## QUESTIONS ON PELLETED SEEDS . . . AND ANSWERS

Q-"What are Pelleted Seeds?"
A-Pelleted Seeds are carefully selected, highest quality seeds surrounded with several coats of stimulants and fungicides.
Q-"What does this 'coating' do?"
A-Briefly, the coating provides an ideal, disease-free condition around the newly planted seed, insuring stronger germination and growth.

Q-"Doesn't a pelleted seed require more water?"
A-If the season is unusually $d r y$ or if the seeds are planted in light, sandy soils, additional water will be required.
Q-"Do pelleted seeds require special planting instructions?"
A-Just follow the simple 'Planting Directions' on the package label. Or, plant the same as you would ordinary single seeds but cover only enough to hold pellets in place. Do not tamp down soil after planting.

Q-"Are all pelleted seeds' 'coats' the same?"
A-No. Different vegetables and flowers need different types and amounts of stimulants and fungicides. The exact coating is determined only after scores of tests.
Q-"What good does the fungicide coating do?"
A-The fungicide kills disease on the seed itself, and also in the immediate soil surrounding the seed.
Q-"Does the 'coat' supply enough fertilizer?"
A-The amount of fertilizers are sufficient to supply food during the early stages of growth. It is not enough to carry the plant through to maturity. The customary use of fertilizers is recommended.
Q-"Do pellets stand the frost better?"
A-Yes. Any seed requires warmth for germination, but the fungicide in the pellet tends to prevent seed rot under cold, wet conditions. After emergence the seedling will not withstand freezing.
Q-"Is it possible to eliminate transplanting?"
A-Yes. The larger individual seed makes it easier for you to space your planting and thus eliminate most transplanting.

Q-"Will pelleted seeds grow most anywhere?"
A-Pelleted Seeds cannot perform miracles. Suitable ground, proper planting, and favorable weather are all necessary for the greatest possible growth.

## VEGETABLE PLANTING CHART

In order to simplify the planning of your garden and so that you may have your seed requirements on hand in good season, we have prepared the following vegetable planting table. The dates given must by necessity be approximate. Weather conditions vary so from year to year that hard and fast rules in regard to times of planting are impossible. Also, these dates are planned for the latitude of Boston and allowances must be made for warmer or colder climates. Our estimates on the number of plants, or the length of row that an ounce or a pound of seed will sow, are moderate. In many cases many more plants will result and if great care is taken in handling, the seed will sow a row longer than that specified. In spite of variations such as are mentioned above we believe that you will find this chart helpful.
