How to Plant Peonies

Peonies may be planted successfully during autumn or early spring. The area to be planted should usually have a liberal application of bone-meal or superphosphate deeply spaded in, as preparation. Inasmuch as Peonies become quite large with age, they should be spaced 3 or 4 feet apart. The holes should be dug large enough and deep enough to accommodate the roots to be planted. In setting the plants, place the eyes (crown buds) 2½ inches below ground level. A handful of fertilizer mixed with the soil before filling in is good practice. Allow no manure of any kind to come in contact with Peony roots. Never plant in a location where the roots of large trees will rob Peonies of necessary plant food and moisture.

Peony clumps may stand in the same place for many years if grass-sod is not allowed to strangle growth and if an occasional application of bonemeal and potash is hoed in around the plants. Do not mow Peony tops to the ground before late fall, and leave at least half the foliage on the plant when taking cut flowers.

Our Peonies are grown for plants only, and the roots sent out on orders will be from young, disease-free blocks, assuring satisfaction to our customers. Shipment will begin in early September, continuing through the fall season.

BARONESS SCHROEDER. Rose type; late mid-season. White with shading of flesh. Large flowers with chalice-shaped center, freely produced and lasting a long time. Very fragrant. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

CLAIRE DUBOIS. A large, bright satiny pink with a silver sheen. Late flowering and one of the best in its class. Medium height. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

EDULIS SUPERBA. Dark pink, even color; large, loose, flat crown when fully open. Very fragrant; upright growth; early bloomer. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

EDWARD TEAS. A very large, deep red with a trace of purple shading, blooming in early midseason. Broad guard petals surround the body of the high-built flower, which is very attractive during its blooming season. The foliage is large and healthy and the stems strong and above medium height. FELIX CROUSSE. Deep rose-red, fully double. The central bomb of incurved petals is surrounded by broad, prominent guard petals. A good midseason red, especially for cutting. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

FESTIVA MAXIMA. An early true rose-type white with wide guard petals surrounding a compact mass of rich white petals flecked crimson. Very large flowers on tall, strong stems. Affords early cut flowers. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

FRANKIE CURTIS. A very large, perfect bomb type, with large prominent guard petals. Opens delicate flesh, changing to pure white, with a pink blush in the heart of the flower. Known often as White Mons. Jules Elie. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$3.00.

GRANDIFLORA. A large, late, fragrant, soft shell-pink, fading to rose-white. The last Peony to bloom. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

MARY BRAND. A red in which there is little trace of purple; rose-type blooms of vivid crimson. A fine landscape variety and excellent for cutting. Mid-season. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.25; 3 for \$3.50.

MME. EMILE LEMOINE. A beautiful white coming into bloom late in the season. The flowers are large, uniform in shape and size, with center petals marked carmine. The plant is rather tall, with strong erect stems. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

MODELE DE PERFECTION. The large flowers are old-rose-pink, somewhat mottled with deeper tones. This blooms in late midseason, affording loads of flowers after some of the earlier varieties have passed. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

MODESTE GUERIN. A large early midseason deep rose-pink with a rose fragrance. Popular as a cut-flower variety as well as for garden decoration. 3-5 Eyes. Each \$1.00; 3 for \$2.85.

