Visitors are welcome at the greenhouse at any time. Hours are from 8:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. Monday through Saturday and by appointment only on Sunday. The greenhouse is situated on Front Street in Monroe, between Jerome Street and the railroad. A short road leads to the right off East Front Street. The greenhouse may be seen from the road.

I recommend that anyone interested in growing orchids visit the greenhouse if possible. Much more information may be gotten from such a visit than from reading articles in magazines.

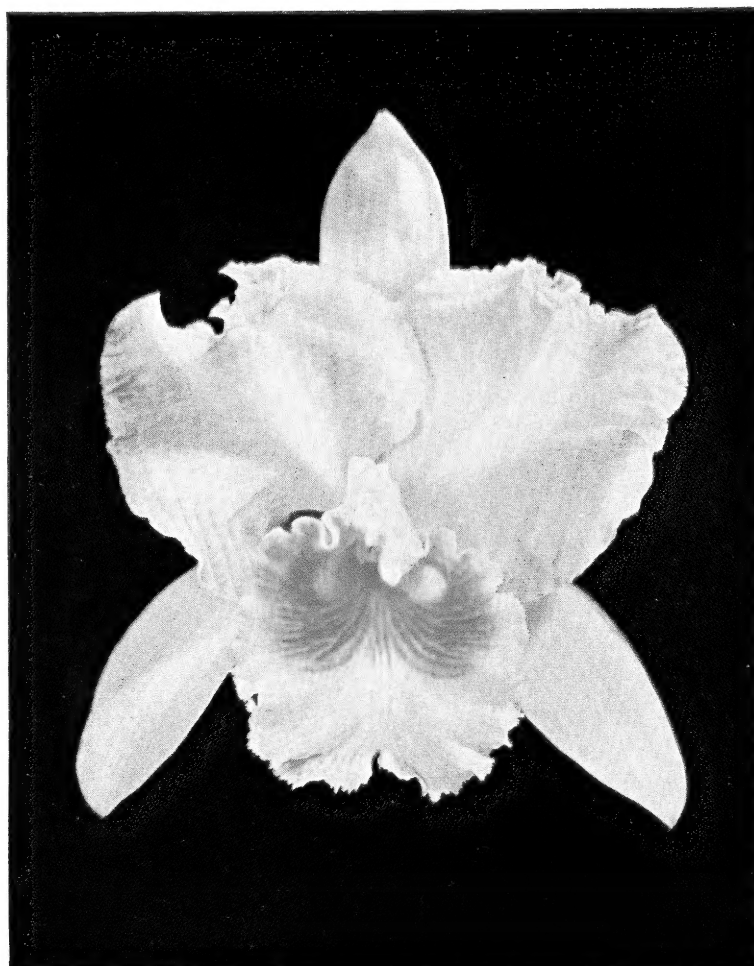
The booklet on culture which I publish is as complete as practical but there are several excellent books on orchid culture available at your bookstore or library.

Plants are properly planted and shipped in their pots, unless I am requested to remove the plant from the pot. Normally they will not need repotting for six months to two years, depending on the size of the plant.

I ship all year round, and recommend Railway Express delivery. If plants are damaged when received, a claim should be filed immediately with the Railway Express Agency. All shipments are f.o.b. Monroe.

