Tomatoes do best on light, warm, not over-rich soil. Sow in hotbed or window-box (where 60 degree Fahrenheit is the minimum night temperature) in March, in rows 3 inches apart and ½ inch deep. Cover firmly. Later sowings may be made to the end of April. When seedlings are 3 inches high, transplant 4 inches apart each way in hotbeds, cold frames, or singly in 3-inch pots. Harden plants by exposing to the air occasionally. After warm weather is settled, set out plants 3 to 4 feet apart each way in hills, into each of which fertilizer has been previously mixed. Water freely at time of transplantenheit is the minimum night freely at time of transplant-ing and shelter from sun until plants are well established.
