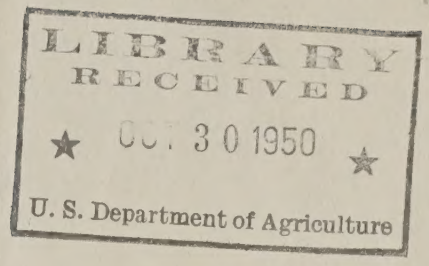

P R I C E L I S T

FIBROUS BEGONIAS

- Multiflora rosea -- medium height, everblooming, rose-colored flowers. \$1.00
- perfectaflora -- to 3 ft, light-green leaves, white flowers. 50¢.
- Zebrina -- medium height, green leaves, veins silver, flowers white. 50¢.
- diclata -- light-green leaves, flowers pink, medium height. 75¢.

HAIRY-LEAVED BEGONIAS

- tomentosa -- leaves covered with short, stiff hairs; flowers white. \$1.00.
- Haageana Seedling -- bushy, white flowers with pink hairs on back. 50¢.
- laetivirides -- African species; soft hair, back of leaves red. \$1.00.
- Brazil species #2366 -- beautiful and new; green, hairy, large leaves. \$1.00.

BASKET, TRAILING, OR CLIMBING BEGONIAS

- Mazae variety "Dark Leaf" -- beautiful satiny leaves with black. Trailer. \$1.50.
- Mazae variety "Stitched Leaf" -- green-leaved trailer with light-silver cast, black notches on the margin. \$1.50.
- epipsila -- New Brazilian basket-plant; leaf, dark green; back, red. 75¢.
- Mexican scandens -- trailer or climber; larger leaf than scandens. \$1.50.
- glaucophylla -- true trailer; back of flowers shiny, reddish. \$1.00.

THICK-STEMMED BEGONIAS -- Winter Blooming

- Carolinaefolia -- upright thick stem, leaf made up of many leaflets. Flowers pink. 50¢.
- Jessie (phyllomaniaca) -- little plantlets on leaves & stems. Flower pink. 50¢.
- Verschaffeltiana -- pink flowers in late winter; deeply-lobed leaves. 75¢.
- Kenworthyi -- NEW; upright; deeply-lobed leaves, slate blue; beautiful. \$1.50.
- Palmifolia -- upright; flowers in fall, white; not common. 50¢.
- incana -- leaves covered with white, short hairs; can stand dry air. 50¢.
- "So-called" Barkeri -- entire plant covered with fine brown hair; fls. pink. 75¢.
- circumlobata -- Chinese plant with deeply-lobed leaves, flowers white. \$1.00.

RHIZOMATOUS BEGONIAS

- gogoensis -- rare, requires moist, warm (60° at night) air; leaves brownish-green, webbed with brown. Seedlings 50¢ each.
- Fred Brown -- lovely dark-brown leaves, underside deep red. \$1.00.
- Feastii -- old-fashioned "Beefsteak" pink-flowered house begonia. 50¢.
- Rubro-venia var. green-leaved. Interesting plant from India. \$1.00.
- Mrs. Townsend -- dark-leaved, moderately-lobed; flowers pink. 50¢.
- Barkeri -- large green leaves, tall flower stem in winter; flowers white. 50¢.
- Immense -- light-green leaves, clusters of pink flowers in winter. 50¢.
- 27.S Variations -- plants grown from seed from Mexico. Any one is lovely. \$1.50.
- Boweri -- bright medium-green leaves, bordered with long hairs, small, black markings running from the margins. \$1.50.
- Ricinifolia -- brownish-green lobed leaves; long flowerstems with large clusters of pink flowers. 50¢.
- Roxburghi -- odd Indian plant with jointed rhizome under soil and upright stems, flowers borne on the stem under the leaves.
- hispidavillosa -- lettuce-green leaves; long hairs all over plant; fls. pink. \$1.50.
- hydrocotylaefolia -- small leaves, pink flowers; a miniature. \$1.00.
- Spiral Feastii -- also called Conchaefolia; leaves have spiralled lobe. 50¢.
- MacDougalli -- compound leaf; white flowers on very tall stem. \$2.00.
- 42.S -- plants grown from Mexican seed; leaves lobed, from green to almost black in color. State color preference. \$1.00.
- "Page 13" -- Mexican plant; leaves, silver overcast, brown markings. \$1.00.
- Imperialis x Dayii -- low grower with green leaves and white flowers. \$1.00.
- Green Skeezer -- leaves green -- otherwise like silvered Skeezer. 75¢.

REX BEGONIA HYBRID SEEDLINGS -- 25¢ each; \$2.50 per dozen.
