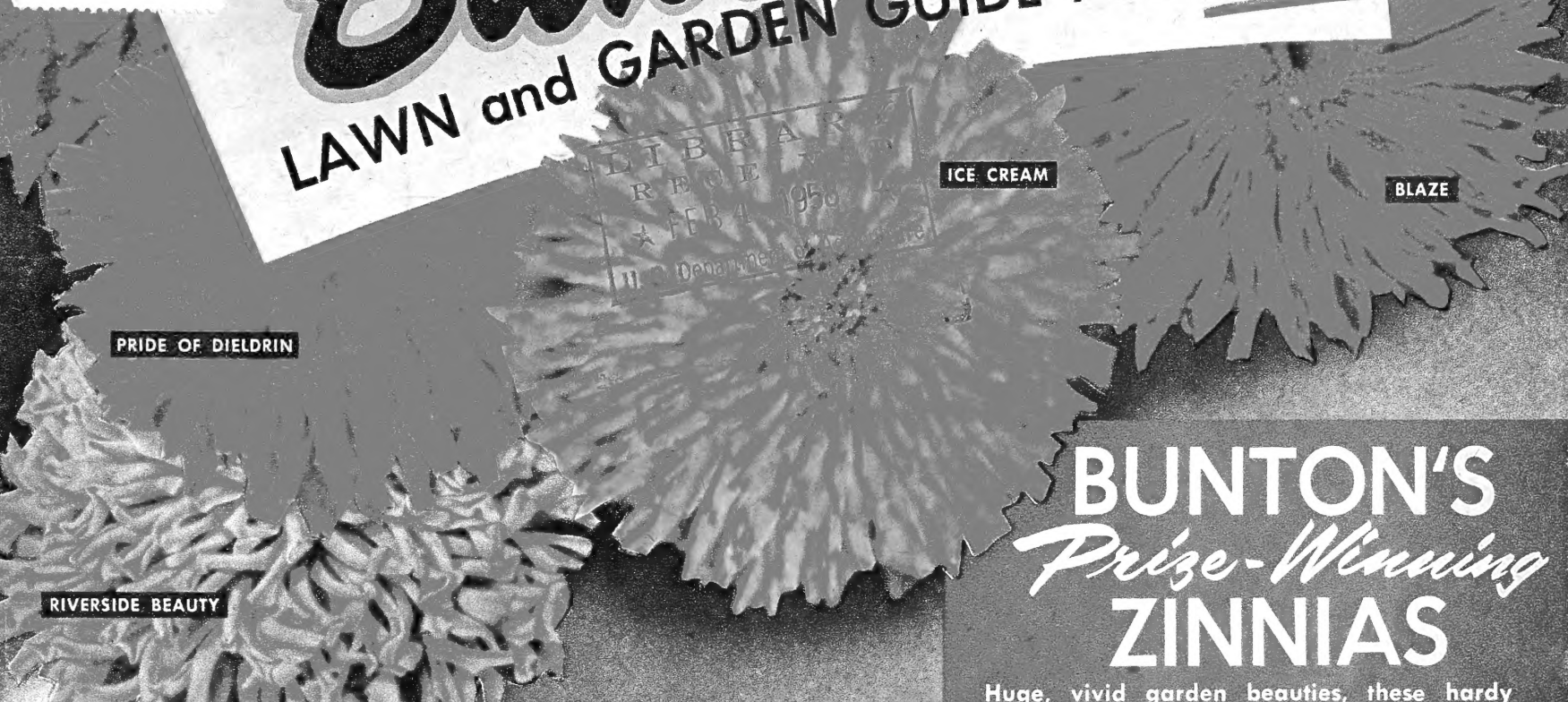

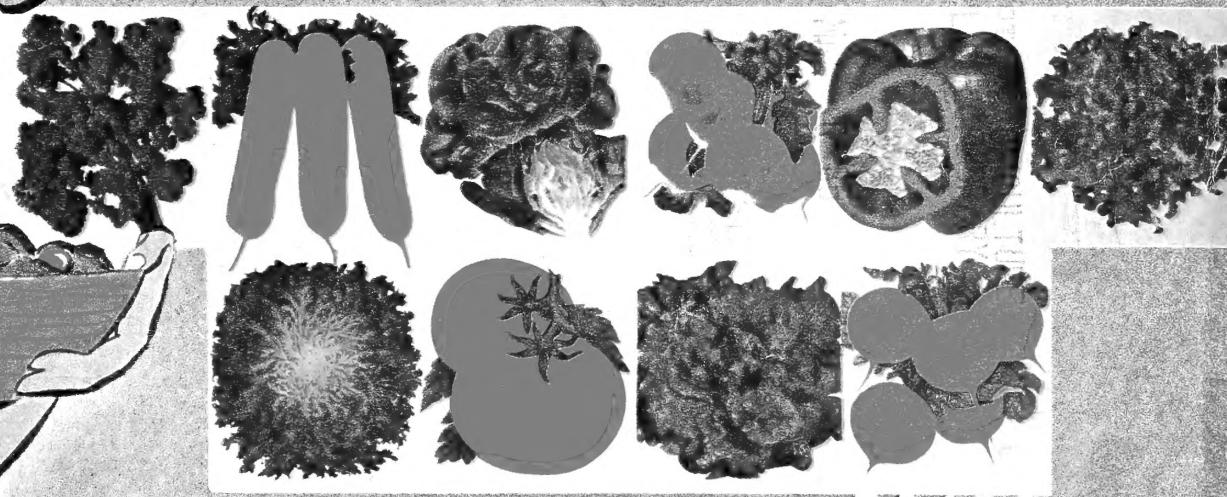

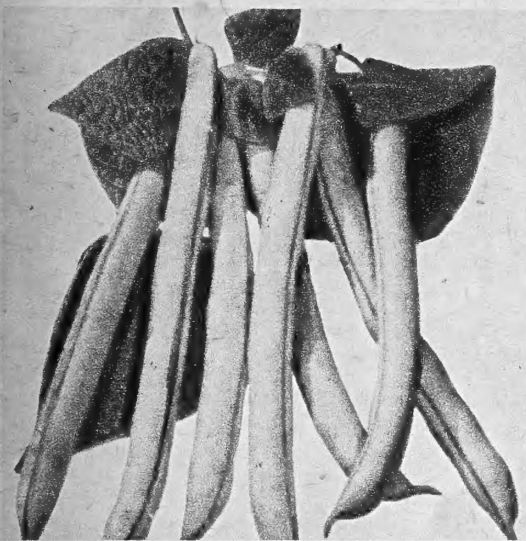

A new stringless variety introduced by the U. S. Department of Agriculture you will like for its good eating qualities. Exceptionally good for canning and freezing. The light green pods are round, slender and straight when young, becoming slightly curved and 6½ inches long when ready for picking. The vigorous plants are upright and are about 20 inches high and are very prolific. Highly recommended.

