TUBEROUS BEGONIAS

This is one of the most beautiful flowers grown, the bulbs come from Belgium, and are top size. We start these bulbs in February. They are rooted in flats of peat moss, which takes 4 to 6 weeks, then they are potted in special paper pots, then the top growth is started, they are ready for outside planting about May 1. They can be grown in the house as pot plants much earlier. They come in Crimson, Scarlet, Yellow, Pink, White and Copper. Each in 5 in. pot.

REGAL LILY—Snow white, with golden throat, tinged pink on the outside. Established plants have 15 to 25 blooms to each stem. America's popular lily.
