## HOW TO GROW HYACINTHS

Outdoors: Plant the mammoth bulbs 6 to 7 in . deep and 8 in . apart; medium size bulbs, 6 in . deep and 6 in . apart.
Indoors: One bulb is usually planted in a 5 - or 6 -inch pot, depending on the size of the bulb, although several bulbs may be planted in a 6 -inch or larger size pan. Use only the mammoth size bulhs for growing in water in the house. Full cultural directions are given on every bag containing the bulbs.

## HOW TO GROW TULIPS

Outdoors: Tulips should not be planted in soil in which they had been grown the last two seasons. Select a new location in a sunny position. Do not use fresh manure at planting time; well-rotted manure or bone meal may be worked into the soil which should be well drained. Plant bulbs 5 to 6 in . deep and 6 to 8 in . apart.
Indoors: A mixture of $2 / 3$ good clean garden soil and $1 / 3$ leaf mold to which a little bone meal has been added will give the best results. A 6 -inch pot will hold about 6 bulbs. Place bulbs about 1 in. apart each way. Cover with an inch of soil and water thoroughly; then put pots in a coldframe or heel-in in the garden for 8 to 10 weeks to force root development. Bring pots indoors, first in a cool location and gradually to the average living room temperature.

## Narcissus or Daffodils

In a general way, daffodil and narcissus mean the same thing; daffodil is the common name and narcissus the botanical name. Common usage among garden makers in this country has applied the term daffodil to the giant trumpet varieties, while the smaller or medium trumpet, as well as the cluster-flowered and poet's types, are referred to as narcissus. Botanically, these smaller or medium trumpet daffodils are the barri, incomparabilis, leedsi, poeticus, poetaz, polyanthus and miniature types. To avoid confusion, we are listing all of these classes as daffodils. Some gardeners apply the name jonquil to the giant trumpet daffodils, but this is misleading, as the true jonquils and campernelles are small-flowered and sweet-scented; showy when massed in beds, borders or naturalized. Their delicious fragrance makes them indispensable for cutting.

As daffodils bloom early, last a long time, and may be had in so many lovely varied forms, they have few equals as garden flowers. They are most desirable for any garden purpose-in masses, in beds or borders, in groups of twelve or more here and there in the hardy perennial border, or in the foreground of shrubbery. For naturalizing in large quantities, no other flower is more suitable. Ideal, easily grown subjects for winter blooming in the house, especially the paper white and soleil d'or narcissus which will be found listed on page 31.

Brief cultural directions for the growing of daffodils indoors and outdoors are given on page 18; full directions are printed on every bag containing the bulbs. Daffodils are easy to grow and require little care.

## HOW TO GROW DAFFODILS

Outdoors: For best results plant bulbs as early in the fall as possible, 4 to 8 in . deep and 6 to 10 in . apart; the exact distances depend on the size of the bulb and the nature of the soil. In very cold locations, after the ground is frozen hard, cover with leaves, straw or coarse litter to a depth of 4 to 6 in
Indoors: Put several bulbs, about 1 in . apart (same variety) in a pot, barely cover the bulbs with soil, water thoroughly and put in coldframe or heel-in in the garden for 8 to 10 weeks to force root development befure bringing indoors for winter blooming. Full cultural directions on bags containing bulbs.

In this group, where the trumpet is greatly reduced in size and cupped, we refer to it as a "cup"; where trumpet is shortened but expanded or broadened, we call it a "crown" and where very small and flattened, an "eye." We offer the very best varieties.

The Medium Trumpet class is divided into three groups-Incomparabilis, Barri and Leedsi. These divisions are based mainly on the relation of the perianth to the trumpet, crown or cup; an explanation is given under each group as to its distinguishing characteristics.

## Delivery of Hardy Garden Lily Bulbs

Hardy Garden Lilies are sent you in the fall just as soon as they are thoroughly cured and in the proper condition for planting. Some varieties will not be ready until November or early December. Plant them in the garden as soon as possible after they are received. If you live in a locality where the soil freezes early, we suggest that you cover the ground with manure, leaves, straw, etc., to prevent it from freezing. When lily bulbs arrive, remove covering and plant them immediately. Do not put the covering back over the bulbs until after the ground has frozen hard. The purpose of the covering is to keep the ground frozen so that alternate freezings and thawings will not injure root growth during the winter. Remove covering in spring.

Crocus will grow in many places-in the lawn, flower borders, rock gardens, edge of shrubs, on the slopes of terraces, in sun or shade, and even under trees. Indoors: Plant 8 to 10 bulbs 1 in . deep, 2 in . apart, in a 6 -in. container using light sandy soil to which bone meal has been added; water well and set in a cool cellar for about 6 weeks so that bulbs will become well rooted. When top growth has begun, bring them to the light. Keep in a cool location and gradually bring to a sunny position where it is not too hot.
