## How to Plant Peonies

Peonies may be planted successfully during autumn or early spring. The area to be planted should usually have a liberal application of bonemeal or superphosphate deeply spaded in, as preparation. Inasmuch as Peonies become quite large with age, they should be spaced 3 or 4 feet apart. The holes should be dug large enough and deep enough to accommodate the roots to be planted. In setting the plants, place the eyes (crown buds) $21 / 2$ inches below ground level. A handful of fertilizer mixed with the soil before filling in is good practice. Allow no manure of any kind to come in contact with Peony roots. Never plant in a location where the roots of large trees will rob Peonies of necessary plant food and moisture.
Peony clumps may stand in the same place for many years if grass-sod is not allowed to strangle growth and if an occasional application of bonemeal and potash is hoed in around the plants. Do not mow Peony tops to the ground before late fall, and leave at least half the foliage on the plant when taking cut flowers.
Our Peonies are grown for plants only, and the roots sent out on orders will be from young, diseasefree blocks, assuring satisfaction to our customers. Shipment will begin in early September, continuing through the fall season.
