### SEED PLANTING RECOMMENDATIONS

- ANNUALS, plants living only one year, seed should be planted in the early spring.
- BIENNIALS, plants living two years, seed should be planted in late summer and early fall.
- PERENNIALS, plants living more than two years, seed should be planted in the early spring.

### TRANSPLANTING RECOMMENDATIONS

The following should be transplanted during the dormant season usually between October and April 1: Annual and Biennial flower plants, Evergreen and decidious trees and shrubs.

The following can be transplanted any time except mid-summer: Yucca, Agaves, Sotol, Ferns and Ocotillo. Cacti and Bulbs can be satisfactorily moved any month of the year.

## CUT FLOWER VARIETIES OF ANNUALS AND BIENNIALS

No. 1—LUPINUS texensis (Texas Bluebonnet) (Texas State Flower). Up to 1 foot tall, with many spikes of dark blue flowers. Grows in any good soil in full sun. Excellent cut flowers. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 2—PENTSTEMON barbatus (Scarlet Bugler) Biennials. Up to 2 feet tall, beautiful gray foliage, large spikes of red flowers. Long lasting cut flowers. Grows in any good dry or semi-moist soil. Extra nice plants \$1.50 per doz. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 3—PENTSTEMON murrayanus (Great Red Penstemon) Biennials up to 3 feet tall, with many spikes of red flowers. Grows best in rich semi-moist soils, in shade or sun. Fine plants at \$2.00 per dozen. Pkt. seed 20c.

No. 4—PENTSTEMON cobaea (Belladonna) Biennials up to 2 feet tall, with single spikes of pale blue flowers. Hardy in any good soil, dry or semi-moist. Large bluish leaves that make the plant attractive. Strong plants \$1.00 per dozen. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 5—PENTSTEMON harvardii (Fox Glove) Biennials up to 1 foot tall, with many spikes of beautiful blue flowers that are long lasting cut flowers. Grows in rich moist soils in shade or sun. Choice plants at \$1.75 per dozen. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 6—PENTSTEMON dasyphyllus (Purple Fox Glove) Biennials up to 2 feet tall, with large spikes of beautiful purple flowers that are excellent cut flowers. Hardy in rich moist soils in shade or sun. Fine plants at \$1.75 per dozen. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 7—PENTSTEMON ambiguus (Pink Pentstemon) A perennial up to 2 feet tall, decorative globular shaped covered with a mass of pink flowers during the summer months. This plant also makes a very nice hedge. Grows in any good dry or semi-moist soils. Well rooted plants at \$2.00 per dozen. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 8—GILIA rubra (Standing Cypress). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, singular plants with fern like foliage and long spike of scarlet flowers in spring. Hardy plants in any good soil, dry or semi-moist. Good plants at \$1.00 per dozen. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 11—EUSTOMA russellianum (Bluebell, Blue Gentian). Biennials up to 2 feet tall, having hundreds of 3-inch bell-shaped dark to pale blue flowers from June until frost. The plants must be grown in moist locations. The plants are noted for their long lasting cut flowers, the buds continue to bloom after they are cut if fresh water is added daily. The best plants ever offered at \$1.50 per dozen. Pkt. seed 25c.

### CUT FLOWERS

No. 12—GAILLARDIA pulchella (Indian Blanket). Annuals up to 1½ feet tall, with beautiful 3-inch composite flowers of varied hues of red. It is one of the first plants to bloom in the spring and continue until late summer. A favorite cut flower. Grows in any good soil, best in semi-moist locations. Plants \$1.00 per dozen. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 15—LOBELIA cardinalis (Lobelia, Cardinal Flower). Biennials up to 4 feet tall, growing where there is moisture and shade. Flowers large spikes of blood red from June until frost. This is a choice plant for these locations. Best plants at \$1.75 per dozen. Pkt. seed 25c.

No. 18—CIRSIUM austrinum (Blue Sailor). Annuals 2 to 3 feet tall, with lavender and dark blue plume-like flowers. Grows in any good semi-moist soils. A group of these will add much color. Pkt. seed 10c.

No. 19—HELIANTHUS debilis (Dwarf Sunflower). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, having dozens of flowers on very long stems. Best in dry sandy soils. Will brighten up the parks and roadsides. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 20—CENTAURES austrinum (Sweet Sultan). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, with large flowers of white and purple flowers. Will grow in any good semi-moist soils. Hardy plants making a very neat backbround. Pkt. seed 10c.

