- 220 V. Sanderiana x V. Sanderiana
V. Sanderiana (specie) is a large, heavy textured, two-toned flower of very good conformation. The upper half of the flower is blush pink with the lower half reticulated and straited with various shades of brown. Two fine V. Sanderianas averaging 3-7/8" x 4 1/2" were used, producing as the result of this cross, many superior V. Sanderianas.
- 286 V. Merrillii x V. Sanderiana = V. MARY FOSTER
V. Merrillii is a specie with small deep red brown flowers. See 220 for V. Sanderianas. V. Mary Foster is a golden brown hybrid with profuse spottings and markings of red-brown.
- 140 V. Sanderiana x V. Mem. T. Iwasaki
V. Mem. T. Iwasaki (V. Dearei x V. Tricolor) is a medium sized yellow, spotted with red brown. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. Blooms of this cross will be yellow to greenish yellow with brown markings and spottings.
- 159 V. Sanderiana x V. Amcena
V. Amcena (V. Roxburghii x V. Coerulea) is blue, marked with linings of deeper blue. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. Expect good sized blues.
- 343 V. Sanderiana x V. Ohuchu
V. Ohuchu (V. Clara S. Fisher x V. Sanderiana.) The V. Ohuchu used was similar to V. Sanderiana in coloration but of a better shape. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. V. Sanderiana like flowers are expected but there should be some interesting variations, too.
- 379 V. Sanderiana x V. Honolulu
The V. Honolulu (V. Frank Scudder x V. Sanderiana) used was a very large, flat, dark strawberry colored bloom, with darker spottings and reticulations. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. Expect large, deep rose-pinks.
- 382 V. Sanderiana x V. Joan Swearingen
The V. Joan Swearingen (V. Luzonica x V. Rothschildiana) used was a deep pink, with strawberry red spottings and flushings. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. Results should be a good sized dark rose-pink with darker spottings and markings, but there should be a few blue segregants.
- 600 V. Sanderiana x V. Rothschildiana = V. ONOMEA
V. Rothschildiana (V. Sanderiana x V. Coerulea) is a very large, flat, deep blue with darker reticulations. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. Result to be from blues, pinks, to peach. One of the best of the newer hybrids.
- 609 V. Sanderiana x V. Pihouna
The V. Pihouna (V. Clara S. Fisher x V. Coerulea) used was a large, blue with darker reticulations. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. Results should be a fine large, flat blue with some pink segregants.
- 358 V. Sanderiana x V. Ellen Noa
V. Ellen Noa (V. Dearei x V. Sanderiana) is a large, cream-buff flower spotted with red brown. This cross should produce excellent cream, buff-to-pink tinged flowers, large, flat and of good conformation.
- 632 V. Sanderiana x V. Hookeriana = V. PRINCESS ELIZABETH
V. Hookeriana (specie) is a terete vanda, pink with strawberry spottings and a large spade lip of deep red. The resultant semi-terete V. Princess Elizabeth is large, pink with a bright pink-red lip. See 220 for V. Sanderiana.
- 455 V. Luzonica x V. Sanderiana = V. MANILA
V. Luzonica (specie) is white with red spottings and flushings. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. V. Manila is a fine, large, flat, pink spotted and reticulated with red. Prolific and floriferous.

- 363 V. Walter F. Dillingham x V. Sanderiana
The V. Walter F. Dillingham (V. Emily Notley x V. Rothschildiana) used was light cream pink with darker pink spottings and tessellations. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. Color range should be like that of the rainbow. Pinks predominating.
- 175 V. Sanderiana x V. Dearei = V. ELLEN NOA
V. Dearei (specie) is an even colored buff of good size. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. V. Ellen Noa is cream-buff, spotted with red brown. Lip yellow, tinged with green, a very large bloom.
- 408 V. Sumatrana x V. Sanderiana = V. HENRIETTA HO
V. Sumatrana (specie) is an even, waxy, dark olive brown flower with traces of yellow. Heavy textured and fragrant. See 220 for V. Sanderiana. V. Henrietta Ho is large, heavy textured, yellow background spotted and reticulated with various shadings of brown. Prolific.
