





When they break off easily from the vine, they are ripe. If they hold fast, leave them on a little longer. An ounce will plant two rows each 50 feet long. The seed is smaller than other melons, so plant 6 or 8 seeds every 8 feet in the row, or 2 to 3 seeds every 2 feet. A packet sows 20 feet, 3 to 4 pounds an acre. Put this on the order sheet now so you will not forget it.

Important. It requires 3 to 4 weeks for Parsley seed to germinate. Cover the seed $^{1}2$ inch. The soil must be moist. In dry weather it is next to impossible to get Parsley seed to germinate unless watered properly. Sometimes soaking the seed several hours in warm water, (not hot), then sowing it out immediately, will help. Parsley can also be easily grown all winter indoors in a flower pot or inside window-box. It is generally used green; however, you can dry the leaves and keep them in air-tight jars for winter.

HOW TO GROW ASPARAGUS.—One ounce of seed will produce about 500 plants. I will furnish a special Leaflet with full directions for preparing the bed, how to set the roots, etc., free to all my customers who ask for it. Plant in early spring.


Improved Long Island. The plants grow 20 to 24 inches high. The "sprouts" or miniature cabbage-like balls are about 1½ inches in diameter, very solid, and so closely set that the stem is completely covered. More delicate flavor than cabbage. Sow seed in April to June; transplant to 1½ feet in the row, and rows 3 feet apart. When the "sprouts" begin to form, break off the lower leaves to give the "sprouts" or "heads" more room to develop. HOW TO GROW SWEET CORN. Prepare the soil thoroughly; enrich it by working in manure. rows 3 feet apart, for the home-garden 2 feet apart, and plant the hills about 15 inches apart in the rows. The early varieties, producing smaller stalks can be planted closer than the big late Corns. If planted very early, before the soil is warm of course you take some risk of the seed rotting. If it does, don't blame the seed; remember that you took a risk against nature. Most gardeners take such a risk in order to get very early crops. Cover seed lightly when planted early—about ½ inch and 1½ inches when soil is warm, and deeper in summer when soil is dry. Remember that seed needs moisture and warmth to germinate it. Do not plant just one row of Corn so many feet long of a variety in your garden; plant four rows of it each ¼ as long so they are more sure to properly pollinate. This helps to insure a full set of kernels on the ear. Plant every two weeks from May 1 (if warm enough) up to July 15. One pound will plant 150 hills; 12 pounds to an acre.

HOW TO GROW CELERY. To have matured Celery early in the summer, sow seeds of the early varieties under glass or indoors in boxes in February; set the plants out in May. For fall and winter crops, sow the seed in April or May, depending on the condition of the soil. Have the soil worked deep, very fine and loose, moist and warm. Sow the seed in rows a foot apart for hand cultivation. Keep moist; prevent soil from work, prevent soil drying out, not too wet or they will die of "damping off." In June set the plants 6 inches apart in the rows, having the soil prepared. Make the rows 2 to 3 feet apart. Blanching is done by banking up the earth around the plants gradually until within a few inches of the top, also by use of Bleaching Paper (we have it), and by use of boards. 

Cantaloupes

How to grow cantaloupes and watermelons. Plant them in May, or start early in paper pots and set out in May. They always do best on a light, loose, rich soil. Dig deep and work the soil until it is very fine, mixing several shovelfuls of Wizard Brand Sheep or Cow Manure (we have it) or some other well-rotted manure into each hill. No plants do well on half-worked, "lumpy" soil, to insure a good stand of plants. Both can be grown very successfully by planting the seed in rows 4 feet apart. 

HOW TO GROW RADISHES. For good, tender, wellshaped Radishes, you must have good, rich, deep, well-prepared soil. They cannot do well in hard "clayey" soil. Sow the seed early and make other sowings every two weeks. This gives you fresh tender Radishes all season. If too large a sowing is made at one time, they may get tough or pithy before all can be used. Sow the seed in rows rather than broadcasting it, for when sown in rows they may be kept clean of weeds, and cultivated. Rows may be made 4 or 6 or 12 inches apart, depending on the quality you are growing. Sow seed thin enough so they do not need to be thinned out. Sow seed of winter Radishes in July and August; then take them up before freezing and store in pits or cover with sand in the cellar, and they will keep fine all winter. Days Required for Seed to Germinate. After many kinds we give the approximate number of days it requires for the seed to germinate. However, sunshine, moisture, depth of planting, and condition of seed-bed have much to do with healthy germination. Give the seed its time to germinate.

It is Important to Have a Good Seed-bed where the tiny new-born plants will be properly nursed. Work the soil very fine, work in manure—Wizard Brand Pulverized Sheep Manure, also **Peat Moss** as a conditioner (we have it), cover the seeds lightly; after they have sprouted do not let the soil dry out or the tender sprouts will die and that will end it as far as that seed is concerned. When moistening the seed-bed do it with a very fine spray, never with a hose unless it can be made to give a very fine misty spray. Sow seed in rows so the plants may be kept weeded and cultivated. Then transplant where you want them to bloom. In lifting leave as much earth on the roots as

possible. Keep the surface broken always, for plants get more nourishment from the air than they do from the soil.

All Flowers are designated as **Annuals, Biennials,** and

Perennials.

ANNUALS grow from seed, bloom, and die within one season. BIENNIALS require two seasons to complete their growth, and seldom bloom until the second year. They make strong root-growth and foliage the first year. This remains over winter. The second year they bloom, seed, and then die.

PERENNIALS do not, as a rule, bloom until the second year from sowing of the seed, although there are numerous perennials which bloom the first year from seed. They are hardy and will not freeze out, blooming year after year. Some last a lifetime; others may reach their age limit in three or four

TO HAVE A GOOD LAWN. Prepare the soil well, work it up as fine as possible, then scatter over and rake in your fertilizer. Now sow the seed, beginning at one end and work back, raking the soil fine and even just before sowing the seed. Do not rake after sowing, but press the seed lightly into the soil by rolling or tamping. Sow the seed very evenly and **plenty** of it.

DRYING OUT IS FATAL. Keep the newly sown lawn moderately moist by light, mist-like sprinkling or by covering with cloth or burlap until the grass is through the soil. Allowing it to dry out, just when the seed has started to germinate, is fatal to the seed, and it cannot germinate a second time; it must be re-sown. Avoid too severe watering which packs the soil.

FOR NEW LAWNS SOW 1 pound to each 100 square feet, that is, 10 feet long and 10 feet wide. (For renewing old lawns. sow half this quantity.) Sow 200 pounds to the acre.
