SUCCESSFUL GLADIOLUS CULTURE

Gladiolus can be grown easily and in every section of the United States or Canada. Just be sure and plant good bulbs, free of disease. Give them a sunny exposure and be sure that they have a sufficient amount of moisture such as a good soaking once a week.

Large bulbs are necessary to produce exhibition blooms but your medium and small bulbs of some varieties will bloom and, on the latter two sizes, of course your bulb production is much greater. If you have a heavy clay soil, a depth of four inches is sufficient for your bulbs perhaps but a sandy loam requires deeper planting for best results. Plant large bulbs about five inches deep and decrease this depth according to the size of your bulbs. Light soils will usually give more bulbs than heavy soils.

Your first planting can be about the time farmers plant potatoes in your locality and your last planting should be about 120 days before the usual first frost. We make three plantings, three or four weeks apart, to insure a long blooming period, and suggest, in southeastern New England, April 6 to 15—May 10 or thereabouts—and June 1 to 20.
