WYOMING SALES TAX

The Wyoming Selective Sales Tax Law exempts feeds only "for use in feeding livestock or poultry for marketing purposes." It also exempts "all sales of seeds, roots, bulbs, small plants and fertilizer planted or applied to land, the products from which are to be sold."

Feed, seed, etc., other than for the above purposes is therefore taxable, as are all supplies, garden tools and miscellaneous articles which we handle. Wyoming customers will please add 2% to the amount of their orders for such items to cover this tax. Mail orders to be shipped outside of the state are not subject to Wyoming Sales Tax.



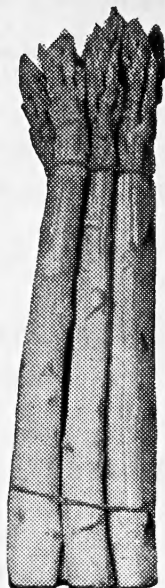

HINTS FOR SUCCESSFUL FLOWER GROWING

First: Prepare your seed bed well. The soil does not want to be worked when it is too wet or too dry, otherwise it will be too cloddy for fine flower seeds. Have the fertilizer thoroughly mixed into the top soil.

Second: Do not plant tender flowers too early. They will not thrive until the soil is quite warm anyway, and if planted early may germinate and then kill out if a cold spell sets in. Do not plant fine flower seeds too deep.

Third: Water carefully, so as not to wash the soil when seeds are planted, or after they are sprouted.

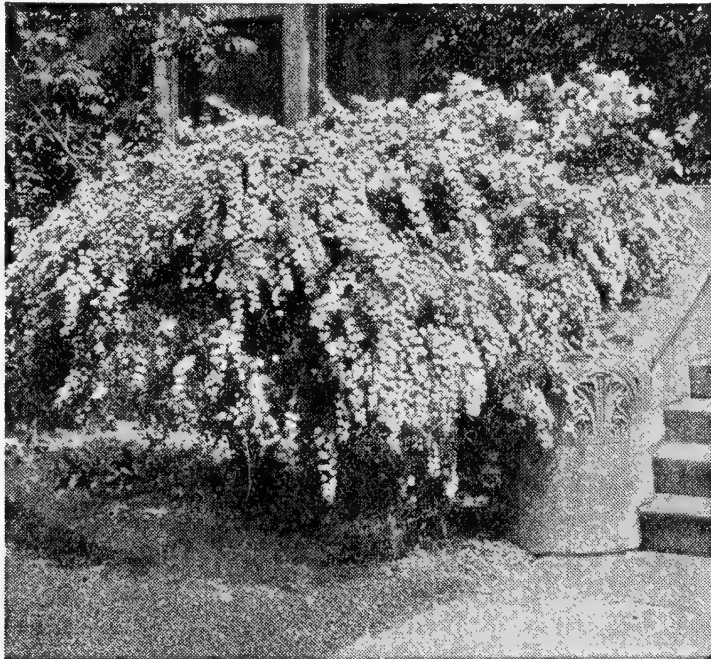

CARE OF ROSES

Whole books are written about the care of roses, so we can't give a complete course of instructions here. These few suggestions may be helpful.

1. When planting dig the hole deeper than the roots require, and if the soil is heavy put some coarse gravel in the bottom so your plant will get drainage; then mix the soil with some well rotted compost or manure.

2. Roses are heavy feeders, and need plenty of plant food to produce at their best. Fertilize often, but little at a time, using a good commercial fertilizer. The use of well rotted compost, cow manure or peat moss not only provides plant food but also a mulch so the ground will keep cool and moist even in hot dry weather.

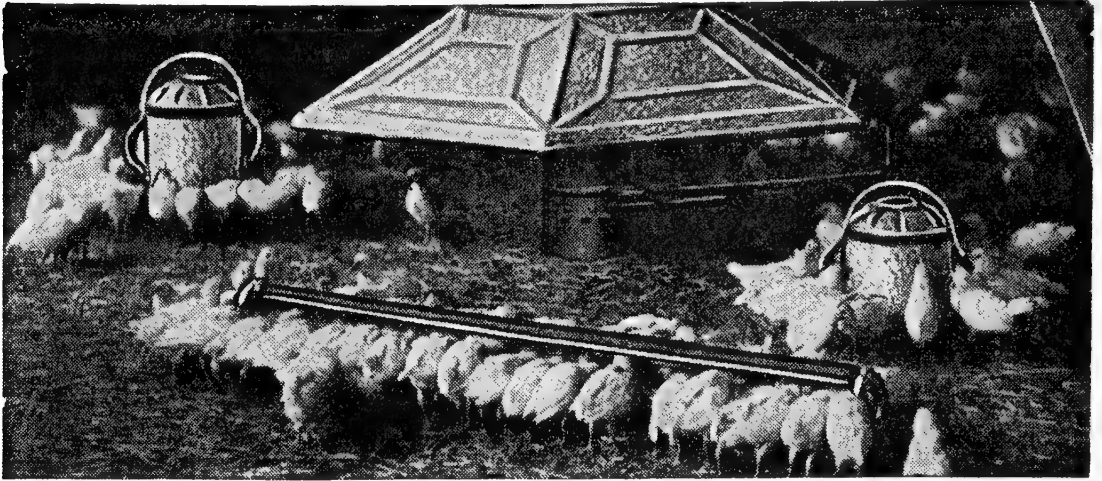
