Dear Glad Friend:
We are pleased to offer you our 1951 Descriptive Wholesale List for your consideration.

We have listed here many of the leading cut flower and show glads as well as a good selection of the recent introductions.

Included in this list are four of our own seedlings. Golden Crown, our 1950 introduction, has been well received. It rated in the N. A. G. C. Symposium as one of the ten best 1950 introductions.

We feel that our 1951 introductions have a promising future as commercials as they all have fine clean colors and are easy growers.

In our descriptions the number following the name of the variety is the N.A.G.C. class number. This is followed by the name of the Originator or Introducer and the year of introduction. The last number is the approximate number of days to bloom from large bulbs. Verly early planting or smaller sizes of bulbs will require additional time.

We were pleased to see Golden Crown, our 1950 introduction, repeat its excellent performance for us and other growers. We were further gratified to learn that Golden Crown had rated as one of the top ten 1950 introductions in the N. A. G. C. Symposium.
Golden Crown is a consistent producer of good commercial spikes. It opens 6 blooms 5 in . in diameter on a spike of 20 buds, has a flowerhead of 24 in . and a field height of 55 ".
It blooms in early midseason.
Its color is all that could be desired, being a pure medium deep yellow, a shade of yellow that blends well with other colors.
Golden Crown should be a favorite with florists as this particular shade of yellow is the most popular in other cut flowers such as Marigolds, Mums' Snapdragons, etc.
