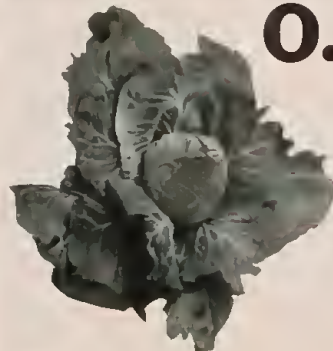

French Breakfast	.10
Good early sort. Root cylindrical. Skin smooth, pink, with small white tip.	
Icicle	.10
The earliest of the long white sorts. Roots pure white. Flesh compact, of fine quality.	
Crimson Giant	.10
Large, but not pithy. One of the best for outdoors culture.	
Scarlet Globe	.10
One of the earliest forcing radishes. Roots of medium size.	
Early Scarlet Turnip	.10
Early, round, deep scarlet, crisp and tender.	
Scarlet Turnip White Tipped	.10
Early spherical sort, three quarters rose, one quarter white. Quick grower. Crisp	
Long Scarlet Short Top	.10
Root about six inches long and of scarlet color. Top short. Good quality.	
White Strasburg	.10
Root half long, medium early, pointed 4-5 inches long. Flesh white, pungent.	
Saxa	.10

SALSIFY	.15
Sandwich Island	.15
An improvement of the ordinary type. Root thicker and shorter.	

SPINACH	.10
Bloomsdale Savoy	.10
Very early sort, round seeded; one of the best for market, with broad glossy, dark green leaves, crumpled.	
Thick Leaved	.10
A strong, upright growing medium early sort.	
Victoria	.10
Late, round seeded variety. Leaves dark green broad, thick, round. Slow to run to seed, best for market.	
New Zealand	.10
Plant different from Spinach but is used in place of Spinach in dry soils. Leaves thick.	
Long Standing	.10
Late, slow growing sort, round seeded. Leaves numerous, crinkled, deep green. Excellent variety for spring use.	

TOMATO	.20
Ponderosa	.40
A large, purple, fruited tomato, and for home use one of the best. Fruit large, few seeds.	
Bonny Best	.20
About a week earlier than Chalk's Early Jewell. Fruit smaller, very smooth, solid and uniform. Color bright red.	
Earliana	.20
The earliest and best of the very early tomatoes, very productive for an early sort; fruit of fair size, round very smooth and solid. Color bright scarlet.	
Stone	.20
A favorite with Canners and Truckers. Always dependable. Deep red in color. Fruit large, smooth and solid.	
Greater Baltimore	.20
A main crop, very productive, red fruited variety of the Matchless Type; quite popular with Canners.	
Chalk's Early Jewel	.20
A fine early variety, about 10 days later than Earliana; fruit uniformly smooth, round and solid. Color crimson.