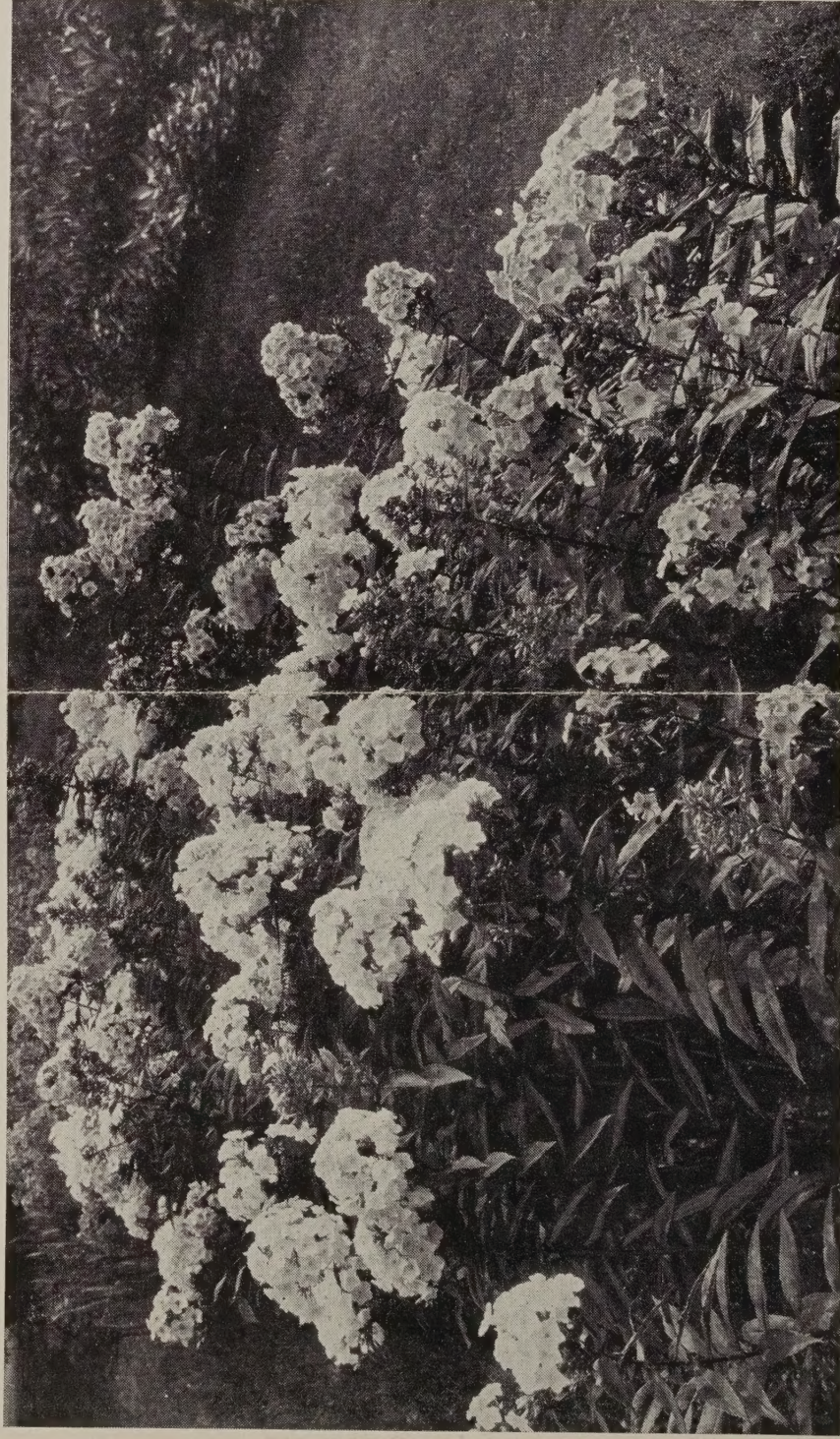

Hardy Phlox • THE SHOWY HARDY PERENNIAL

For the best garden effect, group at least three plants of a color, preferably planting white between reds and pinks. The Phloxes need a fertile soil and copious waterings each week when the ground becomes dry in summer. Remove bloomed-out flower stems, after which a second crop of flowers may be expected. Bordeaux spray is recommended for keeping the foliage healthy, beginning before the appearance of leaf-spot. Dusting with sulphur will control red spider. Two or three-year-old clumps should be divided and replanted in a new sunny location.

AMERICAN BEAUTY.

Clear deep pink flowers in large panicles. A strong, healthy grower; tall. New.

BRIGHT EYES.

An attractive shade of lavender pink with crimson-centered florets. Medium height.

CHIEFTAIN.

Deep crimson-red, the color holding through the blooming season without fading. A vigorous grower.

COMUS.

Orange-vermilion with garnet center. Large heads of flowers; rather dwarf in habit of growth.

DAILY SKETCH.

Salmon-pink with prominent carmine center. A tall grower and one of the more popular of this color.

LILLIAN.

Large panicles of lovely pure pink flowers.

MOUNT HOOD.

Large, pure white flowers in beautifully arranged clusters. A sturdy grower of medium height.

PINK CHARM.

Bright clear pink with a scarlet sheen. Medium height with many flowering branches.

REDBIRD.

Deep bright crimson of medium height. Much in demand.

RUBY LEE.

The large clusters of flowers are plum-red. Plant strong and vigorous, medium to tall.

STARLIGHT.

Violet shading to lilac with star-shaped white-centered florets; medium height.

THOR.

Deep salmon-pink with carmine-pink shadings; tall.
