We have only around 100 clumps surplus for each variety, so get your order in right away for the varieties that you are interested in.

CINNAMON. Cinnamon bronze full flowers with pointed petals. Sept.
CRESSINGTON. Large unique coloring. Shades of pink, mauve and gold. Sept.
CROCUS. Orange bronze. Strong grower. Large blooms. Sept., Oct.
CARNIVAL. A very bright scarlet red. Very brightest colored variety. Sept.
CORAL QUEEN. Lovely large salmon coral. Good in sprays, also disbudded. Sept.
CRIMSON SPLENDOR. Rich velvety crimson. Very showy, nice size flowers. Sept.

CORALIE. Very unusual rosy buff incurve touched with gold in center. Late Oct.
CAREFREE. Chestnut bronze. Large flowers. Long stems, perfect habits. Sept.
DAFFODIL. Very fine large daffodil yellow flowers. Fine for disbudding.
DOROTHY SPEAT. Superb blooms, large and nicely reflexed. Delicate pink, gold center.
DAILY EXPRESS. A grand large flower of terra cotta chestnut. Good disbudded. Sept.
EMPEROR. A fine deep golden bronze, incurved, strong grower. Sept., Oct.
EDALE. Beautiful salmon pink, stiff pointed florlets. Blooms large and full.
EDENSOR. Fine large creamy white flowers. Sept.
FLAMING BEAUTY. Bright crimson with gold reverse. Long stems and reflexing flowers.
FLORA MEAD. A fine large new white variety. Sept., Oct.
FORTUNE. A white of excellent quality. Long stems, incurving petals. Aug., Sept.
GOLD CHARM. Very fine large new golden yellow. Sept., Oct.
GOLD FINDER. A fine large golden yellow. Sept.
IVORY. A good solid incurve white for disbudding. Sept.
ILLUMINOUS. Deep purple incurve, silvery lilac reverse. Strikingly different. Sept.
JOHN WEARING. Burnt orange solid flowers, medium size. Gold center and reverse petals.
JEAN PICKERING. Bright pink. Good stems and foliage. Oct.
LITCHFIELD PEACH. Clear almond blossom pink. Nice for cutting. Aug., Sept.
LORNA. Large rounded blooms, soft shade of silvery pink. Large disbudded. Sept.
LAERETES. Slightly incurved deep wine red. Reverse silvery cast. Late Sept., Oct.
MINSTREL. Intense crimson-maroon, early and very good. Disbuds nicely. Aug., Sept.
MAYFORD PISK. Lovely bright rose pink, gold reverse, touch of gold in center. Sept.
MILLERSDALE. With us it blooms a delicate lavender pink, turns to purest white.
MAVOUREEN. Lovely lilac pink flowers, 6 inches across when disbudded. Sept.
PHOENIX. Early spray variety of intense bronze red. Sept.
PHOEBUS. Rich golden yellow. Full reflexed bloom, rolled petals. Vigorous. Sept.
PRIMROSE EMPIRE. Beautiful stiff stemmed soft primrose yellow, incurved. Sept., Oct.
PURPLE QUEEN. Large rich purple of good growth. Aug., Sept.
PRIMROSE BARBARA. Very fine primrose yellow, sport of Barbara. Sept.
PEACH UNA. Peach. Firm good sized, slightly incurved. Disbud or spray. Sept.
ROYAL PRINCE. Medium sized reddish purple. Good stems and foliage. Sept.
ROSEMARY. Large rose and salmon reflexing blooms. A very nice variety. Sept.
RADIO. Incurved orange-yellow, shading to buff. Nice large flowers. Sept.
RED KING. A fine bright red early blooming variety. Early Sept.
SEA GULL. Fine large white solid flower, nice for disbudding. Sept.
SUCCESS. Incurved yellow, robust plant and good sized flowers. Sept.
SALMON UNA. Salmon. Slightly incurved. Good disbud or spray. Sept.
SERENUS. Great variety, extra large white. Vigorous grower. Best disbudded. Sept.
TEMPEST. Bright crimson with gold reverse. Large full reflex flower. Sept.
TAURUS. Good sized yellow flower splashed orange. Good disbudded. Sept.
VICTORIA. Large creamy white with wide firm petals, fine quality and shape. Sept.
WINIFRED. Warm salmon, large reflexed flower. Lovely cut flower. Sept.
WESTBORNE. Darkest wine red. Fine later variety. Oct.
WHITE BALL. White incurve of perfect ball shape. Could disbud. Sept.
WHITE SPLENDOR. Extra early large pure white. Sept., Oct.
YELLOW GLOBE. Fine globe-shaped deep golden yellow. Sept.
