Potatoes should be planted during April or early May. They will thrive in almost any fertile, well-drained, somewhat acid soil. Do not use lime. The soil should be plowed or deeply dug over and furrows 6 inches deep and $21 / 2$ to 3 feet apart, should be made. A commercial fertilizer with high phosphorus and potash content should be thoroughly mixed with the soil at the bottom of the furrow about 20 lbs . per 100 ft . row and about 2 inches of unfertilized topsoil should be placed over it.
