HORSE RADISH

Every garden should have a few plants of Horse Radish. Grown from sets or piece-roots. Set them vertically, small end down, and the large end one to three inches below the surface of the soil. Cultivate until tops cover the ground.

BOHEMIAN GIANT. An improved, mammoth-rooted variety of excellent quality. Piece-roots planted this spring will make good roots by fall. (10 for 65c) (25 for \$1.45) (50 for \$2.50) (100 for \$4.00) (500 for \$15.00) (1000 for \$25.00) prepaid.

ASPARAGUS

A Good Source of Vitamin C. An ounce of seed will produce about 250 plants. 2 lbs. will produce enough roots to set an acre.

A rapid growing sort, yielding thick, long, straight stalks, and when overgrown is perfectly tender. Practically immune to "rust" and other Asparagus diseases. Hardy Perennial Garlic

Hungarian Garlic has the same uses as the Mexican Red Garlic or California White Garlic offered in most grocery stores, but is better suited to the average garden. The bulbs are of high quality and preferred by many to the more common sorts, even though they are a little smaller. The bulbs are perfectly winter-hardy in the North and may be dug from the garden as needed or stored for winter use. Unlike the other varieties they are grown from small sets produced atop the stem, like the Egyptian Multiplier Onions. Each package contains enough sets to plant 12 to 15 ft. of row. (25c per pkt.) 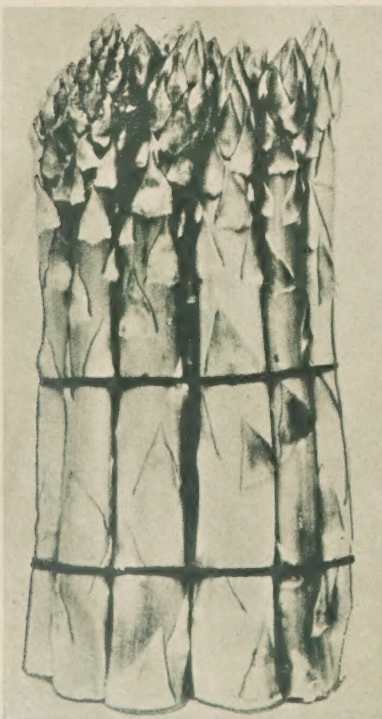
CHIVES (Schnittlauch)

A hardy perennial onion-like plant. Highly esteemed for use as a salad, and for their small leaves which are produced very early in the spring and are used for giving a mild onion flavor to various dishes. Frequent cuttings may be made throughout the season, a new growth of leaves appearing soon after each cutting. A supply may be had all winter by potting a few plants and taking them inside before freezing. (Pkt. 15c) (½ oz. 55c) (oz. \$1.00) prepaid.

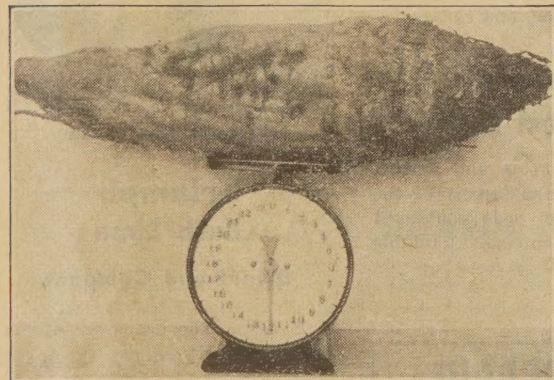

Yields of 25 to 35 tons per acre are common, and as high as 75 to 80 tons have been reported. A healthful and nutritious food greatly relished by all kinds of livestock. Will keep cattle in perfect physical condition and increase the flow of milk. As a feed for poultry, during the winter months, they are very valuable and always increase egg production.

The seed should be sown thinly in rows 2 to 3 feet apart, and when plants are about 3 inches high thin out to stand 8 to 10 inches apart in the row. Harvest before frost and store in pits outdoors or in a dry, frost-proof cellar.

This bean is highly esteemed in Europe. It differs from American types of beans in that it should be planted early. We plant them here in Michigan as soon in the spring as the ground becomes workable, sometimes in March. Plants are hardy and not sensitive to cold.

The beans are as large as the largest Lima Bean, and nearly the same shape. Botanically, it belongs to the bean family, but the flavor is more like that of the pea, which accounts for it sometimes being called the Lima Pea.

