best results plant bulbs as early in the fall as possible, 4 to 8 in . deep and 6 to 10 in . apart; the exact distances depend on the size of the bulb and the nature of the soil. In very cold locations, after the ground is frozen hard, cover with leaves, straw or coarse litter to a depth of 4 to 6 in .
Indoors: Put several bulbs, about 1 in . apart (same variety), in a pot, barely cover the bulbs with soil, water thoroughly, and put in coldframe or heel-in in the garden for 8 to 10 weeks to force root development before bringing indoors for winter blooming.