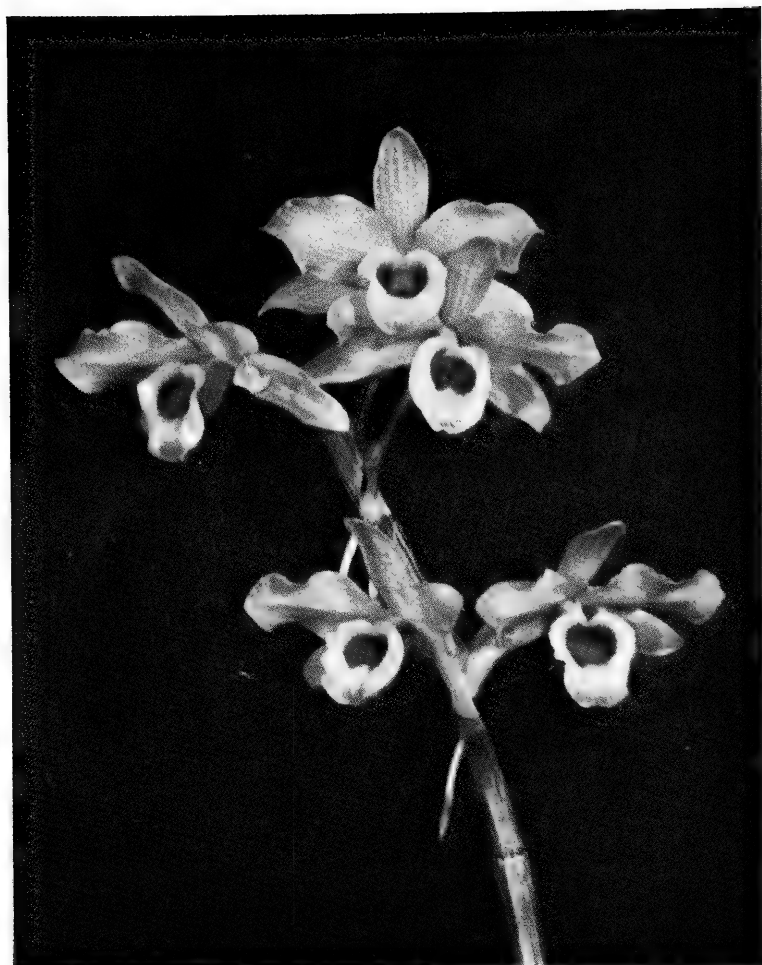

