We carry Fish Food, Fertilizer and Waterlily Containers made to order. For customers who are able to visit the nursery we plant the Lilies in containers for a nominal charge, and all you have to do is place them in your pool.

## SUGGESTIONS FOR THE CARE OF YOUR LILIES . . .

Hardy Lilies may be planted any time from the lst of April until the middle of August.

Tropical Lilies may be planted when the temperature averages seventy degrees or about May 25th.

Waterlilies come into flower early in the season and bloom until frost.

Concrete pools are best left full of water and covered with boards and straw. Hardy Waterlilies will winter in the pool if the water does not freeze deeply, but Tropical Lilies are best considered as annuals and purchased new each year. Hardy Lilies growing in boxes may be taken into a cool basement until Spring. Care to be taken not to allow them to dry out.

Running water is neither necessary nor desirable and may retard the development of Waterlilies by keeping the temperature too low.

New concrete pools should be filled with water and drained at least four (4) times before any fish or plants are introduced.

Planting instructions are attached to every Waterlily tuber shipped.

## SHIPPING TERMS

Water plants may be shipped safely at any time. Shipments will be made at as early a date as experience has shown us is advisable for your particular locality, unless otherwise instructed. Orders will not be delayed.

Tropical Lilies are shipped from May 25th on.
Aquarium Plants, when ordered alone, are shipped at once.

We will ship parcel post but if Customer desires shipment by Express-we will ship express charges collect. Items other than Waterplants will be shipped by Express.

Terms: Orders are accepted only when accompanied by funds sufficient to cover price of goods.

We pay the Postage on all Retail Orders over $\$ 2.00$, within the United States; otherwise add 25 c for postage.

## Hardy <br> Water Silies

Hardy Lilies are unexcelled for planting in natural ponds, lakes or in still pools along a river or streambank, and will beautify the most unattractive bit of water provided they are not planted in too deep water or near a cold inlet. Once established so that the crowns will not be injured by freezing or ice, they become a source of permanent beauty. They may be grown in the smallest of pools and in tubs.

The flowers embrace all the colors from purest white, delicate shell-pink, deep rose pink to rich reds, yellows and combinations of red and yellow. There is however, no blue Hardy Lily. This color is in tropical varieties only.
