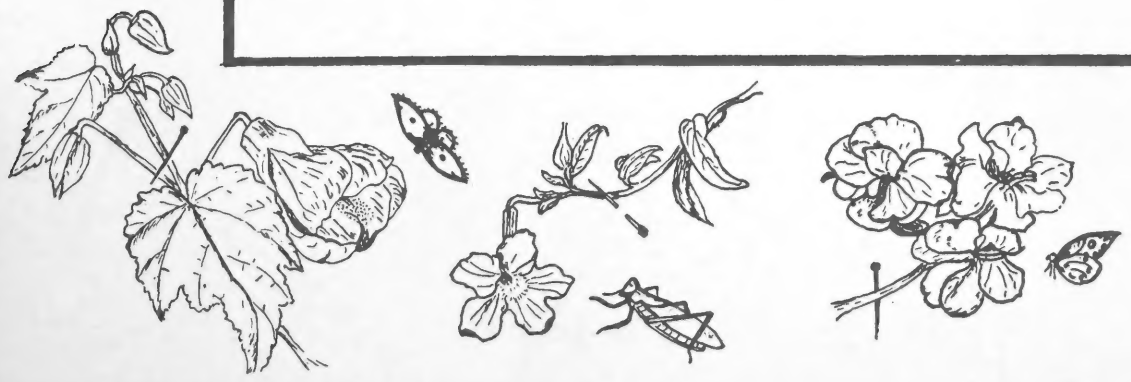

New Carlton Dwarfs

These are true miniatures, bred for vigor of growth as well as quality of blooms. We highly recommend them for those who are looking for a small blooming plant to grow in sunny windows.

Varieties with single blooms.

ANTARES - Bright scarlet blooms. Dark green foliage with darker zone.75
ALCYONE - Dark green foliage. Blooms a bright tangerine-pink of large size.75
ALDEBARAN - One of the most distinctive. Blooms in large clusters, vary in shades of pink, from bright pink to salmon with some orange tones. Foliage is very dark and small.	1.00
BROOKS BARNES - Very dark foliage. Extra large salmon-pink blooms. Choice.	2.00
EPSILON - One of our favorites. Extra large full rounded flowers are pink with white phlox eye. Foliage is a very light green. Robust dwarf growth but makes a larger sized plant than others in this group.	1.00
MILKY WAY - Dark green foliage. Flowers white with sometimes tint of pink.	1.00
POLARIS - Dark green foliage with darker ring. Blooms pink and white.	1.00
RED COMET - Dark foliage. Brilliant red blooms with white eye.75
SALMON COMET - Very dwarf and slow growing. Distinctive dark green foliage with outstanding dark ring and crimped edge. Flowers a beautiful shade of salmon, narrow tapering petals.	1.00
SCARLET O'HARA - Robust dark green foliage. Extra large clusters of brilliant red blooms.75
SIRUS - Very dark foliage. A slow growing real miniature with pink blooms shading to white center.75

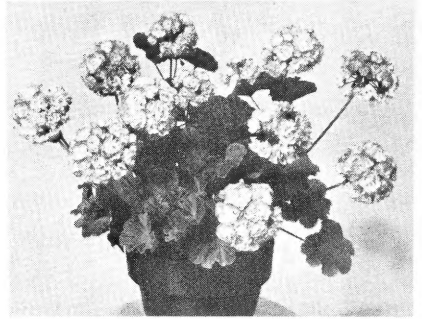

FULGIDUM - Woolly, grey-green, oblong, cut leaf. Dainty crimson blooms. ..	.75
FRINGETTE PINK - Large single salmon flowers with petals notched and fringed. Robust strong growing plant.	1.00
FRINGETTE RED - Single orange-salmon with petals as above.	1.00
GIBBOSUM - Grey cut leaves. Small yellow blooms on climbing stems.50
GLAUCIFOLIUM - Large ruffled cut leaves. Night-scented maroon flowers. ...	2.00

SCANDENS - Round crimped edge foliage with narrow dark ring. Pink feathery blooms.50
SALMONIUM - Grey-green succulent foliage. Flowers single, a lovely shade of salmon.50
RENEFORM - Grey furry foliage.50
SOUTHERN CROSS - Flowers an outstanding shade of coral-red. Petals rolled and twisted like Noel.75
TETRAGONUM - Climbing succulent stem with small leaves. Blooms rose and white.50

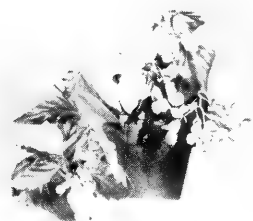

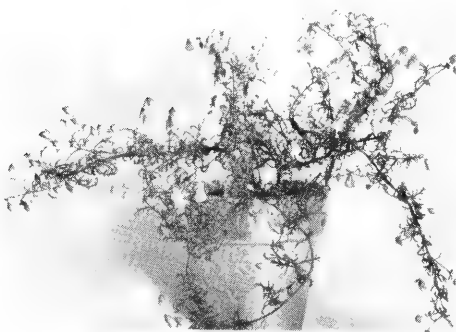