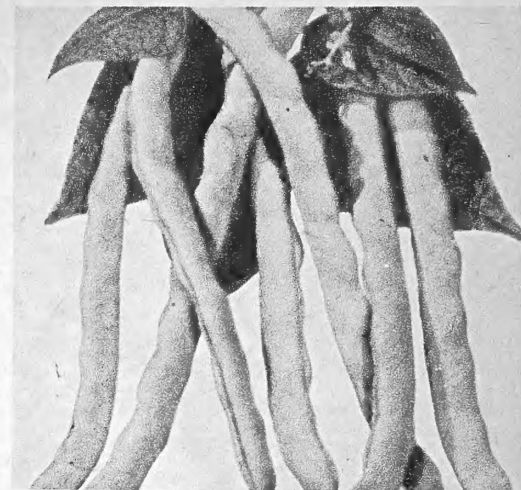

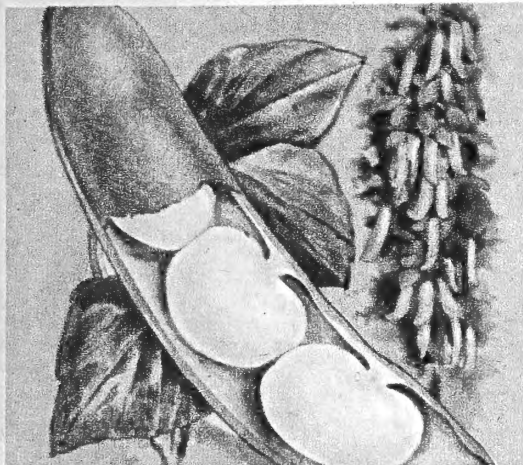

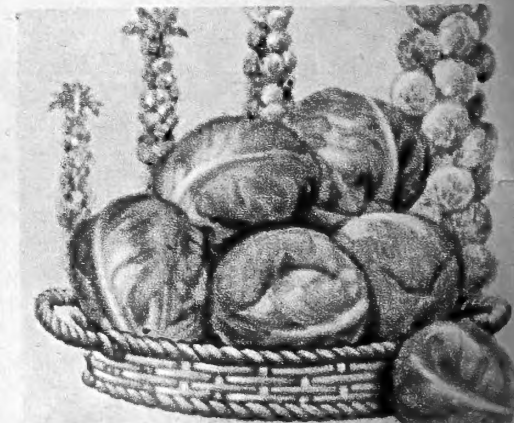

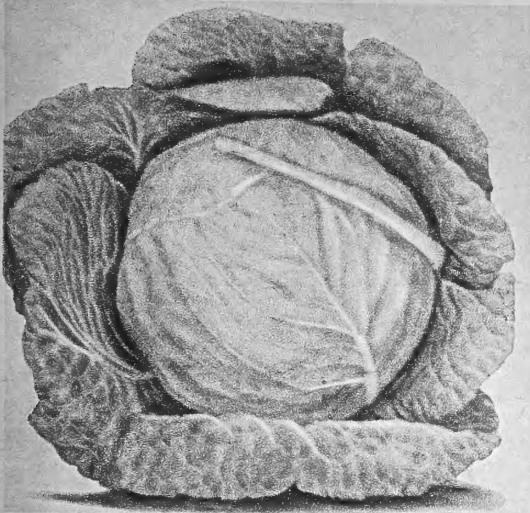

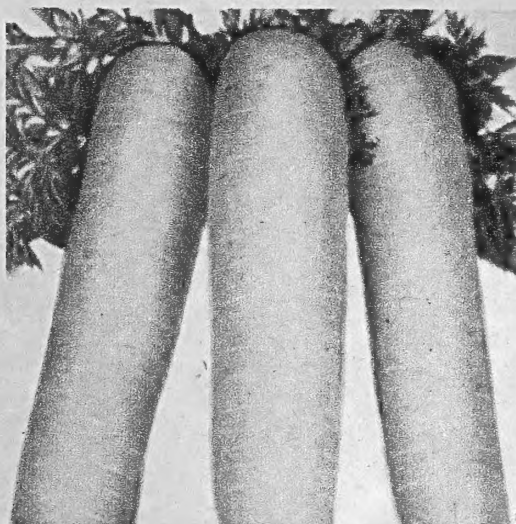

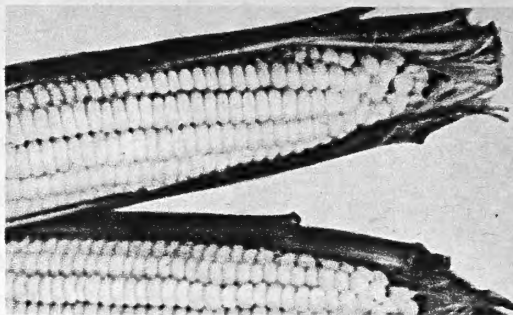

HOW TO GROW GLADIOLUS SUCCESSFULLY

- WHERE TO PLANT:** Plant in open sunlight away from trees and shrubs. While gladiolus will grow well in most types of soil, they perform best in a well-drained sandy soil.
- PLANTING.** Plant early in the spring when the soil is reasonably dry. Space the large bulbs 4 to 6 inches apart, and plant 4 to 6 inches deep. Label the named varieties for greatest enjoyment. For continuous bloom, plant some bulbs every two weeks over a two months period.
- WATERING:** A good soaking once a week is necessary. Additional watering at the time the first bloom spike appears will increase the size of the flowers.
- CULTIVATION:** Keep well cultivated and weeded. Cultivation should be shallow after vigorous growth has started, to avoid disturbing the roots. Two inches deep is about right.