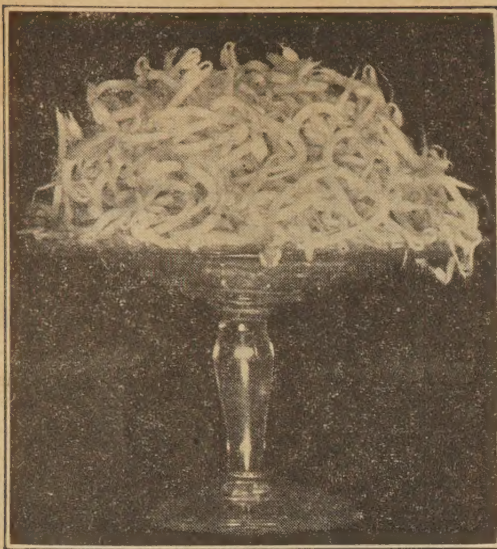
The plant is a bush of upright growth, about 2½ feet high, with strong, sturdy stalks. Pods 7 inches long and 1¼ inches wide, flat and straight. Each holds 5 to 7 mammoth size beans. It is wonderfully productive and is delicious cooked either fresh or as a winter shell bean.

BEANS IMPORTANT IN OUR DIET

Snap beans contain Vitamins A and C, as well as Calcium and Iron.

Lima beans contain Vitamins B₁ and G, as well as Phosphorus and Iron.

Dried Lima and Navy beans are high in Iron, as well as fair amounts of Calcium and Vitamin B₁.

Chinese Salad or Mung Bean

Chinese Bean Sprouts Are an All-the-Year-Around Salad

A delicious bean that is used for bean sprouts and served in chop suey and salads in the finest Oriental Cafes. Chinese Bean Sprouts are an all-the-year-around salad. CHESTNUT OR GARBANZO BEAN

This chestnut-flavored bean is one of the most delicious grown. Grows in bush form to a height of 18" and completely covered with pods. For soup and turkey stuffing it cannot be surpassed. Popular in Spain, where it is known as the "Garbanzo."

40 pounds will plant an acre.

MICHELITE PEA OR NAVY. The most valuable of all field beans. Developed at the Michigan State College Experiment Station. Resists disease, yields heavier, and quality is better. Ripens early and evenly; beans uniform in size and the whitest of all.

POLE OR CLIMBING BEANS

One pint of seed for 100 poles

KENTUCKY WONDER. 65 days. The finest flavored snap bean grown. The silvery-green pods grow 8½" to 9" long and are so fleshy they are often greater in thickness than width. They are solid, meaty and very crisp. They commence bearing exceedingly early for a pole or climbing sort, and if pods are gathered as they mature the vines will continue to bear until killed by the fall frosts.

KENTUCKY WONDER WAX. 68 days. An ideal pole wax bean for all localities. Similar in habit of growth to the green podded Kentucky Wonder. The 8" yellow pods are so fleshy that often the thickness surpasses the width. Of most delicious quality, a heavy yielder and bears a long season.

WHITE-SEEDED KENTUCKY WONDER (Burger's Stringless). 65 days. One of the most desirable of the pole beans. It combines attractive appearance with productiveness, and for quality it is unsurpassed. Straight, round, dark green pods, 7 to 8 inches long, fleshy, entirely stringless, fiberless, and tender. The beans, being white, are also fine for winter use.

YARD LONG BEAN

70 days. An excellent variety, as well as an interesting curiosity. Vines are rampant growers and produce an enormous crop of long, slender, round pods which are of excellent quality for snap beans when young. The round pods have the thickness of a lead pencil and sometimes grow to a length of 3 ft. Very productive, tender and of fine flavor.

