We strongly recommend early ordering as quantities of many will be limited.

1959 INTRODUCTIONS

- BRONZE CACTUS** (Wayside) Huge fully double flowers with sharply pointed petals thus giving the appearance of Cactus Dahlias. Color is a clean unfading Indian bronze with subtle salmon shadings thus producing an iridescent sheen. \$1.00 each
- GLADNESS** (Kraus) One of the first to bloom in September. Dwarf very free flowering plants covered with fully double flowers of clear China rose. Early Sept.
- GOLDEN MOUND** (Lehman) An excellent new cushion. Myriads of 2" double golden yellow flowers on short dark green twiggy branches.
- KATHLEEN LEHMAN** (Kraus) Large double flowers of bright orange gold deepening to red gold at the center. This is perhaps the finest selection from over 100,000 seedlings. Late Sept.
- LAVENDER BELLE** (Reichert) A splendid new addition to the Anemone-flowered garden mum group. Large flowers of a deep rosy lavender with characteristic pin cushion or Anemone centers. \$1.00 each
- LORENZO** (Kraus) Large flowers of a rich flaming dark Dianthus purple. The petals are quilled thus giving the flowers the appearance of Cactus Dahlias. Mid Sept.
- MAHOGANY CUSHION** (Lehman) A new cushion which is far superior to the older sorts. Double flowers of Jasper red shading to Mahogany red. Late Sept.
- MUSQUERADE** (Bristol Nurseries) Trim plants 2' tall are loaded with neat one inch balls of silvery rose with darker centers. A much improved "Jewel". A fine late Sept. cut flower variety.
- PAPER WHITE** (Lehman) Wide petaled three inch blooms of a lovely pure white are produced in profusion on dwarf plants. The best dwarf white mum we know. Early to mid Sept.
- PATRICIA LEHMAN** (Kraus) Large flowers of Geranium pink with peach centers having recurved and twisted petals thus giving a fluffy, feathery appearance. A fine late Sept. cut flower.
- PEARL PARKINSON** (University of Nebraska) Large 3-4" flowers with loosely twisted petals which are tightly whorled in the center. The color is a bright golden yellow with flecks of red during the hot August days while during cool weather the flowers are a brilliant glowing red with occasional reflections of yellow. Flowers are borne on long stems thus providing fine cut flowers from August until killing frosts.
- PONCA** (University of Nebraska) A most unusual variety with large clusters of purplish red flowers resembling pompon Zinnias. Plants are strong growers (28-34" tall) with dark green foliage. An excellent cut flower variety blooming from late August until killing frosts.
- QUILLED CUSHION** (Lehman) A very outstanding new cushion with double cactus-Dahlia-like flowers of oriental red aging to bright bronze. A very interesting type. Late Sept.
- REMEMBRANCE** (Kraus) The finest red mum produced thus far. Large fully double flowers of a deep ruby carmine throughout. Late Sept.
- SINCERITY** (Bristol) A pearly white sport of Lavender Lady similar in all respects to its parent except in color. Large flowers open a faint lavender pink which changes to white with a lovely pearly cast on age. Late Sept. \$1.00 each

NEW LILLIPUTIAN CHRYSANTHEMUMS

A new super-dwarf race growing 12" or less in height without pinching. As they are being distributed this year for the first time, quantities will be very limited. Please order early. 75¢ each.

- BASHFUL - Semi-double bright red blooms on spreading 7" plants.
DOC - Double flowers of clear rose cover flat topped 10" plants.
HAPPY - double two inch flowers completely hide dwarf 10" plants.
Color is a lively golden yellow.
LINNET - Semi-double flowers with pointed petals of "biscuit" colors-changing tints of yellow, buff and light cream.
PHOENIX - A true Anemone-flowered sort with crested yellow centers and short red outer petals which change to rose.

NEW CHRYSANTHEMUM ERUBESCOENS HYBRIDS

A very fine new group of early flowering varieties developed by Perry Plant Farms in England. Quantities will be very limited as this is the first time they have been available here. All are priced at 75¢ each. One each of the four below - \$2.65

- DUCHESS OF EDINBURGH - 2½ ft bush, very free flowering. Single flowers of velvety crimson 3½" in diameter.
JESSIE COOPER - Lovely graceful free flowering plants with single three inch flowers of deep bright chestnut crimson.
NANCY PERRY - Thirty inch bushy plants covered with semi-double three inch flowers of spinel red (a carmine shade)
PAUL BOISSIER - Compact bushy plants with semi-double three inch flowers of Spanish orange overlaid with russet orange.

1949 UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA INTRODUCTIONS

Mr. Glenn Viehmeyer of the North Platte Experiment Station has produced an unusually fine group of new garden mums which were selected for their beauty and exceptional hardiness.

- CODY - A new extra low cushion variety, growing only 10" tall and up to 40" across. The flowers vary in color from white with lavender edges in July to a deep orchid lavender during cool weather. Many reports rate Cody as the finest early flowering cushion mum. 60¢ each
E.H. HOPPERT - This variety is, in our opinion, the finest summer flowering mum existant. Individual flowers measure 3-5" in diameter and are of a new form with long strap-like twisted petals which are perfectly whorled at the center. First blooms in July are a lovely light yellow while later flowers in cool weather take on buff and bronze hues. An excellent variety for cut flowers as new flowering shoots develop continually from July until frosts. 60¢ each
LT. BECKNER - Large flowers with long waved and twisted petals ranging from light buff bronze to an attractive reddish bronze in color. One of the finest September bloomers. 60¢ each
NIOBRARA - A nother new extra low growing early flowering cushion. Perfect twelve inch mounds covered with high centered or crested pure white pompon like flowers. First blooms in Aug. 60¢ each
