It's easy with our strong roots. Plant after danger of frost. Disbud side blooms for bigger flowers. Pinching top growth makes bushier plants. Dig after frost and store in sand or sawdust in dry place. Divide and plant with only one eye for each plant for best results.

HARDY MUMS

Now we can have a riot of color in late summer and fall when other flowers are gone. These garden mums are very hardy, even after hard frosts the buds will open every day with a lot more flowers. We send strong, well rooted plants in May, Plant with a little water in a hole as you do tomatoes. They can be grown in garden and easily moved when ready to bloom to a better place or potted they make a nice plant to take in the house or give away and will bloom inside for a long time. Cover the plants in fall with dirt, mound up so water will not stand or they may be taken into a cold frame or kept in the basement. Divide in spring for best results. Pinching out the tops makes bushier plants and keep them low growing.

LOOK OUT FOR THRIP

Many ask why their glads do not bloom, in most cases the reason is a small insect, thousands of them that suck the life out of the bloom. Spraying or dusting with DDT every week after the leaves are 10 or 12 inches high will control them. Dipping the bulbs in a solution of 3 teaspoonsbuf of Lysol to a gallon of water will kill thrip before planting. Soak 6 or 8 hours and plant at once. Spray early, when you notice thrip damage it's too late to save the bloom.
