## HOW TO GROW GLADIOLUS SUCCESSFULIY

1. WHERE TO PLANT: Plant in open sunlight away from trees and shrubs. While gladiolus will grow well in most types of soil, they perform best in a well-drained sandy soil.
2. PLANTING. Plant early in the spring when the soil is reasonably dry. Space the large bulbs 4 to 6 inches apart, and plant 4 to 6 inches deep. Label the named varieties for greatest enjoyment. For continuous bloom, plant some bulbs every two weeks over a two months period.
3. WATERING: A good soaking once a week is necessary. Additional watering at the time the first bloom spike appears will increase the size of the flowers.
4. CULTIVATION: Keep well cultivated and weeded.
