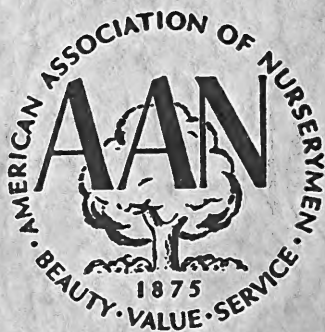
Terms:
