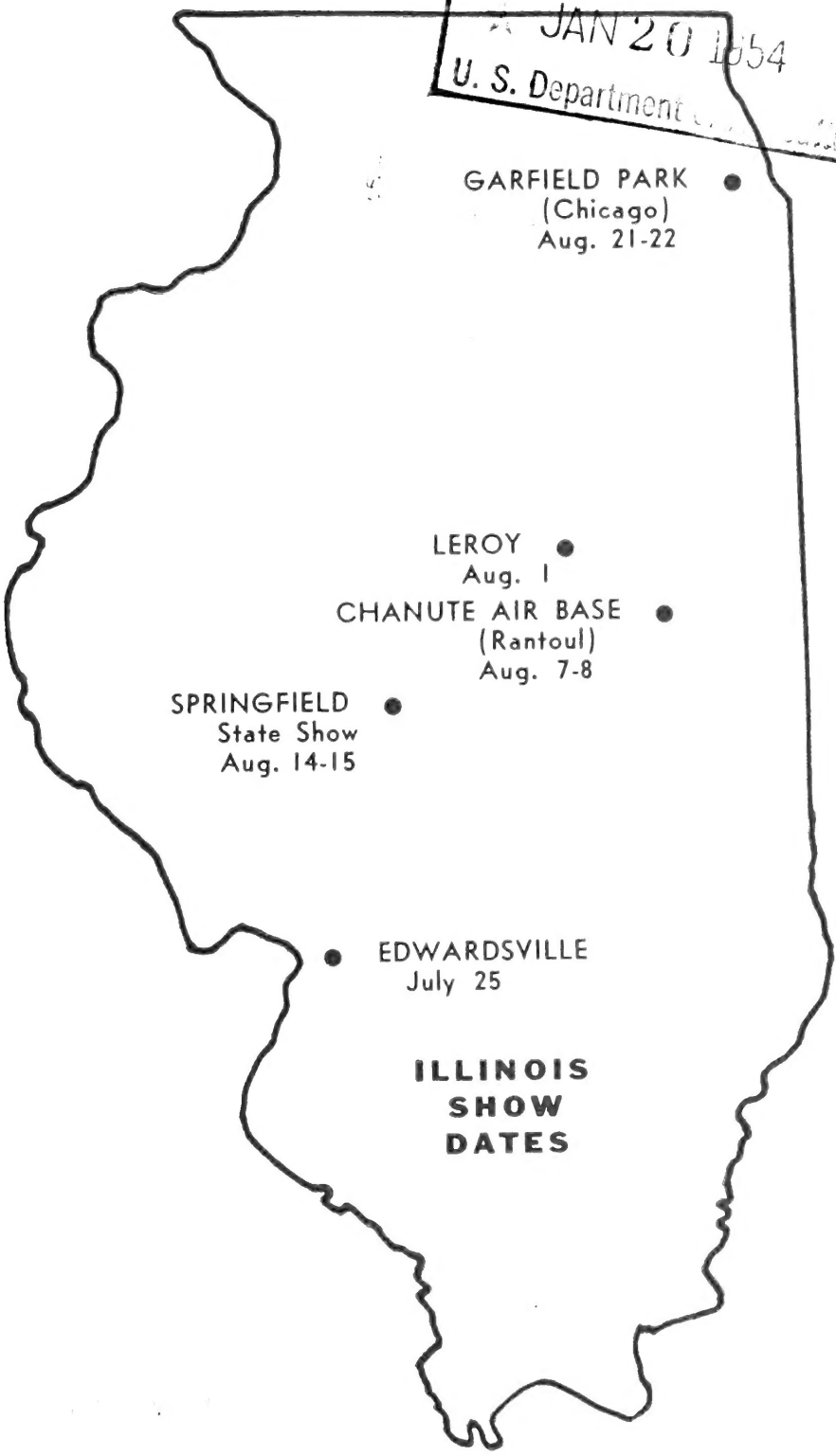

TERMS

No orders accepted for less than \$2.00; cash must accompany order. All retail orders prepaid in the United States. Please do not order less than quantity quoted, except you may order 5 bulbs at the 10 rate.

On orders from \$3.50 to \$5.00 I will add 10% in bulbs; on orders of \$5.10 and up I will add 15% in bulbs.

You may list what you would like for discount bulbs. NO CASH DISCOUNT.

All stock offered subject to prior sale.

On orders of \$3.50 to \$5.00 I will include 1-S bulb of Thunderbolt, if you send 35¢ extra for parcel post. If you send 50¢ extra for parcel post on orders over \$5.10, I will include 1-M bulb of Thunderbolt.

KEY

The number following the variety represents the size of the floret. Next is the name of the originator and the year introduced. Next is the number of days required to bloom from time planted. Sometimes this is not accurate due to weather conditions.

FLORET SIZES ARE AS FOLLOWS

Miniature Glads	— 100 (Florets under 2½ inches)
Small Glads	— 200 (2½ inches to 3¼ inches)
Medium Glads	— 300 (3¼ inches to 4¾ inches)
Large Glads	— 400 (4½ inches to 5¾ inches)
Giant Glads	— 500 (5½ inches and larger)

BULB SIZE IS BY DIAMETER

L—Means Large Bulb 1¼ inches or larger.

M—Means Medium Bulb ¾ inch to 1¼ inches.

S—Means Small Bulb ¼ inch to ¾ inch.

Blbs.—Means Bulblets.