- 503 - V. Manila x V. Gilbert Triboulet
See 455 for V. Manila. V. Gilbert Triboulet (V. Tricolor x V. Coerulea) is blue as the ocean with darker spottings and markings. Both parent plants are prolific and floriferous. Flowers should be pinks and blue-pinks.
- 508 V. Manila x V. Burgeffii
See 455 for V. Manila. V. Burgeffii (V. Suavis x V. Sanderiana) is two-toned with the upper half rose pink with red-brown spottings. The lower half is reticulated and striated with dark brown. Resulting blooms should be deep pink with darker spots and reticulations.
- 184 V. Suavis x V. Manila
See 455 for V. Manila. V. Suavis (specie) is white with maroon red spottings and splashings. Prolific, prolific and floriferous. Rose pinks to deep strawberry should be the predominating colors.
- 350 V. Henrietta Ho x V. Manila
See 455 and 408. Results should be similar to V. Manila with heavier red-brown markings.
- 375 V. Trimerrill x V. Manila
See 455 for V. Manila. V. Trimerrill (V. Tricolor x V. Merrillii) is rust-brown with traces of buff. Flowers should shade from brown to deep pinks.
- 504 V. Boschii x V. Manila
See 455 for V. Manila. V. Boschii (V. Tricolor x V. Luzonica) is white with strawberry spottings and splashings. Lip dark Pink. A fine pink should result.
- 378 V. Suavis x V. Chuchu
See 184 and 343. A two-toned deep rose pink and brown with red-brown spottings and markings should be the result.
- 345 V. Ellen Noa x V. Mary Foster
See 175 and 286. A very fine yellow to golden brown is expected, with darker spottings and reticulations.
- 506 V. Ellen Noa x V. Herziana
See 175 for Ellen Noa. V. Herziana (V. Suavis x V. Coerulea) is blue with darker striations and reticulations. Results should be varied from buff-green to deep blue.
- 344 V. Suavis x V. Ellen Noa
See 184 and 175. Resulting bloom should be predominantly buff with chocolate spottings and markings.
- 346 V. Trimerrill x V. Ellen Noa
See 375 and 175. Blooms from buff to light brown with red-brown spottings and splashings are expected.
- 360 V. Henrietta Ho x V. Ellen Noa
See 408 and 175. This should result in yellow-brown to red-brown flowers of very good form and texture. This should be one of the better new hybrids.

- 376 V. Mem. G. Tanaka x V. Ellen Nca
See 175 for V. Ellen Nca. V. Mem. G. Tanaka (V. Mem. T. Iwasaki x V. Dearei) is yellow-brown with dark brown spotting and markings. Flowers should be large and flat with colors ranging from buff to light brown with spottings of darker red-brown.
- 361 V. Suavis x V. Mary Foster
See 184 and 286. A good reddish-brown flower with darker spottings and splashings is expected.
- 349 V. Mem. G. Tanaka x V. Mary Foster
See 376 and 286. Buff to red-brown flowers with red-brown spottings and markings should result.
- 116 V. Puna x V. Merrillii
See 286 for V. Merrillii. V. Puna (V. Tatzeri x V. Luzonica) is white with red splashings at tips of appendages. Flowers ranging from deep pink to red-brown are expected.
- 354 V. Boschii x V. Rothschildiana
See 504 and 600. Flowers should range from deep rose pinks to pink blues.
- 336 V. Mem. G. Tanaka x V. Rothschildiana
See 376 and 600. Medium sized flowers ranging from cream-pink to deep blues.
- 370 V. Henrietta Ho x V. Ohuchu
See 408 and 343. Large flat peach to greenish brown flowers are expected. Should be very nice.
- 599 V. Luzonica x V. Ohuchu
See 343 for V. Ohuchu. V. Luzonica (specie) is white with splashings of deep strawberry red at tips of appendages. The results should be similar to V. Manila, a very deep pink, almost a strawberry shade, with darker spottings and markings.
- 383 V. Ohuchu x V. Rothschildiana
See 600 and 343. Expectations are for flowers similar to V. Onmea - large, flat, excellent form, color range from peach, rose pink to blues.
- 509 Renanthera Storiei x Self
Renanthera Storiei is a vandaceous specie bearing many small blood-red blossoms in a cascading spray. Very showy.
