

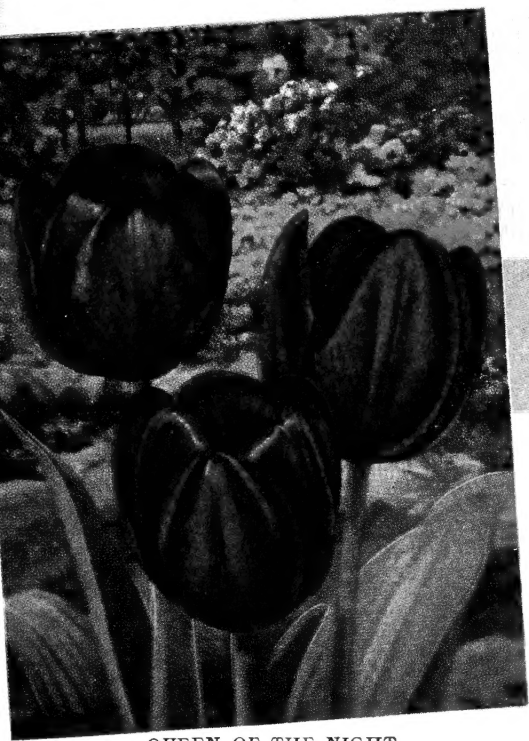

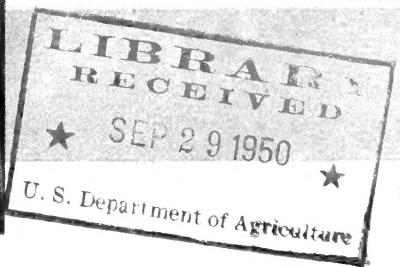

Daffodils and Narcissus do well in almost all soils and locations and are a permanent addition to the garden. Plant them where they can be left alone to increase from year to year.

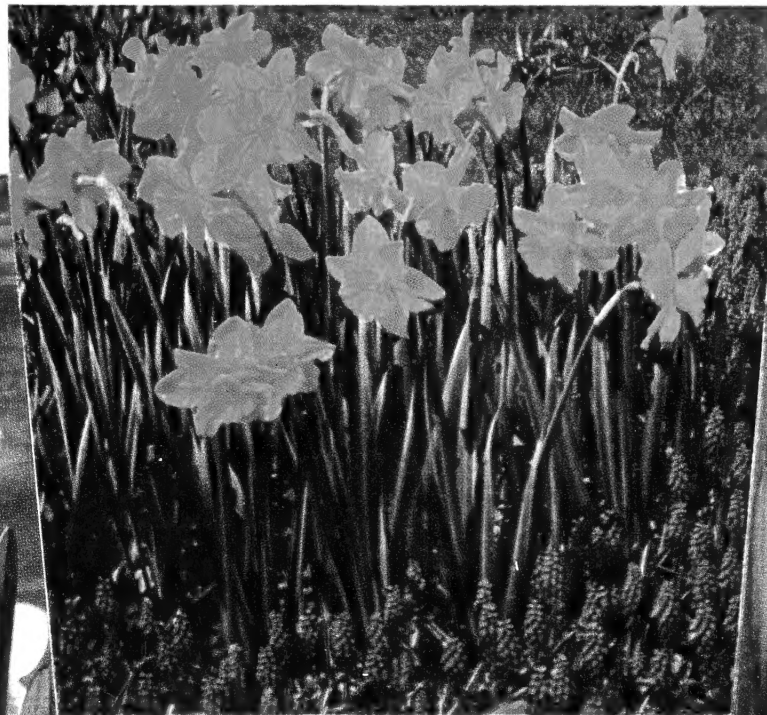

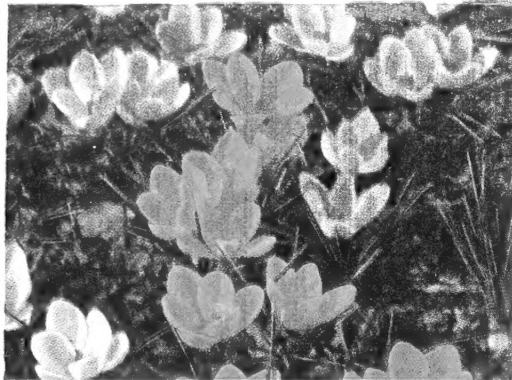
