BASKET BEGONIAS -- plants which will trail and can be used in baskets or planters; they may, however, be trained upright.

- X Florence Carrell -- medium green leaves, pink flowers; similar to and easier to grow than Limninghiana. \$1.00 each.
- X Marjorie Daw -- deep green leaves, rose-colored flowers. \$1.00 each.
- Mazae var. Stitched Leaf -- light yellow-green leaves with black-marked margin; white flowers with current red dots in summer and fall. \$1.00 each.

CANE TYPE BEGONIAS -- Upright plants with bamboo-like stems.

- X Coralline de Lucerne -- stout stems, large green leaves, spotted with silver; red flowers hang in large clusters; best cane. \$1.00 each
- X Corallina var. fragrans -- tall, light-green leaves covered with silver spots; flowers white and fragrant. 75¢ each.
- X Medora -- low, bushy plant with silver spotted small leaves. 75¢ each.
- picata alba -- bushy plant with narrow silver-spotted green leaves; greenish-white flowers in summer. 75¢ each.
- undulata -- also known as alba perfecta -- wavy-margined green leaves; white flowers. 75¢ each.

FIBROUS BEGONIAS -- plants having bushy, upright growth; with proper potting, will send up many stems.

- African Species -- smooth-leaved, green, red-backed; very good grower; small white flowers during winter. \$1.00 each.
- angularis -- tall plant with angular stem; flowers white. 75¢ each.
- X Cataline -- aka Lady Waterlow; small, sharply-toothed leaves; rugged everbloomer; white flowers. 75¢ each.
- Chivatoa -- stems thick, fleshy, leaves light green, angular; flowers pink, winter flowering. 75¢ each.
- X Corbeille de Feu -- leaves light green, flowers bright coral-red. 75¢ each.
- X Deckers Select -- small-leaved begonia with toothed outer edge, deep green; dark red flowers on long, drooping stems; bushy, sturdy plant. 75¢ each.
- X Digswelliana -- small, glossy, light-green leaves, deeply toothed along outer edge; scarlet drooping flowers. 75¢ each.
- X Dorothy Grant -- glossy, large, dark-green leaves, oxblood-red back. \$1.00 each.
- X Druryi San Diego -- like Druryi but with silver along the veins; medium height, uneven heart-shaped leaves, white flowers. 75¢ each.
- estralensis -- small, egg-shaped green leaf; white flowers in winter. 75¢ each.
- X Freda Grant -- leaves deep red underneath, deep green above. \$1.00 each.
- fuchsioides -- glossy-green leaves, about one inch long and small drooping scarlet flowers. Will grow tall with support. 75¢ each.
- X Grey Feather -- tall grower; deep-green, narrow leaves with silver veins; white flowers. 75¢ each.
- incarnata -- small green leaves, with pink flowers; bushy. 75¢ each.