- 399 V. Ellen Nca x Renanthera Storiei
See 175 and 509. Resulting blooms should be bright orange red. A very attractive hybrid.
- 601 V. Piihoua x Renanthera Storiei
See 609 and 509. Good sized flowers of deep violet red to blood reds should result.
- 364 V. Gilbert Triboulet x Renanthera Storiei
See 503 and 509. Medium sized flowers of deep red should result.
- 321 Renanthera Storiei x Vandopsis Lissochiloides = RENANOPSIS LENA ROWOLD
See 509 for Ren. Storiei. Vandopsis lissochiloides is a vandaceous specie bearing numerous yellow-green flowers heavily spotted with maroon. Back of appendages deep lavender. Very heavy textured. Renanopsis Lena Rowold is a medium sized blood-red flower borne on a long spray and very showy.
- 469 V. Flammerolle x V. Ohuchu
See 343 for V. Ohuchu. V. Flammerolle (V. Luzonica x C. Coerulea) is an even colored sky-blue with darker reticulations and striations. Blooms of this cross should be predominantly pink and of good size and conformation.
- 470 V. Flammerolle x V. Sanderiana
See 469 and 220. Results should be similar to 469, with blue segregants.
- 471 V. Manila x V. Rothschildiana
See 455 and 600. Flowers should result in a very fine, well shaped, large, very deep strawberry, to blue pinks with dark violet reticulations and markings.

- 355 V. Suavis x V. Sanderiana = V. BURGEFFII
See 375 and 220 and 508. A very good commercial cross.
- 356 V. Trimmerill x V. Sanderiana
See 375 and 220. Flowers should be similar to V. Mary Foster, see 286.
- 335 V. Henrietta Ho x V. Sanderiana
See 408 and 220. Results should be cream to buff to a greenish yellow blooms with spottings and markings of red brown.
- 524 V. Henrietta Ho x V. Ohuchu
See 408 and 343. Results should be similar to 335 with very interesting variations.
- 630 V. Jean Swearingen x V. Henrietta Ho
The V. Jean Swearingen used was a large flat blue. The V. Henrietta Ho had a buff background with spottings and reticulations of henna. Results should show many different colors from buff to buff-green with perhaps some pink segregants.
- 649 V. Ellen Nca x V. Caroline J. Robinson
See 175 for V. Ellen Nca. V. Caroline J. Robinson is a small purplish-brown flower spotted with deep grey-green. Fragrant and prolific. Results should be cream to brown flowers with a suggestion of lavender and green. A very interesting hybrid. Very heavy textured.
- 365 V. Suavis x V. Honolulu
See 185 and 379. A good sized deep pink and variations should result.
- 629 V. Piihonua x V. Rothschildiana
See 609 and 600. A very large dark blue is expected. Similar to V. Rothschildiana. Should be a very fine cross.
- 452 V. Gilbert Triboulet x V. Sanderiana = V. Carole Hirano
See 503 and 220. Flowers are pink with darker reticulations.
- 271 V. Manila x V. Sanderiana = V. BILL SUTTON
See 455 and 220. Flowers are dark pink and take more of the Sanderiana characteristics in all respects.
- 605 V. Clara S. Fisher x V. Rothschildiana = V. FAIR QUEEN
See 600 for V. Rothschildiana. V. Clara S. Fisher (V. Tatzteri x V. Sanderiana) is variable in color from pink, buff to green. Crossed with the blue V. Rothschildiana the flowers have been a very dark strawberry to pink background with dark blue reticulations.
- 357 V. Boschi x V. Rothschildiana
See 504 and 600. Flowers should range from pink to blue with strawberry spots and dark blue reticulations. Should prove interesting.
- 700 V. Sanderiana x V. Trisher
The V. Trisher (V. Clara S. Fisher x V. Tricolor) used was a deep maroon with trace of pinkish markings. Thick textured and extremely showy. For Sanderiana, see 220. Results should be strawberry to deepest red-browns
- 304 V. Colorful x V. Sanderiana
See 220 for Sanderiana. V. Colorful (V. Insignis x V. Miss Joaquim) is a semi-terete, with salmon pink to deep red flowers. Expect good sized deep pink to red flowers of heavy texture.
