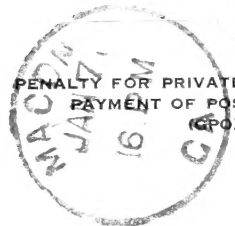

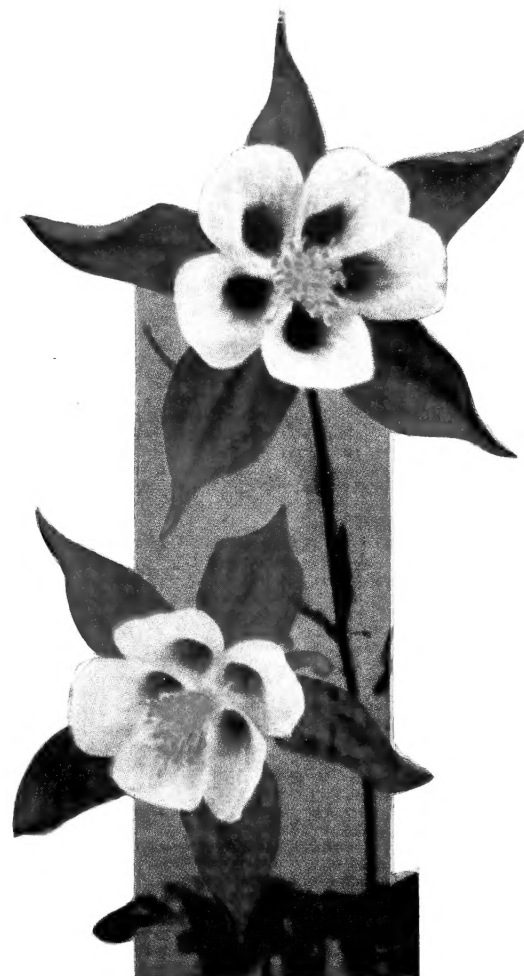
AQUILEGIA Long-Spurred Columbine

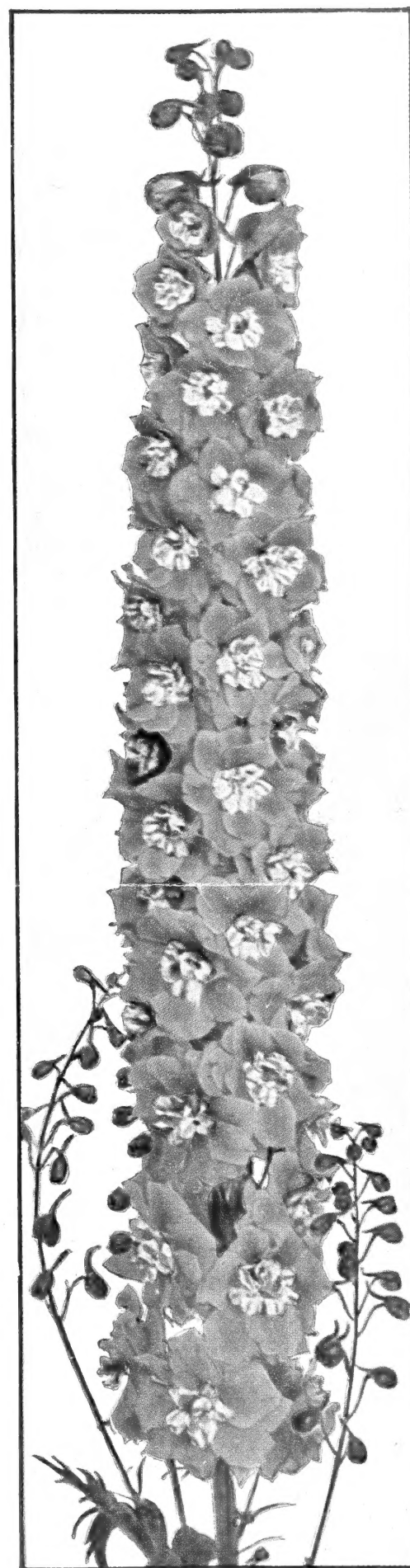
SALVI GREGGI
