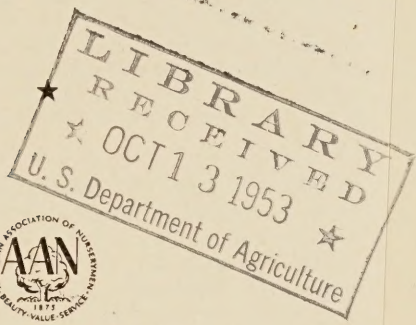

Camellias at Chinquapin Farm

Although we have in our collection some 400 varieties of *Camellia japonica*, this list contains 85 outstanding varieties which we are offering this season in one year grafts. We have in our stock also the usual "Standard" varieties for sale at the farm and a number of the more recent introductions in quantities too few to list. In addition we can supply some of the varieties listed here in larger plants and invite inquiry.

TERMS—Our prices are cash with order, no discounts. Crating for shipment without charge. No C.O.D. Shipments. Unless otherwise directed we will make all shipments via Railway Express collect; our responsibility ceases when shipment is turned over to carrier.

GUARANTEE—All of our plants are guaranteed to be true to name, well rooted and free from disease when they leave our farm. Since we have no control over growing conditions after the plants leave us, we cannot guarantee them to live. That depends upon the knowledge and skill of the purchaser.

VARIATION IN BLOSSOMS—From time to time, particularly in grafting, the amount of variegation will differ from plant to plant and even on the same plant. We have grafted a solid color scion and the result be variegated, in which case the resulting plant is usually better than the parent. With this in mind we do not guarantee amount of variegation in any varieties.

CLAIMS—All claims for error must be made within ten days after receipt of plants. We are more than glad to correct any mistakes should they occur, but in no instance will our liability be more than the original purchase price.

CHINQUAPIN FARM is located one mile East of Ocean Springs, Mississippi, on Highway 90, between New Orleans and Mobile.

About Container Grown Camellias

We positively do not grow Camellias in tin cans. All of the plants listed herein are guaranteed to be field grown, grafted on 6 to 8 year understock, some on Sasanqua and some on Sarah Frost. All are dug directly from the field with generous ball and burlaped. There are no "root bound" plants as from tin cans.

ADOLPH AUDUSSON—Dark Red spotted white. Very large semi-double. Compact, sturdy growth. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24".

ADOLPH AUDUSSON SPECIAL—Predominantly white, speckled form of Adolph Audusson. One of the finest varieties. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24".

ARAJISHI (ALOHA)—Dark salmon rose, large full peonyform. Vigorous upright, open growth. Very early. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24".

ASPACIA (Emperor of Russia variegated)—Deep crimson, spotted white. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24".

BIG BEAUTY—White blotched and dashed pink. Large semi-double to semi-peonyform. Vigorous upright growth. \$6.00, 12-18".

CLAUDIA PHELPS—Sport of Duchess of Sutherland. Pink with white border. \$7.50, 12-18".

CLOWER WHITE—Large loose white peonyform. Open growth. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24".

CRUSADER—Deep red, very large semi-double peonyform to rose form double. Vigorous, compact growth. \$6.00, 12-18".

DAIKAGURA (Kiyosu)—Bright rose pink spotted white, large peonyform. Slow compact growth. Very early bloomer. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24".

BUC DE BRETAGNE—Sport of Countess of Orkney. Deep pink mottled white. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24".

DUCHESS OF SUTHERLAND PINK—Pink sport of Duchess of Sutherland. \$6.00, 12-18".

ELEANOR OF FAIROAK (Vedrine Var.)—Deep ruby red, marbled white. Large semi-double to loose peonyform. \$6.00, 12-18".

ELEANOR McCRADY—Very large loose semi-double, bright pink. Vigorous upright growth. \$6.00, 12-18".

ELIZABETH LeBEY (Patent Pending)—Rose pink. Large hemispherical peonyform. Vigorous, pendulous growth. Introduced by us for the first time this season. EMMETT PFINGSTL—Variegated form of the exceptional Joseph Pfingstl. Red and White. Very large irregular semi-double. Very sturdy growth. \$6.00, 12-18"; and \$7.50, 18-24". A few 2 year grafts, with buds, \$10.00.

ETIENNE DE BORE—Pink blotched white. Large semi-double. Slow busy growth. \$6.00, 12-18".

EUGENE LIZE (Lady Jane Grey)—Light rose pink marbled and splotched white. Medium large semi-double to peonyform. Slow compact growth. \$6.00, 12-18".

FIMBRIATA (Alba Fimbriata)—White. Large formal double with fringed petals. Slow, busy spreading growth. \$6.00, 12-18" and \$7.50, 18-24".

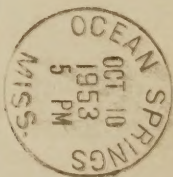
