

Chrysanthemums have become the most popular plant for fall color display, and a nice selection of them will beautify your nursery and bring you customers. Gardeners are always on the lookout for color for their home gardens, and a collection each of Siberian iris, hemerocallis, and phlox, along with the mums, will give color all through the summer season. And the steel-blue globes of echinops Taplow Blue will give something different in a summer cut flower.

We have a number of fine additions to our list of mums this year. Our field divisions are from plants which are carefully rogued throughout the bloom season for any which are not true to name or up to standard in appearance. Anything showing any symptoms of stunt is immediately destroyed and we strive to send out healthy, true-to-name divisions, also to rectify so far as possible any errors.

Prices are for strong, outdoor grown rooted divisions. All stock offered subject to prior sale and crop conditions. Shipping will start as soon as weather permits. Orders will be shipped in rotation, as near as possible to the time wanted.

Terms: Cash, or 50% cash, balance C.O.D. Minimum order \$3.00. No charge for packing. Plants shipped by express collect. Small orders can be shipped by parcel post if postage is included; any amount in excess will be refunded.

The first letter after the name denotes the type of flower: D, double; SD, semi-double; S, single. The second letter pertains to approximate bloom season; E, before Oct. 1; M, Oct. 1 to Oct. 15; L, Oct. 15 on; VE, early Sept. or late August. You may order 25 of one variety at the 100 rate.

ECHINOPS TAPLOW BLUE

This is an outstanding globe thistle. The globes are larger and of a blue much deeper in color than the ordinary echinops ritro. It blooms on stalks about 3½ feet tall in July, and if the stalks are cut back when through blooming, it will bloom again in September on shorter stems than the previous bloom. It is very effective in the garden and makes a long-lasting cut flower.
