HEMEROCALLIS (day lilies) are extremely hardy, does well in any type soil, in shade (not dense) or full sun. The new hybrids, with their prolonged blooming season have their place in all well appointed gardens. They have no off seasons, never too wet or dry, neglect does not prevent blooming. An ideal plant for those with limited garden work hours.

Many have two blooming periods, others bloom continuously all summer. They are truly most colorful, yellow from palest yellow to deep orange, bright red to deep mahogany, maroon to black, others with combinations of pink, rose, purple, pastels and bicolors.

We cross pollinate our higher price plants in view of producing new shades and markings. Our seed surplus can be had @ \$2.00 a hundred. 1 year seedling plants \$2.50 pr doz. 2 year @ \$3.50. A color range of unlabeled blooming size plants \$5.00 dozen.

Several years ago we dispensed with chemical fertilizers. We use the Indoor Method of composting. This compost is the IDEAL plant food, earlier and longer blooming season, better branched flower scapes, more blooms and finer quality. My files contain many letters vouching for this statement.

Each season many letters are received from those never having seen the new colors. - LINDA - (Stout) Fascinating rose pink, petals creped, golden lightly washed rose, sepals clear cream. Blooms thru summer. 2½ ft. 75¢ (D)
- MARGERET PERRY (Perry) Blooms are brilliant rose-red and buff orange lined with yellow. 4 ft. Summer bloomer. 35¢. (D)
- MARY GUENTHER - (Russell) Real contrast in bicolor. Petals a striking velvet carmine red, sepals a clear yellow. A must have. 3 ft. April-May-June. \$2.00. (E)

- MIKADO - (Stout) A mellow orange with dark red-purple eyezone in each petal. 3 ft. May-June. 50¢ (E)
- OLD PAINT - (Russell) Fast grower, blooms here all summer. In the North June-July and Fall. Petals bright mahogany red, almost black eyezone, sepals deep yellow overcast mahogany. Exceptionally well branched. 3 ft. \$2.00 (E)
- ***OLD VINTAGE - (Russell) Tall wine purple, small yellow throat, heavy bloomer of medium size flowers. April-May \$2.00 (E)
- OPHIR - (Fair) A well pleasing golden yellow. 4 ft. May-June. 50¢ (E)
- ORANGE KING - An old favorite in orange, midsummer 3 ft. 35¢ (E)
- PORT - (Stout) It's bright red flower of medium size catches the eye quickly. An excellent foreground plant 2½ ft. Summer bloomer \$2.00 (Semi-E)
- ***PRIDE OF HOUSTON - (Russell) A most brilliant flower with mahogany red petals darker eyezone 3 ft. May-June. \$2.00 (E)
- PURPLE FLASH - (Russell) Petals purple with deeper purple eyezone. Sepals yellow overcast purple. Pinched effect petals which opens ¾. Blooms thru summer till frost here. 3 ft. \$3.00 (E)
- ***PURPLE WATERS - (Russell) Fast multiplier, well branched purple blooms in sun, if in shade a wine-purple. Blooms open full and recurved. 3 ft. April-May \$2.00 (D)
- ROSY DAY - (Nesmith) All season bloomer, large fragrant blooms, undercolor light yellow, edges washed with rosy pink. 4 ft. \$2.00 (E)
- SACHEM - (Stout) The reddish-brown blooms are exceptionally fine, the light orange throat is a pleasing combination. Summer bloomer 3½ ft. \$2.00 (E)
- ***SANTA FE - (Russell) Twisted rosy red petals, deeper eyezone, sepals yellow overlaid rose. Good bloomer and fast multiplier. May-June-July. \$2.00 (E)

- SUNNY WEST - (Sass) Waxy texture of canary color, 4 ft. Midsummer. 75¢ (D)
- SYLVIA - (Russell) Large rosy-pink blooms, deeper eyezone, sepals yellow. May-June \$2.00. (D)
- THERON - (Stout) Deep red and twisted petals. Outstanding. 3 ft. June. \$2.00 (D)
- ***TRADE WINDS - (Russell) An outstanding one of this color. Solid cream pastel. A profuse bloomer. 4 ft. May-June. \$2.00 (D)
- VULCAN - (Stout) Even toned light velvety maroon with faint golden brown midrib. Medium large flowers with golden throat. July-August. \$1.50 (E)
- WAR PATH - (Russell) An outstanding one in dark red, satin sheen, very wide petals which open wide and recurved, this is the answer for a real good red. April-May and Fall. \$3.50. (E)
