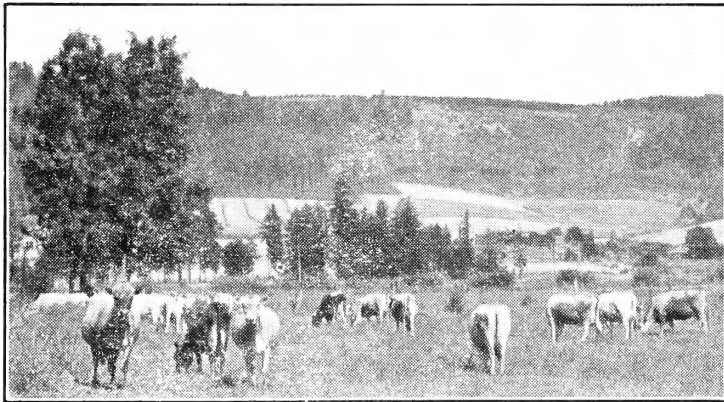

Fall ACP Program for Cover Crops

The Virginia State ASC Committee has arranged to include in the 1955 Agricultural Conservation Program a practice of seeding winter cover crops without the "usual acreage limitation" that was in effect in 1954.

Although final details have not been worked out, it is anticipated that the government will share with farmers to the extent of 50 per cent of the cost of the seed for crimson clover, annual rye grass, Austrian winter peas, hairy vetch and rye, when seeded in the fall of 1955 for winter cover, together with 50 per cent of the cost of needed fertilizer used. This also applies to North Carolina, South Carolina and other southern states. This may well result in some increase in demand for seed of these crops this fall.

Our Crimson Clover is of unusually high quality from a standpoint of purity. It is possible for Crimson Clover to contain thousands of mustard seed per pound, and still show a purity of 98.50% on the analysis tag.

The domestic Crimson Clover crop was only about one-fourth of normal. The price of Crimson Clover will no doubt hold firm in view of short crop and ACP program, which will increase the demand.



How to Fertilize and Seed a Pasture

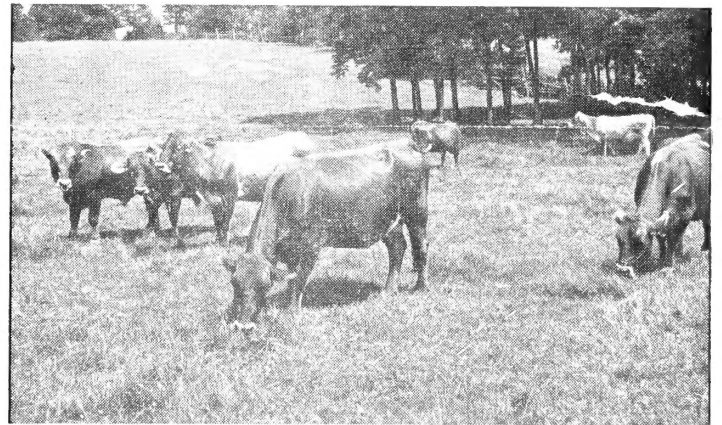
If the field has not been limed recently plow or disc in about a ton per acre before seeding. Deep roots withstand droughts. Encourage deep root growth by plowing down one-half of the fertilizer. Harrow in the rest just before seeding. Use 2-12-12 on heavy or rich soils. Use 5-10-10 on light or poor soil. Up to 1,000 lbs. per acre pays.

The secret of good stands is seed shallow on firm seed beds and press the seed to the soil. Grass and clover seedlings have short roots and must catch hold quickly or die. They smother out if covered over one-fourth inch on heavy soils or one-half inch on light sandy soils. Before planting, harrow and roll until seedbed is firm. Harrow the seed in very lightly then press firm with cultipacker or roll.

Sow 25 lbs. per acre in early fall so the seedlings can grow deep roots to withstand winter freezing and thawing. In the Piedmont or Mountains sow our Mixtures 1 to 8 to suit your soil. In Coastal Plains sow our Southern Mixture 12.

Renovating Worn Out Pastures or Broom Sedge Wasteland, disc or harrow in the lime and fertilizer. Seed and roll firm. Lime gets rid of the broom sedge and encourages legumes, which enrich the soil with nitrogen, stimulates the growth of good pasture grasses and increases their protein, mineral and vitamin content. Pastures yield three times more after renovation. Swamps may make your best pasture if ditched or drained and Pasture Mixture 3 sown.

Ladino is the most nutritious, palatable and productive year round pasture legume. Its peak growth is in early spring and fall, when native grasses are short. Is so rich it may cause bloating unless grasses are grown with it. Sow 1 to 2 lbs. Ladino with 10 lbs. of orchard grass or tall fescue, in early fall. Add 2 lbs. of Red Clover and 5 lbs. of Alfalfa for more summer pasture. Premium quality. Eligible for P.M.A. For years Kansas has been recommended by the U.S.D.A. and Southern state experiment stations, where it has made top yields, persisted longer, resisted diseases and winters. Williamsburg, Improved Kansas, will be available October 15th.

Alfalfa lasts for years, improves soils and produces the greatest yields of hay, pasture and silage, higher in protein, minerals and feed value, essential to all livestock. Pasture yields treble by adding Alfalfa. At V.P.I. the first cutting of Ladino and Orchard was 657 lbs. of good forage and 375 lbs. of weeds. When alfalfa was added good forage was 1,825 lbs. and weeds 35 lbs. Put alfalfa on deep well drained soils. Use 1,000 lbs. of borated 2-12-12 at seeding and 800 lbs. each spring. Inoculate and sow 25 lbs. per acre in August or September on a firm seedbed; cover one-fourth inch; cultipack or drag.

TURNIP and RUTABAGA

Turnips should be planted in August, the salad varieties in August or September. Plant either broadcast or in drills 1 to 1½ feet apart, cover ½ inch deep and thin out. One ounce plants 100 feet of drill, 1½ lbs. plants one acre in drills; 2 lbs. one acre broadcast; salad varieties 3 lbs. to the acre.

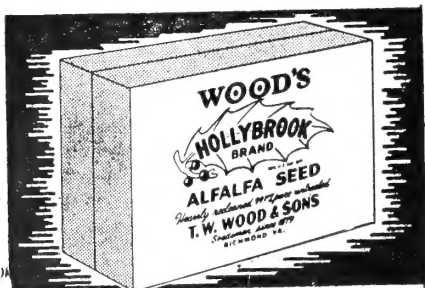

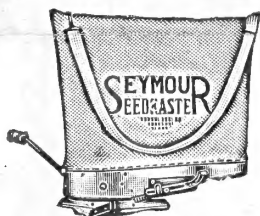
