Off Season Timing

Lights-When flowering varieties out of the natural season by the use of lights and shading the following general rules apply. Varieties are classified 8, 9, etc. week varieties. This is the period of time it takes for them to bloom after short days are started. 8, 9 and 10 week varieties should be lighted from August 1st to May 15th provided plants are grown at 60° minimum, to retard bud formation, 11 week varieties should be lighted after August 15th to May 1st. 12, 13 and 14 week varieties should be lighted Sept. 1st to April 15th. Two hours during August is sufficient, increasing one hour each month until five hours in November and December and then diminishing to four hours during January and February, March to three and April to two.

Shading—8, 9 and 10 week varieties must be shaded April 1st to September 15th to insure bud set out of season. 11 week varieties should be shaded March 15th to October 1st and 12, 13 and 14 week varieties should be shaded from March 1st to October 15th.

Please indicate the earliest date delivery will be acceptable and the maximum number of cuttings that can be handled in a shipment.

Our growers suggest—for the best service and in order to assure delivery of cuttings when you want them—that it is necessary to have your order at least six months in advance of shipping date. Orders on shorter notice will receive the best possible attention. Changes or cancellations must be received at least thirty (30) days before shipment. We suggest that you advise whether substitutions will be acceptable, when giving the order.

Fifty (50) rooted cuttings of α variety is the minimum that can be supplied. More than fifty (50) of α variety must be in multiples of 50.

Shipments will be sent Railway Express unless otherwise instructed.

When shipments arrive in an unsatisfactory condition for any reason—notify your Express Agent at once and have him mark on your express receipt the condition of the shipment or give you a "Joint Inspection Report." Bring claim against delivering company. We hold good order receipt from Transportation Company and cannot be responsible for damage caused by their negligence.

Rooted cuttings delivered before May 15th may set premature buds if night temperature rises to 60 degrees or more. Additional lighting will prevent this. Use 60 watt bulbs spaced 4 feet apart and 30 inches above the plants two to five hours, depending on season. We cannot be responsible when this condition develops.



SOMERSET'S Perennial Flower Seeds

There has been a brisk demand for the better perennials during the past few years, and the supply has been inadequate. The cut flower value of some items is considerable, and is often available at a time when other cut flowers are in short supply. Seed is a cheap and quick way to obtain a stock of many items. Some items are tricky to germinate satisfactorily, but most can be easily raised when sown in early spring, either in the greenhouse or cold frames. Light freezes will not harm most items, and

best results are obtained while the weather is cool.

Midsummer sowing is recommended by some authorities, and the seed of many items can be germinated successfully at that time. Greater care, however, is necessary, as weather conditions are less favorable, and under hot humid conditions, results are often unsatisfactory. We shall, at all times, endeavor to give you seed of the best possible strains and viability.





Place about two inches of soil on bottom of pot. Work roots into pot by turning and fill to top with soil. Use hammer handle or cut broom handle to pack soil firmly. Refill with soil if necessary and fill pot so there is about two inches. space between top of soil and rim. Water thoroughly, so soil is wet all the way through. Place potted plants in a cool frame or any other place where they will not be exposed to drafts or wind. Light frost will not harm them. Keep tops moist, maintaining high humidity by spraying lightly. Allow soil to get slightly dry before watering again. This is to encourage vigorous root growth. After plants are well started and growing give increasing amounts of water as needed. Feed with Hygro or other good liquid fertilizer when buds are the size of a pea.
