## HYACINTHS

We offer high quality bulbs in an excellent range of colors, and in two sizes-Exhibition or First Size ( $18-19 \mathrm{~cm}$.) and Bedding Size ( $15-16 \mathrm{~cm}$.).

The smaller bulbs are better for outdoor use, as the spikes are then not too heavy and are less apt to bend or break.

For outdoor bedding, plant the bulbs 5 inches deep and 6 to 8 inches apart. In northern United States and Canada they should have some protection in Winter. For indoor growth, do not use new clay pots unless they have been soaked in water for two weeks. Use rich loam and have the top of the bulb about even with the surface of the soil, one in a 5 - or 6 -inch pot.


## NARCISSI

## (DAFFODILS)

Whether you call them Narcissi or Daffodils, nothing that blooms early in the Spring has a wider range of beauty and usefulness. They can be used in beds, in rock gardens, or naturalized, and always look best in groups of a dozen or more. They will continue to thrive for several years without being lifted, and many different types are available.

For outdoor use, plant the bulbs as early as possible in the Fall, 4 to 6 inches deep and 6 to 9 inches apart. Indoors, treat them the same as Tulips, but barely cover the bulbs with soil, and water copiously.

We offer two sizes of bulbs, Double Nose II (DN II) for outdoor use, and the larger Double Nose I (DN I) for forcing. The larger bulbs will be supplied only on early orders, as we will not carry a surplus stock of them. Where an asterisk (") appears before the name, the variety is suitable for forcing.

Narcissi types vary in color of perianth petals and in length, color, and style of trumpet, crown or cup. They are of several classes, as follows:

Trumpet These have long trumpers and are subdivided into "Yellow", which are all yellow; "White", which are all white; "Bicolor", with white perianth and light yellow trumpet.

Incomparabilis The cup or crown is one-third to nearly as long as the perianth.

Barrii The cup or crown measures less than one-third the length of the perianth.

Poeticus All have white perianths and flattened yellow crowns, more or less deeply colored scarlet or crimson.

Poetaz These produce flowers in clusters of three to eight, depending upon the variety, on long, strong stems.

Double These are all double-flowered.
Jonquilla These have smaller flowers, usually in clusters of two or more on a sturdy stem.

Triandus In this group the perianth petals are reflexed and the flowers tend to droop.

## BOTANICAL TULIPS (TULIPA SPECIES)

All so-called Botanical Tulips (Tulipa species) are natives of Asia Minor and central Asia. All of them bloom early, have bright colors and recurved petals. They tolerate shade better than Tulips and are especially attractive in rock gardens and hardy borders.

## CROCUSES

Crocuses are usually planted in borders, or in random patches about the lawn, 2 inches deep, where they bloom very early and are unharmed by later mowings. Indoors they may be grown in light soil. Water them well and keep them in a dark place about six weeks or until the top growth starts.

,TULIPS

Tulips, the unbeatables of Spring Flowering Bulbs! Single Earlies, Double Earlies, Double Lates and Parrots, all differ somewhat from the regular late Tulips, which resemble each other and bloom all at the same time or only a few days apart.

Our bulbs are grown by one of the very best producers in Holland, and every year we receive many compliments on the quality of our bulbs.

In addition to First Size ( $11-12 \mathrm{~cm}$.) bulbs for outdoor use, we offer Top Size ( 12 cm . and larger) for indoor forcing of certain varieties. Orders for the larger bulbs for forcing must be placed in advance of shipping time, say before August 1st, as we will not carry a surplus stock of them for late orders. Where an asterisk (*) appears before the name, the variety is suitable for forcing.

Tulips should be planted outdoors 5 to 6 inches deep, and about 6 inches apart. Avoid areas where Tulips have been grown during the previous two years, and do not use fresh manure.

Indoors, bulbs may be transferred to pots after two or three months in outdoor beds, when well rooted. Keep in a cool room before bringing them into ordinary house temperature.

## SINGLE EARLY

These bloom about a week before the regular varieties and last until the others are in bloom. The flowers are bright colored, on stems up to 15 inches tall, which means that they are a little shorter than the so-called late Tulips.

## DOUBLE EARLY

These are regaining their former popularity, as the flowers, which are double and somewhat resemble Peonies, are most attractive. They bloom just ahead of the Darwins, Triumphs, etc., on stems about a foot tall and will make an interesting addition to any rock garden, besides looking equally fine in beds.

## DOUBLE LATE

These resemble Double Earlies, except that they bloom with the later Tulips. No planting is complete without some Doubles.

## PARROTS

These are sometimes called Orchid Tulips. They have brilliantly colored, irregularly shaped flowers which are fringed, deeply cut, and frequently splotched with green. The newer varieties have good stems. Fantasy has been a popular Parrot for years.

## MUSCARI

These are excellent for rock gardens and hardy borders. Plant the bulbs 2 to 3 inches deep and 3 to 4 inches apart.

## Rule of Thumb for Planting Bulbs

When in doubt as to how deep to plant bulbs, use the old "Rule-of-Thumb" and plant them "three times their thickness." Thus, a bulb that measures an inch from top to bottom should be covered with 3 inches of soil.

## SCILLA

Plant the bulbs 2 to 3 inches deep and about 3 inches apart. Scillas are fine for naturalizing in masses, in borders, or in rock gardens. Campanulatas are about 15 inches tall, Sibirica about 4 inches.

## GALANTHUS (SNOW DROPS)

These will thrive under hedges and in borders, where they should be left to naturalize themselves. Plant them about 3 inches deep. They bloom very early.

## CHIONODOXA

These bloom about the same time as Crocuses, are very hardy, and increase rapidly. Plant them about 3 inches deep and 3 inches apart, in masses for best effect.
