CULTURE IN POTS. Use any good soil, mixed with sand, potting so as to leave the top of the bulb even with the soil. For a single plant use 4 or 5 -inch pot, but the effect will be prettier if several bulbs are planted in a larger pot, and still more effective if all are of one color. Press the soil firmly around the bulbs, but do not pack it underneath. Sink the pot in the earth about 6 inches, covering with soil, choosing a location that is not too wet.