No. 21—VERBENA bipinnatifida (Blue Verbena). Annuals up to 1 foot tall, spreading plants covered with blue flowers that will attract much attention. Grows best in rich semimoist soils. The plants bloom from spring until fall. Very good plants at \$2.00 per dozen. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 22—LINUM sanctum (Yellow Flax). Annuals up to 1 foot tall, with many branches tipped with copper colored flowers that are very attractive. Grows best in rich moist soil. A large bed of these will add much color to the garden. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 23—LINUM lewisii (Blue Flax). Up to 18 inches tall, with delicate pale blue flowers with white centers. Hardy plants in rich moist soils. These will make an attractive flower bed. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 24—BERLANDIER lyrata (Blackeyed Susan). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, covered in the spring and summer with flowers and black centers that are very fragrant. Hardy in Semi-moist soils. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 25—THELESPERMA ambiguus (Browneyed Susan). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, with large yellow flowers with brown centers. The plant appears leafless. Grows in rich semi-moist soils. This is a very attractive plant. Pkt. seed 15c.

- No. 26—ERYNGIUM leavenworthii (Eringo). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, a thistle-like plant having cones of steel blue flowers in summer and fall. This is a very showy plant. Best in rich semi-moist soils. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 34—BAILEY multiratadata (Paper Daisy). Annuals up to 1½ feet tall, having large double yellow flowers from spring until frost. Attractive gray foliage, hardy plants in any good dry or semi-moist soils. This is a choice plant for any flower bed. 12 plants \$1.00. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 37—LIATRIS puncata (Blazing Star). Perennial bulbs up to 2 feet tall, having 6 to 12-inch spikes of lavender flowers. Hardy plants in any good dry or semi-moist soils. A choice plant for late summer boxes. Large bulbs 50c each. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 46—RANUNCULUS marcranthus (Buttercup). Perennials up to 12 inches tall, with large rich yellow flowers spring and summer. Does best in rich moist soils. An excellent plant for borders. 12 plants \$1.50. Pkt. seed 20c.
- No. 47—OENOTHERA biennis (Tall Evening Primrose). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, having large yellow flowers blooming along the stalk as the plant grows. Does best in dry sandy soils. A very colorful plant for the background. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 48—ASTER tanacetifolis (Tansy Aster). Annuals up to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet tall, covered throughout the spring and summer with large blue flowers with yellow centers. Hardy plants in any good soil. The cut flowers are very long lasting. This is a choice plant in any garden. 12 plants \$1.50. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 49—SALVIA farinacea (Blue Salvia). Perennials up to 2 feet tall, having gray foliage and numerous spikes of dark flowers. Grows best in moist locations. Makes a very attractive hedge. Plants 50c each. Pkt. seed 26c.
- No. 50—STREPLANTHUS carianus. Annuals up to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet tall and having almost black spikes of larkspur-like flowers. An attractive plant for dry soils. Pkt. seed 20c.
- No. 55—CHEIRINIA asperimia (Wall Flower). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, with large spikes of yellow flowers in early spring. Does best in dry sandy soils. A bright colored plant for early spring. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 62—AMBLYOEPIS setigera (Butterfly Daisy). Annuals up to 1 foot tall, with large yellow sunflower-like flowers that are very fragrant, attracting butterflies, birds, etc. Makes very good cut flowers. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 66—GRINDELIA squarrosa (Gum Plant). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, having sunflower-like flowers blooming along the talk. A very colorful plant for the background. Hardy in moist soils. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 145—ECHINACHEA angustifolia (Sampsons Root). Perennials up to 3 feet tall, having pink composite flowers with large purple cone center. Does best in good semimoist soils. A very good plant for the rock gardens and the like. Pkt. seed 15c.

The following varieties of UNIQUE flowers are hardy and colorful; briefly described.

No. 9—GILIA aggregata (Mountain Cypress). Annuals up to 4 feet tall, having many branches tipped with spikes of scarlet flowers. Grows in any good soil, dry or semi-moist locations. Excellent for parks, cemeteries and the like. Fine plants at \$1.00 doz. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 10—GILIA incisia (Blue Gilia). Annuals up to 1 foot tall, covered with small pale blue flowers in the early spring. Hardy in dry or semi-moist soils. Very good for parks, cemeteries, and rock gardens. Pkt, seed 15c.

