

O UR AIM is to grow only the desirable varieties and to furnish stock that will grow, as a satisfied customer is our wish.

The soil of our five acre plantation is ideal for the growing of roots and bulbs. We have irrigation in case it is needed and a frost proof root cellar for Gladiolus bulbs that insures plump, hard bulbs full of vitality.

All prices are cash with order unless customer has a charge account on our books.

We prefer to ship by Express. In case of small shipments by parcel post add ten cents per root for postage on Peonies and twenty cents per dozen on Iris roots. Gladiolus prepaid in small lots.

CULTURAL DIRECTIONS PEONIES

Peonies will grow in any good garden soil but should have a sunny location. Use fertilizers cautiously, a handful of bonemeal per plant each year is sufficient. Do not plant the topmost eyes more than two inches below the surface. Good drainage is essential. If your planting plat is a flat surface mound the earth around each plant to raise the crown above the spring water that thaws and freezes. Plant during early October if possible. Spring planting is not recommended but is often done successfully—remember the eyes are very brittle in the Spring, but stand handling well when dug in the Fall. Most divisions will show bloom the first year, but do not expect nor allow more than two blossoms. It requires one year for plants to be well established after which you can expect bloom for a lifetime every year in June.

IRIS

Plant Iris in well drained garden soil covering the top of the fieshy roots not more than one inch. A sunny location is preferred for most kinds. A sprinkle of lime or hardwood ashes on the soil before preparation is recommended. Iris multiplies rapidly and should be divided every three or four years. No winter protection is required for the varieties listed. Beware of heavy fertilization. A small application of bone-meal and lime each year is all that is necessary.

GLADIOLUS

Plant Gladiolus in full sunshine in any good garden soil two inches deep. The bulbs can be planted four inches apart in double rows for cultivation. When the bulbs are planted a top dressing of pulverized sheep manure is recommended. This dressing should be renewed when the flower buds appear for best bloom, but the average garden soil without any enrichment will produce good bloom. Dig the bulbs when frost has killed the foliage. Cure in a dry warm place for a few days. Clean the bulbs of roots and old corms and store in a frost proof cellar over winter. Successive plantings can be made from April 15th to June 10th for an extension of bloom. Save the bulblets for propagation of the varieties. All come true. Plant them early when there is plenty of moisture in the soil. Sow thickly and cover lightly.

We grow for market only about 50 varieties of what we consider popular and desirable kinds. We, however, are testing the promising new varieties and can usually supply your needs in these new and high priced kinds if you will write us. Great care is used to keep all stock true to name. We grow bulbs without excessive fertilization on soil well adapted to the production of vigorous bulbs and on a new plat each year; irrigation is available when needed, and bulbs are stored in a frost proof cellar insuring plump bulbs for spring delivery.

ON FALL ORDERS:

 $10\,\%$ discount will be allowed on orders for delivery before December 1st on prices quoted, for cash orders.

Sizes and prices of Gladiolus bulbs are as follows: PLANTING SIZE: Are from ¼ in. to about 1 inch usually classed as No. 3 to No. 6 and are used to grow the blooming size or commercial bulbs by growing one year.

BLCOMING SIZE: Are from one inch up to two inches in diameter, and will average about 1¼ inches; some of the choice varieties produce bulbs not more than one inch in diameter. All will bloom the season planted.

BULBLETS: Planted early will produce planting stock varying in size from No. 6 to No. 3.

Price of single bulbs are one tenth of the dozen price; price per 100 is seven times the dozen price. Special prices will be made when wanted by the 1000.

We endeavor to grow right, properly cure and store, and ship to you vigorous bulbs that are true to name, at reasonable prices.

The vitality of bulbs is an important factor where fine bloom is wanted.