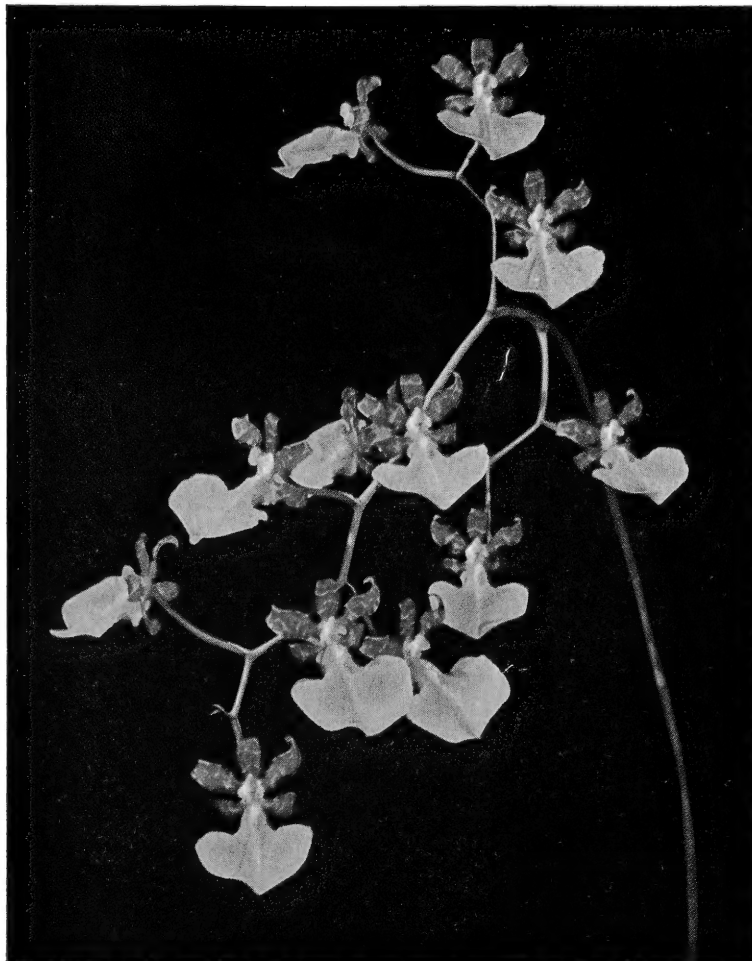

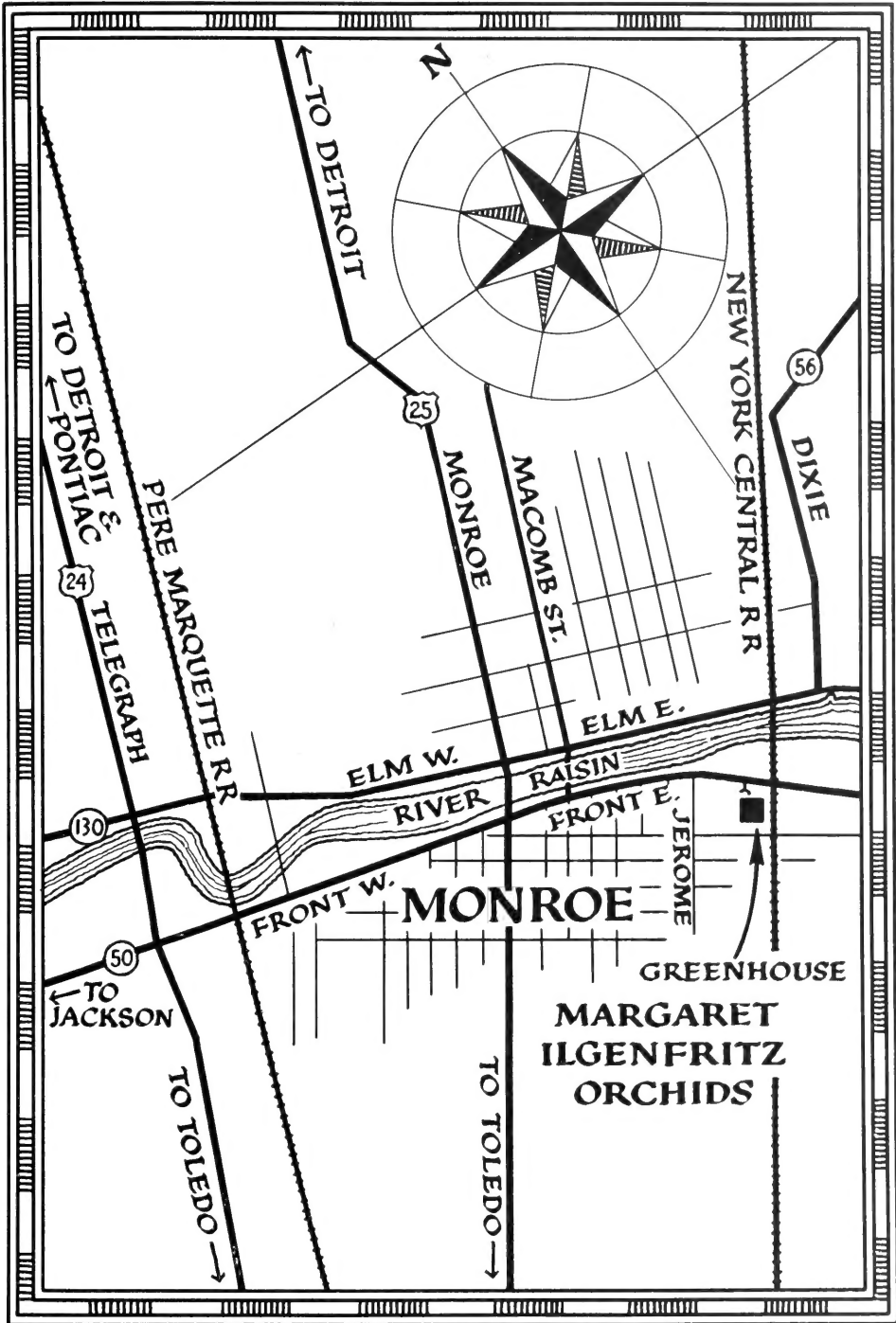