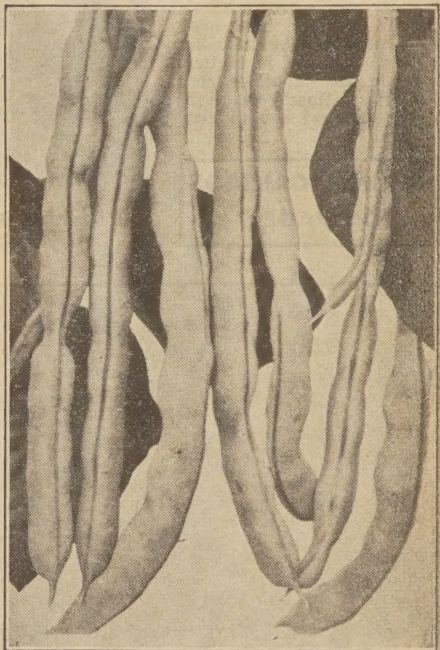
A fine ornamental vine, bearing large sprays of bright scarlet pea-like flowers and an abundance of edible beans. Used both for shell and snap beans.

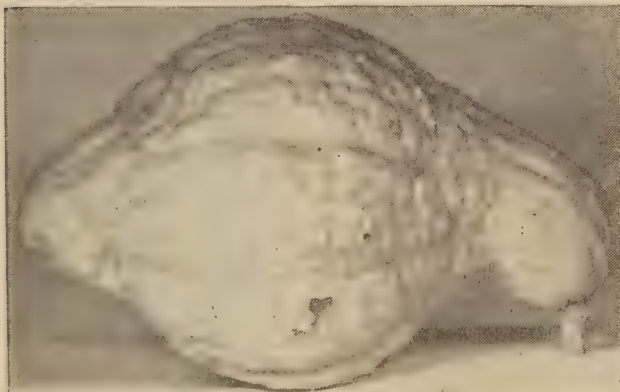
Vegetable Spaghetti

One ounce to 25 hills; 3 to 4 lbs. per acre
Summer Squash provides both Vitamins A and C.

Bush Summer Squash is a popular vegetable and is gaining in popularity as more gardeners are learning when to harvest and how to prepare for the table. They are of easy culture and require only a small space in the garden. If the fruits are kept picked, they will continue to bear all summer. Early White Bush should be picked when only 1½ to 2 inches across and the other varieties should be picked before they reach 7 inches in length for the best eating. They should be boiled whole until tender. After draining, the surplus water should be pressed out of them. Add seasoning to taste, plus a generous portion of butter, and mash. Early Prolific Straightneck is good to larger sizes and is the best variety for slicing and frying.

Cocozelle

Also known as Italian Vegetable Marrow

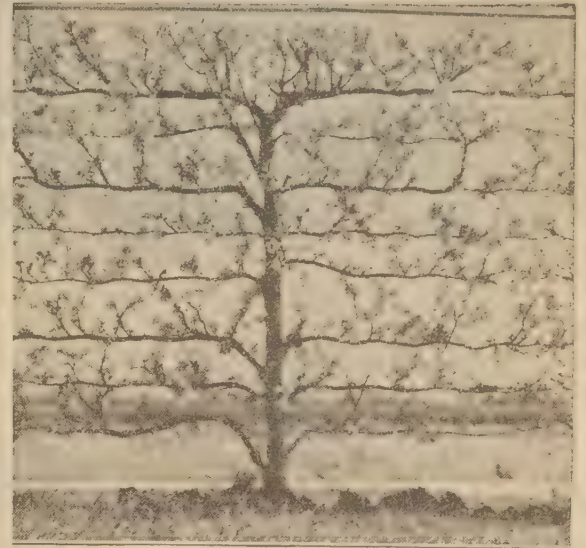

The above photograph illustrates the dried seed pods of the Novelty Bird Plant, or Unicorn Plant, staged to represent birds.

NOVELTY BIRD PLANT

UNICORN PLANT. Although this is not a Gourd, we are listing it here because it is very effective when used in combination with Gourds. 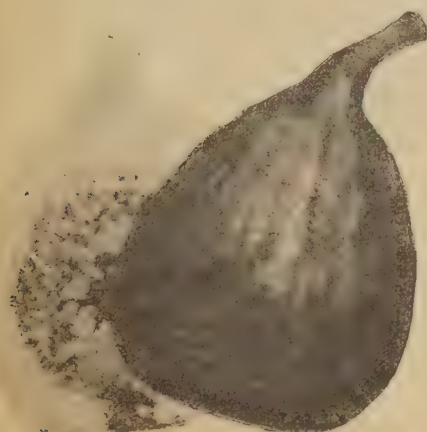

Likes Ants and Bugs



One of the most fascinating plants known to man. It resembles the hooded cobra of the jungles of India, and is one of the few carnivorous plants known to science.