No. 13—RATIBIDA columnaris (Thimble Flower). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, with a mass of large flowers of shades of yellow, orange, brown and rust. Grows best in good semimoist soils. Very good for parks, roadsides, cemeteries and the like. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 14—SOLANUM torreyi (Purple Nightshade). Perennial roots, plants up to 1½ feet tall, blue star-shaped flowers. Hardy in any soil and dry or moist locations. For parks, roadsides, and barren areas. Pkt. seed 10c.

No. 16—DELPHINIUM carolinianum (Wild Larkspur). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, having spikes of light blue flowers in early spring. Best in rich moist soils. Very good for parks and rock gardens. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 17—CASTILLEJA (Indian Paint-Brush). Biennials up to 3 feet tall, with many branches of beautiful flowers. Grows best in rich semi-moist soils. Attractive in any flower garden. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 27—ACHILLEA millefolium (Yellow Yarrow). Annuals up to 3 feet tall having heads of yellow very fragrant flowers in early summer. Hardy in dry or semi-moist soils. Besides being attractive they attract birds and butterflies. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 28—CASSIA roemeriana. Annuals up to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet tall, this plant will attract much attention because of its abundance of bright orange-colored flowers from spring until fall. Hardy in dry or semi-moist sols. For any place a bright color is needed. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 29—CASSIA lindheimerii (Velvet Senna). Perennials up to 4 feet tall, with numerous yellow flowers from late summer until fall. Grows best in semi-moist or dry soils. Makes a very good hedge, colorful in parks, roadsides and the like. Plants 50c each. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 30—ENCELIA calva. Perennials up to 2 feet tall, with yellow aster-like flowers. Hardy in dry or semi-moist soils. A very good rock garden plant. Pkt. seed 15c.

- No. 31—CLEMATIS filtera (Leather Flower). A perennial vine, growing in shaded areas in rich soils. Flowers bell-shaped almost black in color. Very good for rock gardens. Plants \$1.50. Pkt. seed 20c.
- No. 32—QUINCULA LOBATA (Prairie Violet). Annuals looking very much like the cultivated violet, grows in any good dry or semi-moist soil. Very good for border plants or in rock gardens. Pkt. seed 20c.
- No. 33—DITHYRAEA wislizeni (White Stock). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, having many branches tipped with spikes of white flowers throughout the spring and summer. Hardy in dry or semi-moist soils. Useful in parks, roadsides and barren areas. 12 nice plants 75c. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 35—LIMOINIUM braslinece (Statice). Perennial plants up to 1 foot tall, with lavender lace-like flowers. Grows best in wet locations in any kind of soil. Will grow in shade. Very good in parks and roadsides. Bulbs 50c each. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 36—THELESPERMA trifidum. Annuals up to 2 feet tall, many slender branches almost leafless with large yellow flowers with black centers. Best in rich moist soils. Very colorful in parks and roadsides. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 38—SOLANUM citrullifolium (Blue Thistle). Annuals up to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet tall, this plant is very prickly, fragrant blue star-shaped flowers attracting birds and butterflies. Very good in parks and barren lots and the like. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 39—ARGEMONE mexicana (Wild Yellow Poppy). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, with large yellow poppy-like flowers from spring until late summer. For parks, barren lots and roadsides. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 40—ARGEMONE alba (Wild White Poppy). Annuals up to 2 feet tall. Same as No. 39 except white flowers. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 41—ARGEMONE sanguinea (Pink Wild Poppy). Same as No. 39 and 40 except pink flowers. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 42—CORYDALIA aurea (Scrambled Eggs). Annuals up to 6 inches tall, with spikes of copper colored flowers spring and summer. Grows in any dry or semi-moist soils. Attractive in parks, roadsides, cemeteries and rock gardens. Pkt. seed 15c.
- No. 43—MONARDA dispersa (Purple Horse Mint). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, having spikes of mint-scented flowers, purple color. Best in rich semi-moist soils. Very good to brighten the color in parks and the roadsides.

No. 44—MACROSIPHONIA macrosiphon (Dogbane). Perennials up to 1 foot tall, with large morning glory-like flowers. Best in a rocky location, A rock garden special. Plants \$1.00 each. Pkt. seed 25c.