- X incarnata Sylvia -- jagged-edged leaf; otherwise like incarnata. \$1.00. each.
- X Ingrami -- red flowers, hanging on long stems; deep green leaves, red underneath. 75¢. each.
- leptotricha -- (Manda's Woolly Bear). A beautiful shiny green leaved begonia with clusters of white flowers. Good bloomer. Stems and underside of leaves covered with long brown hairs. 75¢ each.
- X Mandiana -- New. Similar to the above but with long white hairs on top of leaf. 75¢.
- X multiflora rosea -- small-leaved, slender-stemmed; rose colored blossoms. 75¢ each.
- X Orrell -- medium height; light green leaves spotted with silver; margin wavy; flowers cherry-red. 75¢ each.
- X Pink Supreme -- cane type; silver spotted leaves with wavy edges; pale pink flowers. My hybrid which can be used in a basket. \$1.00 each.
- X Richmondensis -- a large form of Catalina with large pink flowers. \$1.50 each.
- X Thurstoni -- glossy, yellow-green leaves; bushy; white flowers. 75¢ each.
- X Vedderi -- Bronzy green leaves, deeply toothed margin; flowers white with pink hairs. 75¢ each.
- HAIRY\*LEAVED FIBROUS BEGONIAS\*** -- same as fibrous but with hair on leaves and stems.
- X Alleryi -- deep green above, red veined below; irregularly lobed and toothed. White flowers with red hairs on back. 75¢ each.
- X Alto Scharff -- entire plant covered with hair; entire plant red except top of leaves which are deep green; graceful low bush. 75¢ each.
- X Dwarf Haageana -- a small form of Haageana; yellow-green leaves, white flowers with pink hairs on back. \$1.00
- Hugeli -- large leaved, green, red on back; white flowers. \$1.00 each.
- X Miss Applegate -- similar to Alto Scharff but the leaf margin is wavy and more delicate looking. Large white flowers. \$1.00.
- X Neely Gaddis -- large unequal heartshaped leaves, dark green above, red below. White flowers. 75¢ each.
- Scharffiana -- entire plant thickly covered with short hairs; oxblood red except on upper leaf surface which is dark green. Fls. large but few on long stems. This can be grown as a basket plant. 75¢ each.
- REX BEGONIA HYBRIDS** -- King of the Begonias. Varigated and colored leaves; pink flowers in fall and winter.
- X Robin -- Mrs. Frey's new hybrid. Small leaved, dark metallic green with silver flecks, overlaid with reddish color. Bush type. \$1.50.
- THICKSTEMMED BEGONIAS** -- short jointed like rhizomatous but upright growers.
- involutrata -- low-growing, bushy with beautiful hairy leaves and rather large white flowers in fall. \$1.00. each.
- X Jessie (phyllomaniaaaa) leaves brown and green, edges toothed; very floriferous in winter, with deep-pink flowers; leaves and stems may be covered with little leaflets. 75¢ each.
- Kellermanni -- white tomentum (fuzz) on round, peltate leaves; pink flowers in winter. \$1.00 each.
- malibarica -- green, slightly hairy leaves; white flowers in summer. 75¢ each.
- X Paul Bruant -- thick deep green leaves; pink flowers in late winter. Sturdy. \$1.00.
- X Templini -- Like Jessie but with the addition of yellow blotches on leaves. \$1.00.
- RHIZOMATOUS BEGONIAS** -- plants with short jointed thickened stems, which lay on the soil surface. Good house plants.
- ascetosa -- unequal, roundish leaves with short hairs over entire plant. Red leaf back. \$1.00 each.
- Barkeri -- large leaves, up to 3 feet, leaves light green shiny, flowers white. \$1.00
- X Blue Lake -- Small light green leaves; flowers white. 75¢ each.

- X Bunchii -- thick, green leaves, with crested edge. Pink flowers in winter. \$1.00.
- Costa Rican Species -- roundish, light green leaves, panicles of small, white flowers. \$1.00 each.
- X Crystal Lake -- light green, rex-like leaves, with silver spots; white fls. \$1.00.
- globra -- peltate leaves, more delicate than nelumbifolia; white flowers. \$1.00 each
- X Green Skeezer -- medium-sized light green leaves; small white flowers. \$1.00 each
- X Green Zeebowman -- thin rhizome. dark green leaves with hairs along the edge; Rex-like in appearance. \$1.00 each.
- hepatica-maculata -- thick, light-green leaves, heavily blotched with liver-colored markings; a distinctive, strong-growing plant. \$1.50.
- heracleifolia variety pyramidalis -- wider leaf than heracleifolia, but light green; pink flowers on long stems. \$1.00. each.
- heracleifolia variety sunderbrucki -- star-type leaves marked with green, brown and black. Pink flower clusters in winter. 75¢. each.
- hispidavillosa -- green leaves with long hairs covering the entire plant. Pink flowers on long stems. \$1.00. each.
- X Hotel Colon -- large, roundish star-shaped lettuce green leaves; pink flowers on long stems. \$1.50.
- X Immense (Fischer's Ricinifolia) -- large light-green leaves, red hairs on margin, back and on stems; pink flowers in winter. Narrower, longer leaf than above. \$1.00 each.
- X Jimmie Decker -- thick, round, dark green leaves, pink flowers on long stems. Very rugged plant. \$1.50 each.
- X Joe Hayden -- satiny black leaves, lobed; much imitated but none as black as this. Easily makes a prize winning specimen. \$1.00 each.
- manicata -- medium green leaves with red scale-like hairs on veins below; cuff of red scale-like hairs on stems; pink flowers. 75¢ each.
- X Murial Day -- green leaves with silver markings; Rex-like in appearance. \$1.00.
- X Ricinifolia -- large bronzy, slightly-lobed leaves with tall clusters of pink flowers in summer. \$1.00. each.
- X Serenata -- dark-brown leaves, pink flowers; multiplies easily. \$1.00.
- X Skeezer Mirror Lake -- silver leaves with green veins; flowers white. \$1.00 each.
- X Stan Spaulding -- small yellow-green leaves with red bordering the nerves on the underside. Flowers pink. \$1.00 each.
- X 27.s # 9. Beautiful round bronze leaves. Tall flower stems with white floers. 75¢.
- X Illustrata -- dull green with gray markings. White flowers. Small plant good for terrarium culture. \$1.00 each.
- X Pearlilii -- medium, unequal silvery leaves. Small white flowers. 75¢ each.
