DIRECTORY OF STATE OFFICIALS AND ORGANIZATIONS CONCERNED WITH THE PROTECTION OF BIRDS AND GAME, 1903

The following directory of officials and organizations concerned with the protection of birds and game in the United States and Canada has been revised to December 15, 1903. It has been arranged on the same plan as the directories issued each year since 1900, with the addresses grouped under four headings—State Officials, National Organizations, State Organizations, and Audubon Societies. Organizations which have not been heard from during 1903 are marked with an asterisk (*).

The object of this directory is to present, in convenient form, the names of persons to whom application may be made for information respecting game laws. In the enforcement of the Act of Congress approved May 25, 1900, many questions arise concerning State laws, and it is important that wardens, sportsmen, shippers, and commission merchants should know where copies of local laws may be secured or information obtained concerning open seasons, licenses, shipment and sale, and similar matters.

In 33 States the enforcement of game laws is entrusted to game commissioners, wardens, or other State officers; in 4 others—Florida, Georgia, Nevada, and South Dakota—to county wardens; and in several others to sheriffs and similar local officers. Several national organizations are interested in the protection of birds and game and of these, three are really international: The International Fish and Game Association: the League of American Sportsmen, which has divisions in 45 States and in Ontario, Canada; and the North American Fish and Game Protective Association, which covers eastern Canada and the adjacent parts of the United States. In addition to these organizations of national scope, State associations and many local organizations cooperate in the work of protecting game in 27 States. One of these associations was organized in 1844, and 7 others were established more than twenty Similar organizations have been formed in Canada, of which one in Quebec has been in existence since 1859. Finally 37 States have Audubon Societies, all established during the last seven years, especially for the protection of nongame birds.

Correspondents and other persons interested in game protection are requested to notify the Biological Survey of omissions, errors, or changes in addresses, so that future editions of the directory may be

made as accurate and complete as possible.