No. 45—TRIPTEROCALYX cyclopteris (Giant Verbena). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, small pink flowers followed by various colors of balls of seed which decorate the plant. Grows best in dry sandy soils. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 64—HELITROPIUM tenellum (White Helitrope). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, covered with pure white flowers that are very fragrant in late summer. Grows best in sandy soils, dry or semi-moist. Very good for parks and roadsides. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 65—IBERVILLE lindheimerii (Wild Balsam). Annuals, a small vine having various colored apples along the stem that are very attractive in the late summer and fall. Will grow in any good dry or semi-moist soils. An excellent rock garden plant. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 150—CROTON monanthogynus (Mexican Tea). Annual up to 12 inches tall, having silvery gray foliage. Hardy in dry or moist soils. Used in making tea and meat flavoring. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 126—VERVESINA encelioides (Crown Beard). Annuals up to 3 feet tall, having large sunflower-like flowers. Hardy in any soil or location. Very good for barren lots or parks and roadsides. This plant will grow where others fail. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 127—LESQUERELIA recurvata (Blanket of Gold). Annuals up to 6 inches tall, spreading, small golden flowers cover the plant in early spring. Grows in any dry or semimoist soils. Brightens up barren lots, etc. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 136—HELIANTHUS argophyllus (Giant Silver Leaf Sunflower). Annuals up to 15 feet tall, having many branches that are tipped with ordinary sunflowers. Huge leaves, gray color with cotton-like substance covering the leaf and stalk. This is a very attractive plant for backgrounds or screens. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 138—ASTRAGALUS mollissimus (Loco). Perennial roots. The plants grow about 1½ feet tall, having many shoots that is tipped with purple spike of flowers. The flowers resemble Texas Bluebonnets. Will grow in any dry or semi-moist soils. Very ornamental in parks and road-sides. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 139—PAROSELA AUREA (Golden Dalea). Perennials up to 1 foot tall, having quaint heads of yellow flowers at the tips of slender stalks. Very good on steep slopes and barren places. Will grow in any good soil. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 140—NERISYRENIA camporum. Biennials up to 1 foot tall, having white with a touch of purple flowers spring and summer. Will grow in any dry or semi-moist soils. A very good rock garden plant. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 141—MERIOLIX spinulosa (Day Primrose). Annuals up to 1 foot tall, having large yellow buttercup-like flowers. Best in rich moist soils. Very good for parks, roadsides and the like. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 51—SISYRINCHIUM ensigerum (Blue Eyed Grass). Perennials with clusters of small blue flowers at the tips of the many leafless branches. Grows in any dry or semimoist soils. A very good rock garden plant. Pkt. seed 20c.

No. 52—OTHAKE hookerania (Pink Daisy). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, having pale pink flowers during summer. Best in dry sandy soils. One of the best pink natives. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 53—SPHAERAEA subhatata (Blue Flowered Mallow). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, having many pale blue flowers along the stems of the plant. Hardy in good semi-moist soils. Useful in parks and roadsides. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 54—SPHAERAEA haustalata (Salmon flowered Mallow). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, with bright salmon-colored flowers along the stems. Grows in any good dry or semimoist soils. Attractive in parks, roadsides and the like. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 56—ABRONIA villosa (Pink Verbena). Annuals 6 to 8 inches tall, covered with round clusters of very showy pink flowers in the spring. Best in sandy soils. Attractive in parks and barren locations. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 57—PHACELIA congesta (Blue Curls). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, with many heads of blue curl flowers. Will grow in any good dry or semi-moist soil. For roadside parks and barren places. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 58—DATURA meteloides (Devils Trumpet). Annuals up to 4 feet tall, with huge morning glory-like flowers. Flowers white. Does best in good semi-moist locations. Useful in parks, roadsides and barren areas. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 59—MAURANDYA antirrhiniflora (Climbing Snapdragon). Perennial small vines with pale blue snapdragon like flowers or bonnet shaped. Best in dry or semi-moist soils or sand. Where a small vine is wanted, this should be it. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 60—ASCLEPIODORA decumbens (Popcorn Balls). Annuals up to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet tall, having round balls of greenish flowers that attract much attention. Hardy in any good dry or semi-moist soils, very good in parks or rock gardens. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 61—ZINNIA grandiflora (Prairie Zinnia). Perennials up to 6 inches tall, in the spring and summer the entire plant is a solid mass of golden flowers. Hardy in any dry or semi-moist soils. A striking plant in any location. Plants 50c each. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 63—ASTRAGALUS mexicanus. Annuals up to 1 foot tall, spreading plants having very colorful seed pods which resemble bird eggs that are various colors. Best in dry or semi-moist soils. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 142—SALVIA pitcheri (Prairie Sage). Perennials up to 3 feet tall, with spike of blue flowers. This is one of the best of the salvias. Has a very long blooming period. Will grow in any good soil. An excellent park and will brighten up the roadside. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 143—CURCURBITA foetidissima (Wild Gourd). A perennial vine up to 25 feet long, large grap leaves, huge orange-colored flowers, followed with fruits about the size of a large orange. Hardy in any soil. Very good for covering unsightly places, ragged slopes and ditches. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 144—APHANOSTEPHUS skirrobasis (White Daisy). Annuals up to 1 foot tall, covered with white daisy-like flowers spring and summer. Will grow in any good dry or semi-moist soils. A favorite park and roadside plant. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 66—PRIONOPSIS ciliata (Saw Leaf Daisy). Annuals up to 4 feet tall, having large aster-like flowers blooming along the stalk. The leaves are scalloped. Does best in good semi-moist soils. A very good background plant, makes a good screen, colorful in parks and roadsides. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 146—POLANISIA uniglandulosa (Spider Flower). Annuals up to 1 foot tall, having lace-like white mixed with red flowers. Grows in dry or semi-moist soils. Colorful in rock gardens and the like. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 172—MARTYNIA fragrans (Unicorn). Annuals up to 2 feet tall, large grayish leaves, lilac trumpet-shaped flowers. The seed pods when split open resemble an antelope's horns. Best in rich moist soils. A showy plant for parks and barren places. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 175—COCCULUS carolinus (Wild Sarsaparilla). A perennial vine, having dark green foliage during the summer and bright red berries in the fall and winter. A beautiful vine for covering fences and trellaces. Will grow in any good soil. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 176—KOEBERLINIA spinosa (Crucifixion Thorn). A perennial shrub, leafless, a mass of green thorns. This is the king of the desert because it needs no water and insects and beasts stay away from it. Probably will grow in