The plant has no leaves, the stalks are twisted and funnel shape, small at the bottom, growing larger with a rounded hood at the top from which hang two crimson and green appendages which have the appearance of feelers or whiskers.

The hood is beautifully colored, and mottled by white translucent areas through which the interior is lighted. Both hood and appendages bear many honey glands, the excretion from which tempts bugs, ants, flies, in fact all kinds of insects toward the mouth, an orifice on the under side of the hood, and are lured inside the funnel-like stem from which they can not come back, as the stem is lined with innumerable little hair-like prongs all pointing downward, and once they get below a few of these points they have to continue on downward where the victim is absorbed in the digestive fluid or liquid in the bottom of the stem.

The Cobra Orchid, or Darlingtonia, is a perennial which will grow year after year out of doors, provided it is given a shady position and never allowed to become dry. Along the banks of a pool is an ideal place. It also may be grown as a house plant, in pots of sandy soil and leaf mould.

If kept in a room free from all insects, it is advisable once or twice weekly to place a few small particles of raw beef, about the size of a grain of wheat, in the orifice for its nourishment; however, if placed where there are other plants, in the average room, a sufficient number of insects will be attracted from them, making artificial feeding unnecessary.

This white Proso was introduced from Siberia several years ago and after many tests has proven to be one of the most dependable and profitable farm crops. It will grow almost anywhere, North, South, East or West, in wet or dry weather, and on all kinds of soil. Proso is unlike any other grain because of its extreme drought resistance, together with the fact that it takes only 60 to 65 days to mature a crop of this variety, and needs only one good rain to produce a crop. It may be planted on high, dry soil that is not suitable for other grains. It is especially valuable as a summer catch crop, something that may be planted on land which has had an early crop removed or ground that has been drowned out and not in shape to work until late in the season.

This is a wonderful crop to plant on your non-productive, rough, hilly, eroded or worn-out land. Often it transforms such fields into the most productive part of the farm. Kudzu is a legume and is easy to grow. It has no serious diseases.

Kudzu is a permanent, rapid-growing, vining legume with an extensive root system and a large leaf area. Although it is adapted to cultivation over an extensive area, it has been chiefly grown in the humid, southeastern states from Virginia to eastern Oklahoma and Texas. It does fairly well in the more arid Southwest under irrigation and its use along the Pacific coast is increasing. Although the roots are hardy everywhere in the United States, winter killing of the tops limits its usefulness in the northern states. North of a line from New York City to Lincoln, Nebraska, we do not recommend planting it as a field crop except experimentally.

Uses of Kudzu

PASTURE. Kudzu should be pastured lightly the second season on good stands but usually is left ungrazed until the third year. Although well established fields will support continuous grazing if pastured lightly, the usual practice is to divide the field into two or more pastures and use them alternately or in rotation. Records kept over a period of 8 years show that steers made an average seasonal gain of 243 pounds on Kudzu, the highest gain recorded being 346 pounds. No case of bloat on Kudzu has ever been reported to us.

HAY. Kudzu makes good hay palatable to all kinds of livestock and can be fed with very little waste. Under adverse conditions or when cutting is delayed, it seldom sheds its leaves to anything like the extent other legumes do. Kudzu should be two years old before being cut for hay and is usually cut first in June and again just before frost. It also makes good silage. When moistened, Kudzu hay resembles fresh foliage, which makes it an excellent green ration for winter feeding to poultry, rabbits, hamsters, etc. Dairymen have reported cows fed on Kudzu produce more milk than from any other one feed.

PLANTING KUDZU. Except in California, where we can send only seeds, we recommend starting your Kudzu plantation with our inexpensive plants. It is a little difficult to raise plants from seed and the preparation of the seed-bed takes time. However, we offer seed for those who want to raise 1-year-old plants to set out. As Kudzu should be cultivated the first season, it is usually interplanted with corn. Setting the plants 5 feet apart each way requires 1750 plants per acre and setting them 10 feet apart requires 450 plants. It is cheaper to plant than alfalfa.

Complete directions for planting Kudzu are sent with each shipment of Kudzu. They also cover the details of harvesting it and tell how to eradicate the crop readily if it is desired to use the improved land for some other crop.
