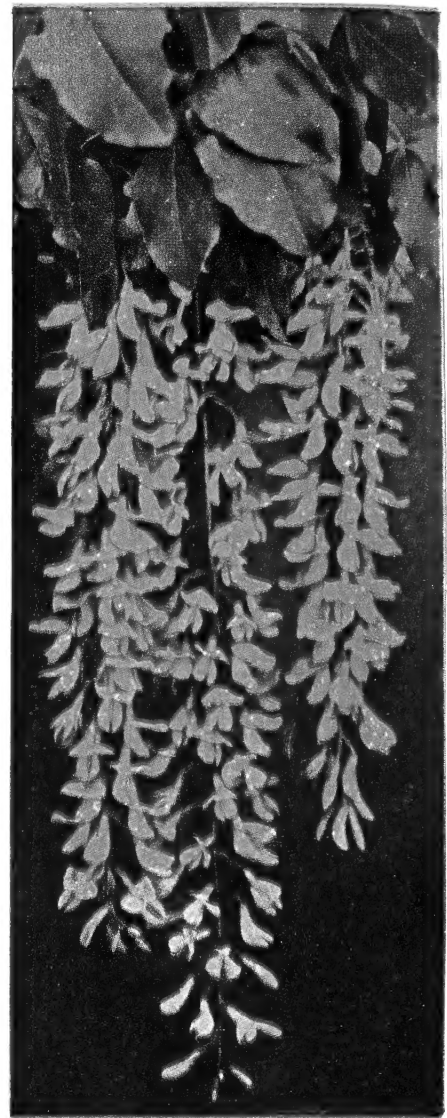

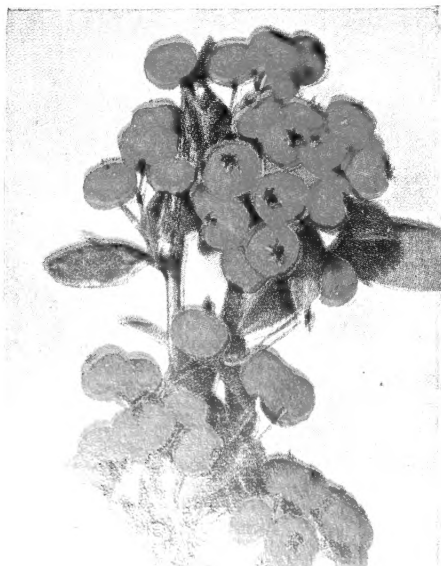

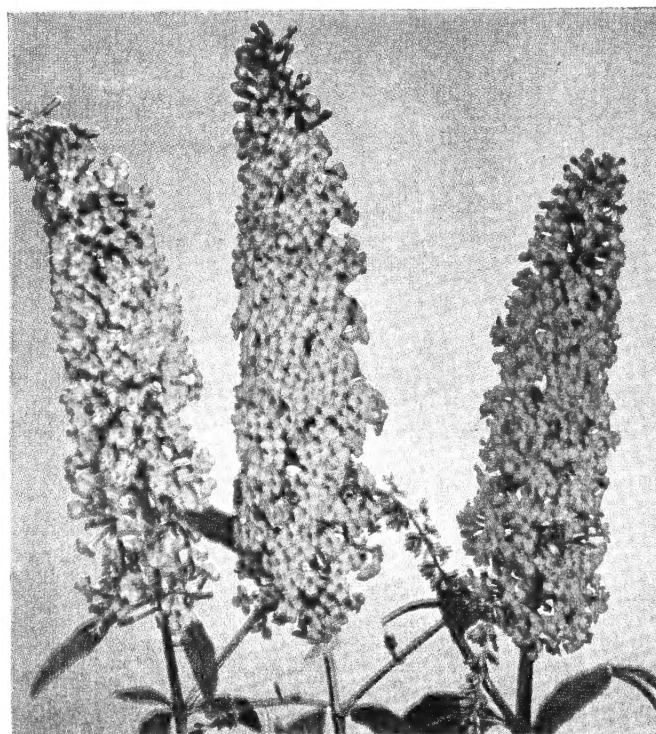

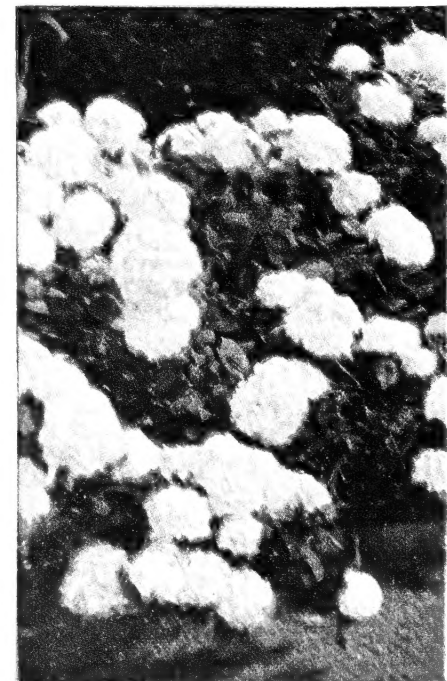

Blackberries..... 4 by 7 ft. to 6 by 9 ft.
 In case of Dwarf Apples or Pears the distance may be one-half of the distance recommended for standard varieties.

HARDY LILIES

Lilies are easy to grow if simple cultural directions are followed. Plant in groups of three or more in light shade and in rich, well-drained soil. Most varieties are planted 5 to 7 inches deep. However, generally they may be planted with the base of the bulb set 3 times the overall height of the bulb. One exception is the Madonna Lily. This bulb should never be covered deeper than 1 to 2 inches. Depth to plant indicated below.

SPRING PLANTED BULBS AND TUBERS

Spring Planted Bulbs and Tubers include Cannas, Dahlias and Gladiolus, and they cannot be treated as other bulbs as frost is fatal to the tubers. Dig them up in the Fall before the ground freezes and after they have been thoroughly dried and cleaned, store them where they will not dry out in a cool cellar in shallow boxes. Plant them in Spring as soon as danger of frost has passed.

Cannas should be planted about 2 feet apart and 3 to 4 inches deep. Give plenty of water during Summer.

Dahlias should be planted not closer than 18 inches apart and 6 inches deep, laid flat, eyes and sprouts up.

Gladiolus. Plant Gladiolus 2 to 4 inches deep and 4 to 6 inches apart, in rich soil in a sunny place.

Lilies. The most desirable soil for Lilies is a loose, sandy loam which will be enriched by top dressing of manure and should be well drained. Plant Lilies in groups about 6 inches deep and 8 to 12 inches apart. Never allow manure to come into direct contact with the root bulbs. They may be left in the ground from year to year.

HOW TO PLANT CANNAS

Prepare a bed 18 inches deep. If soil is stony or of poor quality, remove old soil and replace with a mixture of three-quarters rich garden loam and one-quarter Sphagnum Peat Moss. Plant the bulbs 18 inches apart each way and 3 to 4 inches deep about May 1st to 15th. However, the bulbs may be planted in pots about the 1st of April and then transplanted outdoors in May about Tomato planting time. In planting in pots divide the rootstocks so there will be one or two healthy buds. Cannas need plenty of water during the Summer. A 2-inch mulch of Sphagnum Peat Moss will help conserve moisture during the hottest months.
