A lot of water has run over the dam since last year. So much so, in fact, that for the first time in my twenty six years of glad growing my bulblet crop was nearly a complete failure. For that reason I am offering only large bulbs this year. Prices will be as follows. 2 for 20c, 10 for 80c, 100 for \$7.00. If your order amounts to five dollars or more I will include free, one bulb (labelled) of LAVENDER GLORY in medium size, and worth \$1.75. In addition, if you will refund postal charges on your shipment, I will send you two small bulbs of the same variety, worth \$2.00, or, if you prefer it, one large bulb worth \$2.50. Just say, "I will return postage," and specify what size you want.

Excessive shipping charges make it unprofitable to accept orders for less than \$2.50, and please do not order any single item for less than 20c. All orders will be shipped postpaid early in the spring unless earlier shipment is specified.

ANNAMAE. Early white that is really white. An easy glad to grow for it is naturally straight.

ASTRID. Topnotch rose with deeper throat. Rightly rated one of the best.

BUCKEYE BRONZE. Unquestionably the best smoky bronze. Well ruffled, a fine grower and very popular.

BOUTON d'OR. Golden yellow with a double row placement. A good yellow for commercial use.

CHERBOURG. Tall growing, medium rose of a lively shade.

- **DEBORAH SAMPSON.** Pastel light buff on a strong growing plant. Ten open blooms is not uncommon. One of the best light pastels.

- **GOLDEN ARROW.** A reliable medium yellow which we grow in quantity for our cutflower trade.
- HARMAU. Nice growing salmon with deeper throat.
- **HEAVENLY WHITE.** Blue white that is both unusual and good.
- **H. R. HANCOCK.** Snappy salmon with lighter throat. Always reliable for us.

- **SPIC AND SPAN.** In the brief time since its introduction this ruffled salmon pink has probably won more prizes than any other variety. Will open 10-12 blooms at once on an always straight spike. A really sensational glad. I have a very large stock of this and can quote special prices on lots of several thousands of any sizes. The (bulbs are clean and healthy and unforced.
- **WESTERN STAR.** This buff sport of Picardy has all the good qualities of that variety. An exceptionally nice glad to grow.

HAND POLLINATED SEEDS

Every seed listed is the result of a hand pollinated cross and each will produce a new variety, usually quite unlike its parents. All the new, high priced varieties are developed from seeds, so if you get a few outstanding ones you will find a ready market for them. It is a gamble when only a few seeds are planted but, even then, it is a thousand times better than a ticket on the Irish Sweepstakes. Seeds should be sown just as soon as the ground warms up a bit, covered an inch deep, and the ground should be kept moist until the seedlings appear, which normally occurs in about three weeks. Well grown seeds should give you many bulbs which will bloom the following year and, even in small lots, you will find some good ones. It is the most fascinating part of gladiolus growing. Take my advice and try it. Packets of forty seeds, properly labelled, are fifty cents each, postpaid.