### TREES AND SHRUBS

### Interesting, Colorful and Ornamental

Tree and shrub seed should be planted in the spring of the year. Plant the seed about 3 times the diameter of the seed and keep moist until up.

No. 98—LEUCOPHYLLUM (Purple Sage). An evergreen shrub up to 5 feet tall, gray foliage and lavender flowers after rains. Will grow in any good dry or semi-moist soil. Useful in hedges and as specimen plant. 1-foot plants \$4.00. Pkt. seed 25c.

No. 99—LEUCOPHYLLUM minus (Mountain Sage). An evergreen shrub up to 3 feet tall, with blue gray foliage and pale flowers after rains. Will grow in any good dry or semi-moist soil. This is a rare and beautiful plant. Used in landscape plantings. 1-foot plants \$5.00 F.O.B. Pkt. seed 30c.

No. 100—SOPHORA secundiflora (Mountain Laurel). An evergreen shrub or small tree up to 15 feet tall, with dark green glossy foliage and large clusters of purple flowers. Best in rich semi-moist or wet soils. Very colorful in land-scape plantings. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 101—AESCULUS pavia (Mexican Buckeye). A large shrub up to 8 feet tall, having pink flowers along the stems before the leaves appear in the spring. An attractive plant as well as colorful in landscape plantings and parks. 3-foot plants \$1.50. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 102—CERCIS occidentalis. A shrub or tree up to 8 feet tall, with large glossy heart-shaped leaves. Bright red flowers along the stems before the leaves appear in the spring. Grows in any good dry or semi-moist soil. Very good for color in parks, large estates and the like. 3-foot plants \$1.50. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 103—PARKINSONIA aculeata (Jerusalem Thorn). Medium sized tree up to 20 feet tall, having long grass-like leaves and the limbs and trunk of rich green color making the tree very attractive. Large clusters of yellow flowers. Will not stand cold below zero. Grows in any moist or semi-moist soil. Very good for parks and roadsides. 1-foot plants \$1.00. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 104—RHUS virens (Evergreen Sumac). A compact shrub up to 6 feet tall, having large clusters of red berries fall and winter making it very attractive. Hardy in any good semi-moist soil. An excellent plant in landscape plantings. 1-foot plants \$1.50. Pkt. seed 15c.

No. 165—RHUS lanceolata (Staghorn Sumac). Shrub or small tree up to 12 feet tall, with large clusters of red berries fall and winter. These shrubs are especially attractive in the fall when the foliage turns to various colors of red and bronze. Best in rich moist soil.
