HYDRANGEA A. G. (*H. Arborescens grandiflora*) This is the popular early-blooming Hydrangea sometimes called Snowhill Hydrangea. It has enormous, round, white flower heads like big snowballs, hence the common name.

When in full bloom a nursery block of them looks like a field covered with snow, but you should know that there are some on the market with flowers so small the plants are practically worthless. When you buy WILLIS Hydrangea A. G., you can be sure that every shrub will produce big, showy flowers.

You can use Hydrangea A. G. in foundation plantings, border plantings and as specimens. They will do well in shady spots, especially in the warmer parts of the country. Ornamental even when not in bloom.

HYDRANGEA PEEGEE (*H. Paniculata grandiflora*) Ours is the genuine Meehan strain, the one with the largest flowers of all. Huge, cone-shaped flower heads, pure white at first, later turning to pink, then bronze. Heads a foot long are common and many are much larger. This is one of the showiest of all hardy shrubs. It blooms later than Hydrangea A. G. Plant both to insure a long succession of bloom.

Be sure your customers have a chance to enjoy these aristocrats in their gardens. Our Hydrangeas have wonderful, fibrous roots and bushy tops well over the A. A. N. standards.
