ANTHURIUM SCHERZERIANUM
One of the most exotic of tropical plants suitable for the bome is the Anthurium Scherzerianum.

Offerings of these plants by us is limited to the red and varigated hybrids of which there are many types. Some in solid red and others in spotted varieties of red of many shades.

Growing the plants in the home has become increasingly popular as the prices are now within the reach of all. Small plants will bloom but the flower will naturally be smaller until the plant increases in size.

The growing requirements are simple. Ample water with good drainage. Any temperature above 55 degrees and a north or south window will give good results. Syringing the leaves or washing them when dusty will be beneficial. Although they like humidity and can be grown over a shallow pan filled with cinders they do want drainage. The resting period is usually in the late winter although we do have some in bloom all thru the year. While resting it is well not to overwater.

Plants shipped out of pots may be repotted in a mixture of one third each of peat, sand and light soil. They also do very well in osmunda and screenings of orchid peat would be excellent. Straight sphagnum is not recommended as it dies and becomes water logged and sour. This can be used however as a top dressing to encourage roots and after they form the top may be cut out and a new plant started.

Diseases are few and the only attention is to spray when new growth starts as plant lice will attack the new growth and sometimes a flower as it is forming. A mild solution of Red Arrow or D D T will kill them.

Flowers will last several weeks and large plants will produce 4 to 6 blooms a year. Since the flower lasts about a month you are assured of a continuous growth for several months.

Plants will be shipped out of pots, bare root, outside of beetle zone and to Panama, Puerto Rico, Cuba and Hawail.
