

TUBEROUS BEGONIA PRICE LIST. Tubers.

Boliviensis. Tall growing, red flowers, erect plant with a drooping habit. Parent of present hybrids. 50¢ each.

Pearcei. Citron yellow flowers, foliage beautifully marked with green and olive. Used to produced present hybrids. Low. 50¢ each.

Davisii. A compact grower with scarlet flowers. A parent of the "multiflora" type begonia. Low. 50¢ each.

Multiflora "LaFayette". Bronzy foliage with burnt orange double flowers about 3 inches across. 50¢ each.

Santa Barbara. My hybrid between *Davisii* and *micranthera v. fimbriata*. Scarlet-orange flowers. 50¢ each.

Wild Rose. A fragrant hybrid between *Baumannii* and *micranthera v. fimbriata*. Flowers single, pink. 50¢ each.

Micranthera v. fimbriata. Apricot flowers. Plant stands more sun than other tuberous begonias. Many flowers on each stem. 50¢ each.

Micranthera v. venturii. Tall. Orange flowers. 50¢ each.

Micranthera v. foliosa. Tall. White flowers. 50¢ each.

Micranthera v. foliosa X v. fimbriata. Tall with watermelon-pink flowers. 50¢ each.

My. hybrid. Single gold flowers about 4 inches across. 35¢ each.

Palmaris. Tall. White flowers. Plants produce more tubers each year. 25¢ each.

Multiflora Bertinii. Single Chinese red flowers about 3 inches across. 35¢ each.

Sutherlandi "major"! A large leaves form of *Sutherlandi*. 50¢ each.

Narcissiflora type mixed colors only. 35¢ each.

Modern beautiful Hanging Basket hybrids. Mixed colors only. 35¢ each.

I grow tuberous begonias each year from seed and I offer these plants in the Double Camellis, Double Carnation, Double Hanging basket types by separate colors and the Single, Single Frilled, Single Frilles with red border and the Double Picotee in mixed colors only. Price is \$2.00 per dozen plants plus postage. Plants are shipped after May 1st.
